Precautions

Safety

- Operate the unit only on 120 V AC, 60 Hz.
- If anything falls into the cabinet, unplug the unit and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.
- One blade of the plug is wider than the other for the purpose of safety and will fit into the power outlet only one way. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, contact your Sony dealer.
- Unplug the unit from the wall outlet if you do not intend to use it for an extended period of time. To disconnect the cord, pull it out by the plug, never by the cord.

Installing

- Allow adequate air circulation to prevent internal heat buildup.
- Do not place the unit on surfaces (rugs, blankets, etc.) or near materials (curtains, draperies) that may block the ventilation slots.
- Do not install the unit near heat sources such as radiators or air ducts, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust, mechanical vibration or shock.
- Do not install the unit in an inclined position. It is designed to be operated in a horizontal position only.

- Keep the unit and cassettes away from equipment with strong magnets, such as microwave ovens or large loudspeakers.
- Do not place heavy objects on the unit.
- If the unit is brought directly from a cold to a warm location, moisture may condense inside the VCR and cause damage to the video head and tape. When you first install the unit, or when you move it from a cold to a warm location, wait for about one hour before operating the unit.

Hi8 (high eight) video system

Both **Hi8** and standard **8** cassette tapes can be used with this VCR. Refer to the charts below for the compatibility between the **Hi8** video system and the standard **8** system.

When playing a tape

This VCR automatically detects the type of tape being played, either **Hi8** or standard **8**. This VCR also automatically detects the tape speed (either SP or LP) the tape was recorded in.

Step 2: Setting up the remote commander

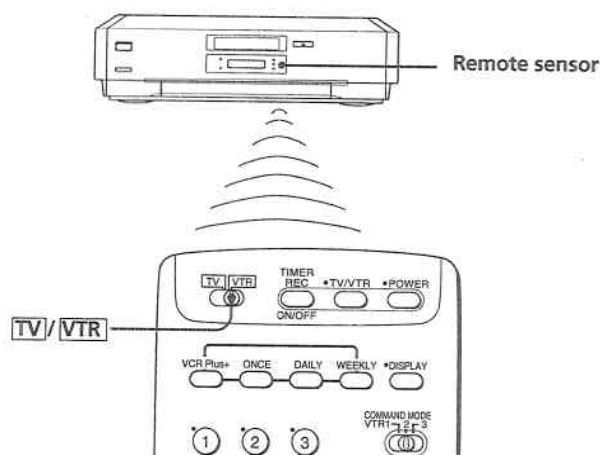
Inserting the batteries

Insert two size AA (R6) batteries by matching the + and - on the batteries to the diagram inside the battery compartment.



Using the remote commander

You can use this remote commander to operate this VCR and a Sony TV. Buttons on the remote commander marked with a dot (•) can be used to operate your TV.

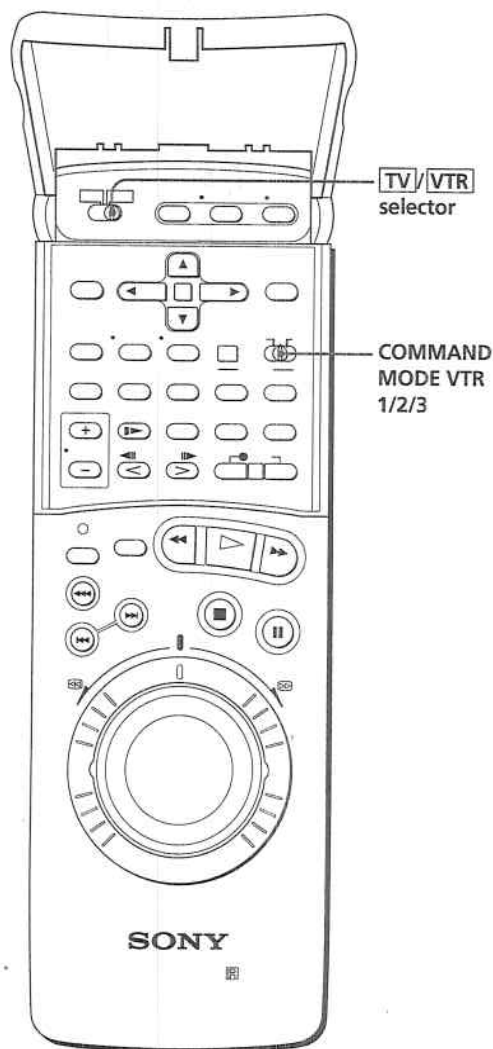


Notes

- With normal use, the batteries should last for approximately three to six months.
- If you do not use the remote commander for an extended period of time, remove the batteries to avoid possible damage from battery leakage.
- Do not use a new battery with an old one.
- Do not use different types of batteries.

Note

- If you set the COMMAND MODE VTR OFF/1/2/3 selector on the VCR to "OFF," you can no longer control this VCR from any other Sony remote commanders.

Setting the command mode

You can select three different positions for the command mode setting.

- 1** Turn on the VCR, then press **OPERATION PANEL OPEN/CLOSE** to open the operation panel. Set the **COMMAND MODE VTR OFF/1/2/3** selector on the VCR to "VTR 2."
- 2** Set the **COMMAND MODE VTR 1/2/3** selector on the remote commander to "VTR 2."
- 3** Set the **TV/VTR** remote control selector on the remote commander to "VTR."

Controlling other Sony video equipment if other Sony video equipment has a COMMAND MODE selector

- 1** Set the COMMAND MODE 1/2/3 selector on the remote commander to a position other than the one you selected for this VCR.
- 2** Set the COMMAND MODE selector of any other video equipment to the same position you selected in step 1.

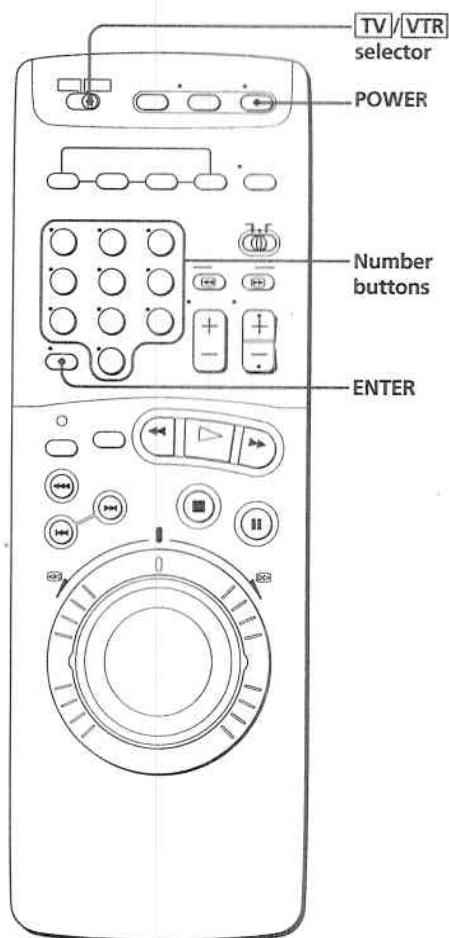
If other Sony video equipment does not have a COMMAND MODE selector

You can control other Sony video equipment using the following COMMAND MODE settings.

- 1)** Infrared remote controlled Sony Betamax VCRs: position 1 (Some units may not be controlled in this mode.)
- 2)** Sony 8 mm format VCRs: position 2
- 3)** Sony VHS format VCRs: position 3

Notes

- If the TV uses a different remote control system from the one programmed to work with the VCR, you cannot control your TV with the remote commander.
- If you enter a new code number, the code number previously entered will be erased.
- When you replace the batteries in the remote commander, the code number automatically resets to 1 (Sony). Reset the appropriate code number.

**Controlling other TVs with the remote commander**

The remote commander is preprogrammed to control non-Sony TVs. If your TV is listed in the table below, set the appropriate manufacturer's code number.

- 1 Set **TV/VTR** on the top of the remote commander to TV.
- 2 Press and hold down **POWER**, and then enter your TV's code number(s) using the number buttons. Press the **ENTER** button. Then release **POWER**.

Code numbers are listed below.

Now you can use the buttons marked with a dot (•) to control your TV. To control the VCR, reset **TV/VTR** to VTR.

Step 3: Hookups

Selecting the best hookup option

Before you can use your VCR for the first time, you need to connect it to your TV and set it up to receive programs for viewing and recording. This section explains how to hook up and set up your VCR so that you can start enjoying it right away. There are, however, many types of TVs available and many ways in which your TV can be hooked up. For these reasons, this manual describes several ways your VCR can be connected.

To hook up your VCR so that it works best for you, first scan through the table below. Then use the accompanying diagrams and procedures on the following pages to set up your VCR.

Caution

Connections between the VCR's VHF/UHF connector and the antenna terminals of the TV receiver should be made only as shown in the following instructions. Failure to do so may result in operation that violates the regulations of the Federal Communications Commission regarding the use and operation of RF devices. Never connect the output of the VCR to an antenna or make simultaneous (parallel) antenna and VCR connections at the antenna terminals of your receiver.

Note to CATV system installer

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

After you've completed the connections, follow the instructions for setup including VCR Plus+ setup. During setup, if you need more details of the procedure described, page numbers are provided where you can find complete, step-by-step instructions.

After you've completed the setup, you're ready to use your VCR. Procedures differ depending on the hookup you used. For an overview, refer to "Quick reference to using the VCR" on the back cover.

Before you get started

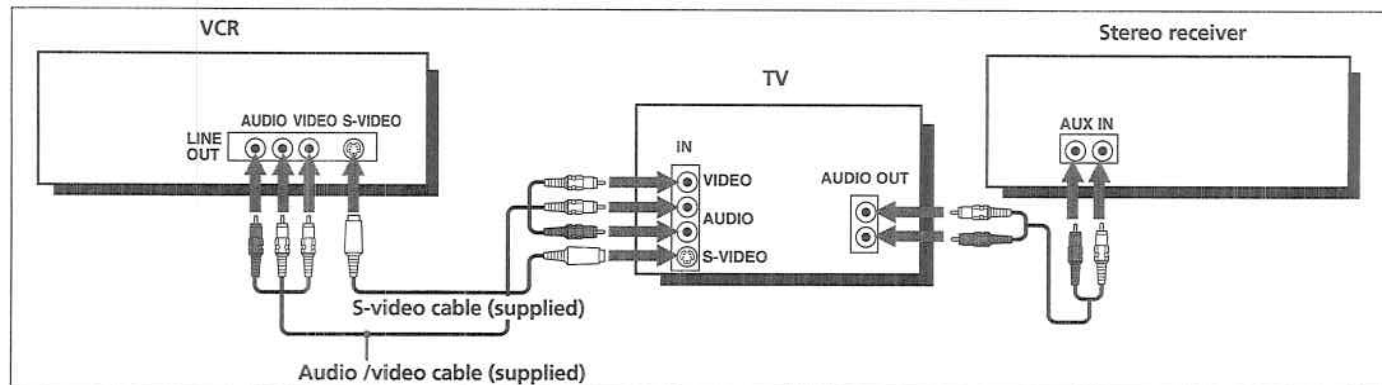
- Turn off the power to all equipment.
- Do not connect the AC power cords until all of the connections are completed.
- Be sure you make connections firmly. Loose connections may cause picture distortion.
- If your TV doesn't match any of the examples provided, see your nearest Sony dealer or qualified technician.

Audio/video (A/V) hookup

If your TV has audio/video (A/V) input jacks, you will get a better picture and sound if you hook up your VCR using these connections. In addition, for a true "home theater" experience, you should connect the audio outputs of your VCR or TV to your stereo system. If your TV doesn't have A/V inputs, see the following pages for antenna or cable hookups.

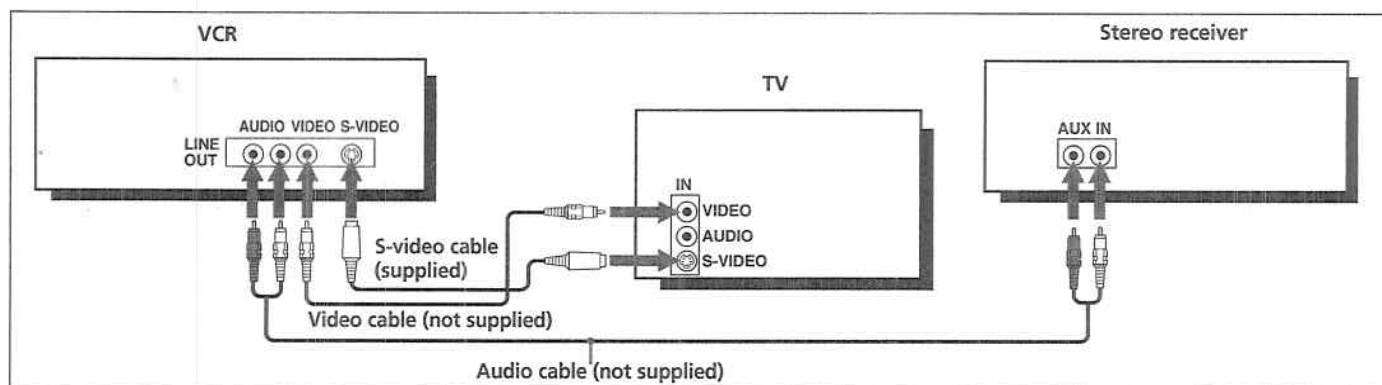
If you're planning to use your VCR only to play back pictures and movies, you're finished setting up the VCR after you've made these connections. If you want to record off-air or off your cable TV system, complete these connections first, and then go to the following pages for antenna or cable hookups.

A Use this hookup if your TV has stereo jacks



If your TV is equipped with S-video jacks, then use the S-video connection.

B Use this hookup if your TV doesn't have stereo jacks



If your TV is equipped with S-video jacks, then use the S-video connection.

Hookup 1

Using cable box control

Recommended use

This hookup is recommended for most cable systems with cable boxes. It allows the VCR's cable box control feature to control the channel on the cable box, simplifying the recording process. You should use this hookup if you have a cable box, especially if your cable system scrambles all or most channels. A list of compatible cable boxes is on page 28.

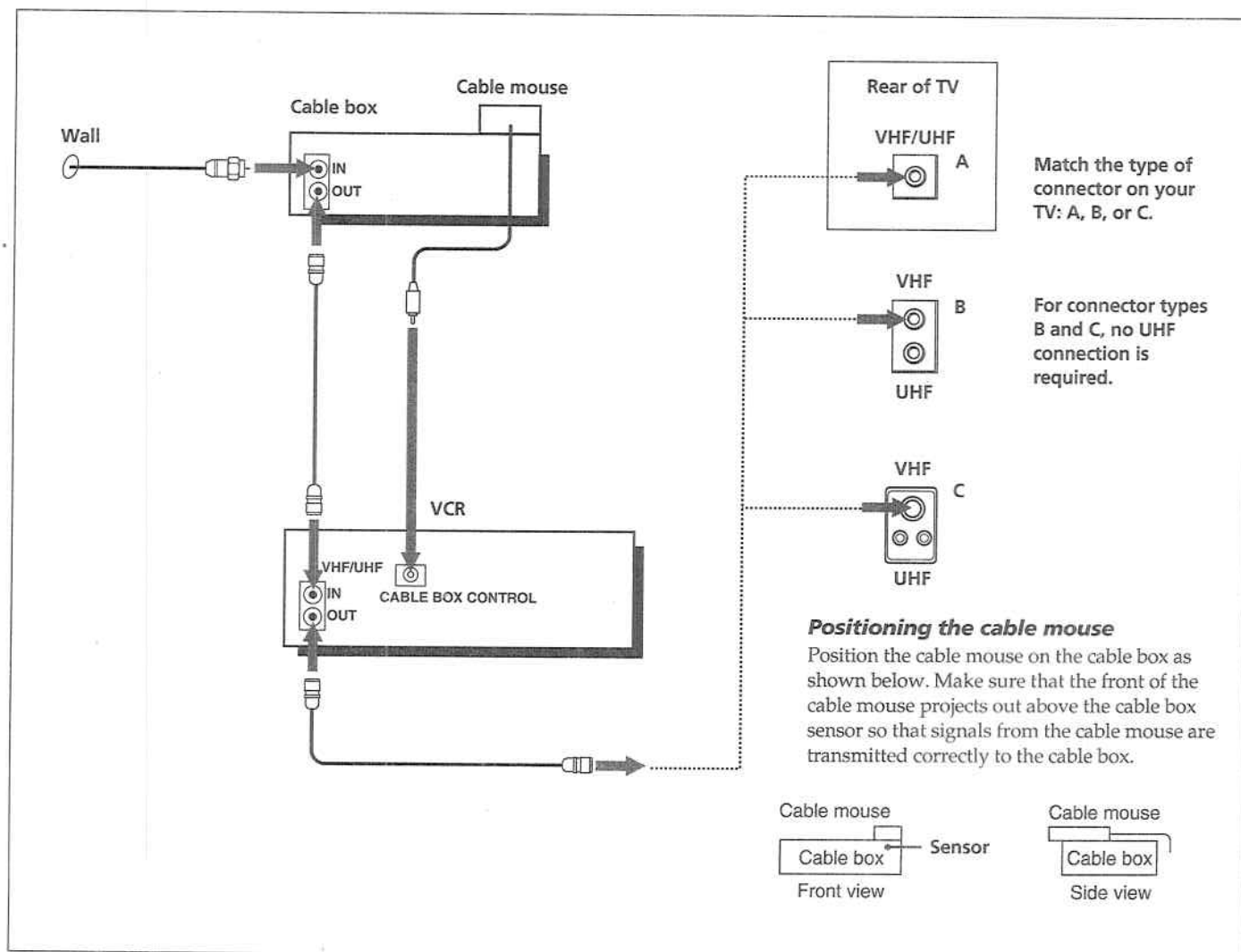

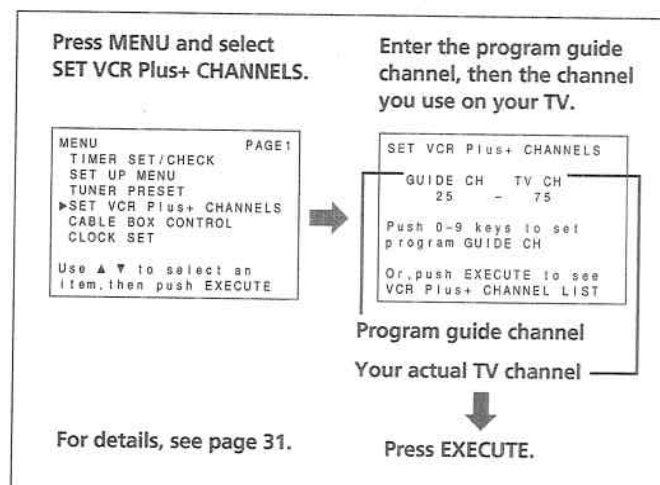


If your cable box is not compatible

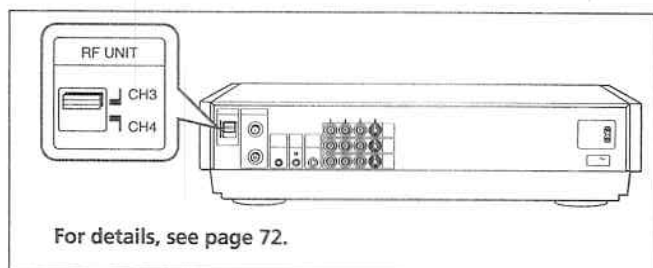


If you cannot connect your antenna cable to the VCR directly

If your antenna cable is a flat cable (300-ohm twin lead cable), attach the external antenna connector (not supplied) so that you can connect the cable to the VHF/UHF IN jack. If you have separate cables for VHF and UHF antennas, you may use a U/V band mixer (not supplied). For details, see page 72.

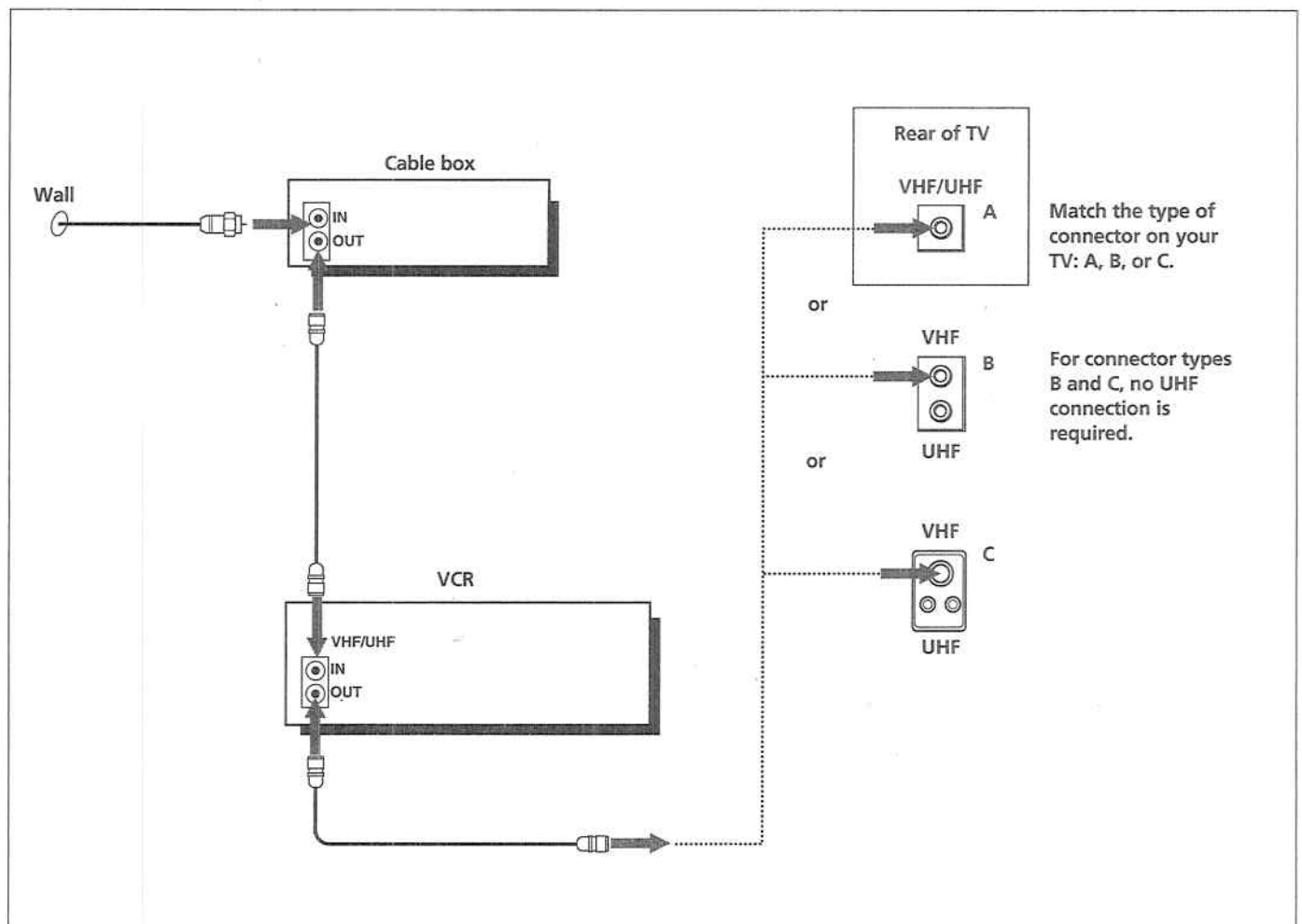

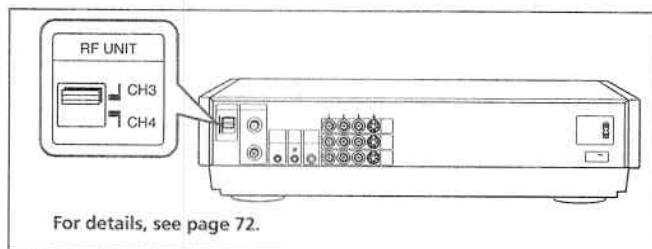

With the A/B switch set to position "A," you can record unscrambled channels by selecting channels directly with the VCR. You only use position "B" and the cable box to record a scrambled channel.

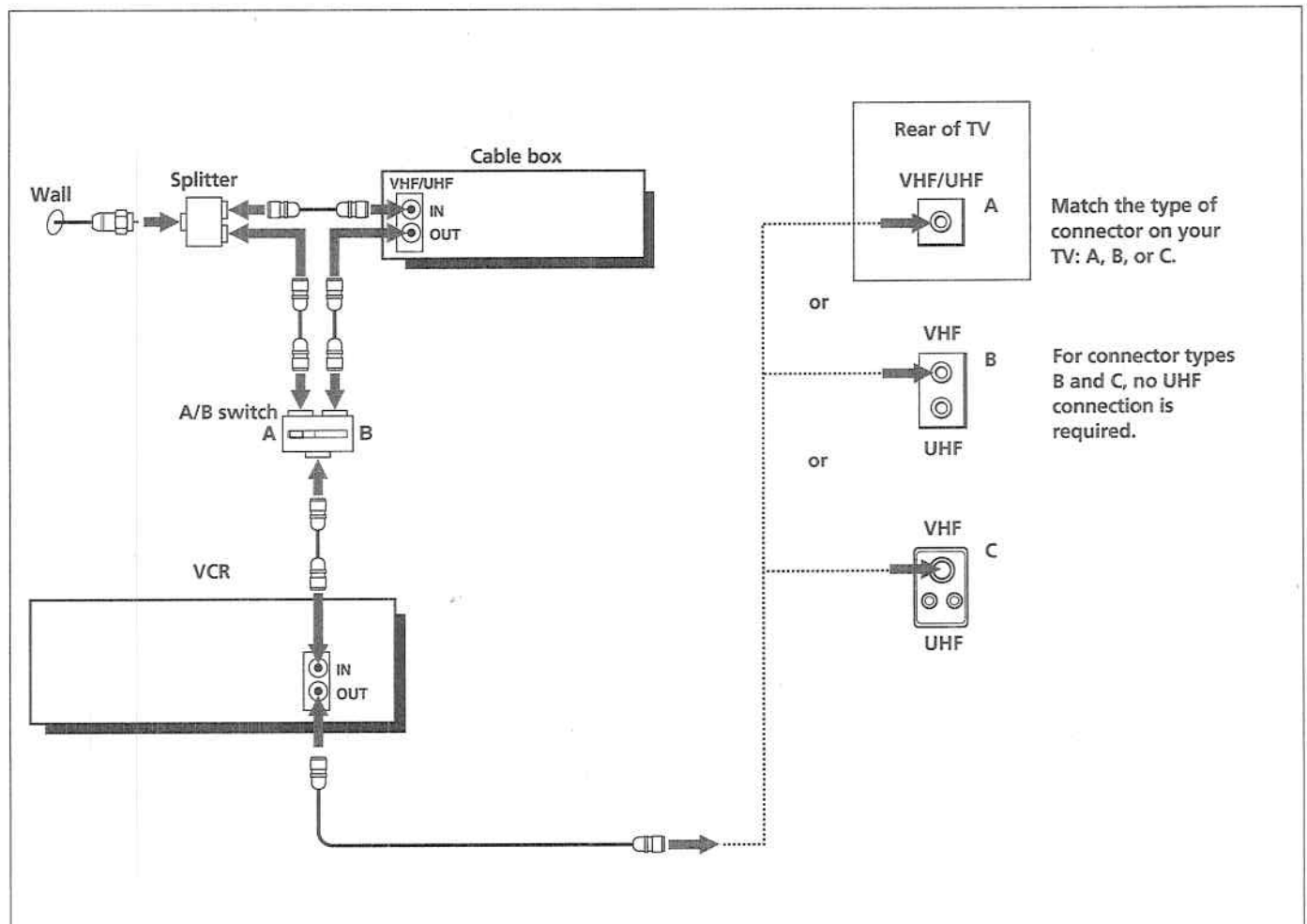

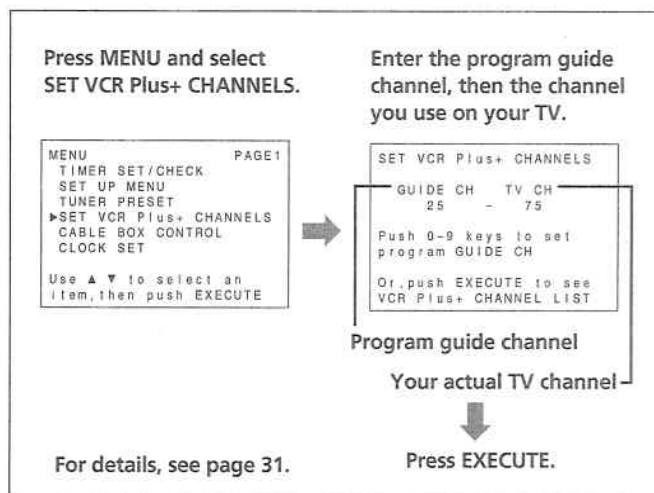

Setting up cable box control



Your VCR includes a cable box control feature which allows the VCR to control most brands of cable boxes via the cable mouse. With cable box control, the VCR controls channels on the cable box for timer recording. You can also use the VCR's remote commander to change channels on the cable box whenever the cable box is turned on. To use cable box control, you need to connect the cable mouse (page 11) and set the code number and output channel.

This VCR is programmed with codes necessary to control channel selection on most brands of cable boxes at the time this VCR was manufactured. It is possible that new cable boxes may be introduced that cannot be controlled with this VCR's cable mouse. If you have a cable box that is incompatible with this VCR, contact your cable operator — they may be able to provide you with a compatible cable box.

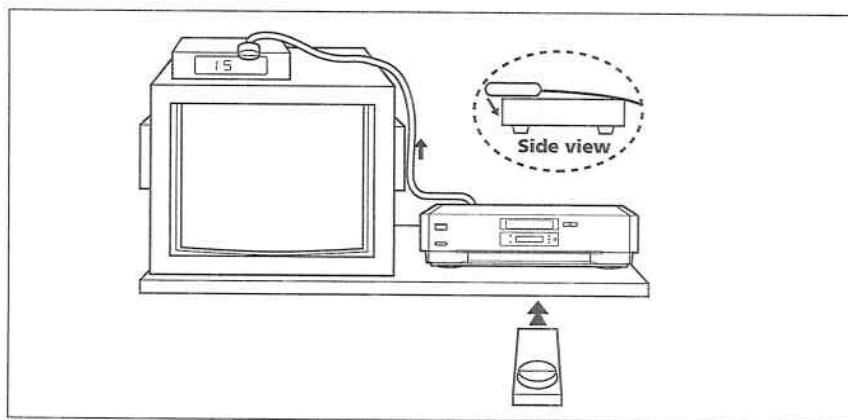

If your cable box still does not operate with the cable mouse, contact your cable company to see if they can provide you with a compatible cable box.

Tips for normal viewing

- Place the cable mouse so that it hangs out over the cable box front.
- Point the remote commander at the VCR, not at the cable box.

VCR Plus+ is a feature in Sony VCRs that simplifies the task of programming the VCR to make timer recordings.

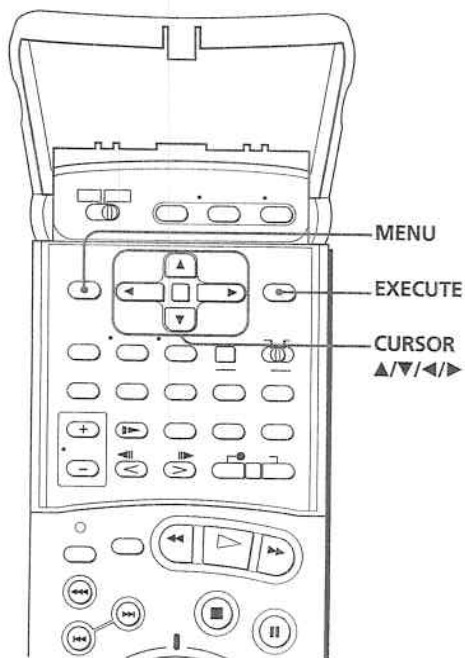
How VCR Plus+ works

Whenever you want to record a TV program, all you need to do is look up the program's "PlusCode," a number assigned to each program that's published in the TV section of most newspapers, cable TV listings, and even *TV GUIDE* magazine. Then, just enter the PlusCode of the program you want and the VCR is automatically programmed to record that show. It's that simple. With VCR Plus+, you no longer have to go through a lengthy and often repetitive procedure when you set start and stop times, channel numbers, and dates. All this information is automatically sent to your VCR when you enter the program's PlusCode.

How to set up your VCR

Setting up your VCR involves coordinating the TV channel number (the number you turn to on your TV or VCR to watch a program) with the guide channel (the number that's assigned to that channel in your program guide). To get the guide channel numbers, find the "Channel Line-up Chart" in the program guide for your area that features VCR PlusCodes. It usually looks like the example to the left.

For each channel your VCR receives, use the Channel Line-up Chart to check that the channel numbers match. For example, if HBO is listed in the Channel Line-up Chart on channel 33, and your VCR receives HBO on channel 15, you need to coordinate these numbers using the following procedure. For channels in which the numbers are the same (for example, if your VCR receives HBO on channel 33, and the guide channel number is 33), you can skip this procedure.

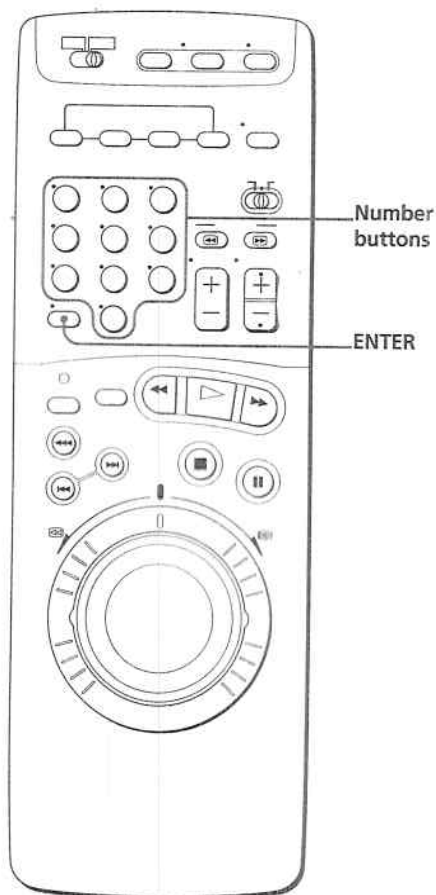

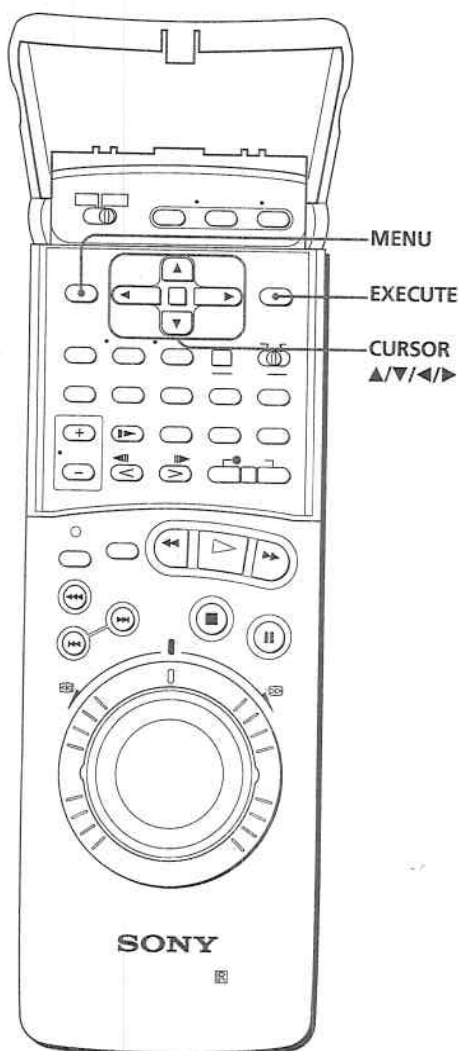

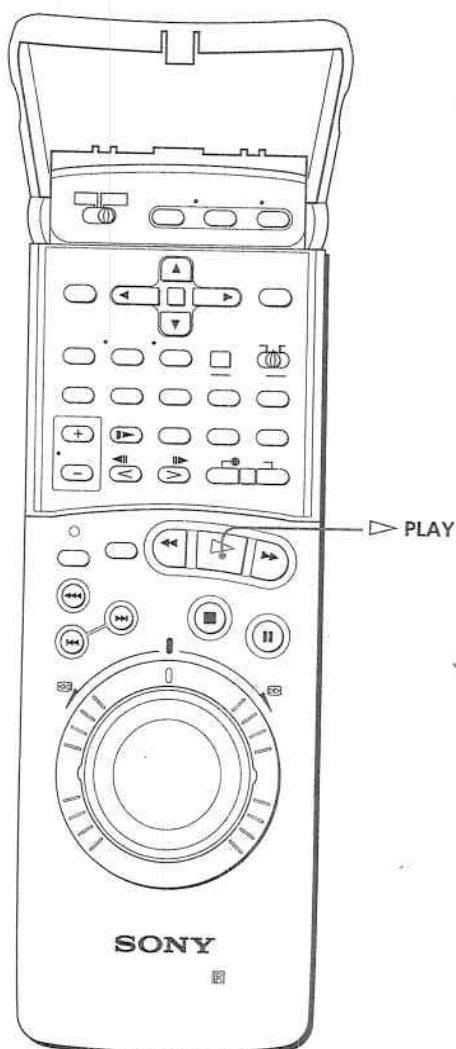

1 Turn on your TV and tune in to the VCR:

- If the TV is connected to the VCR using the S-video cable or an audio/video cable, set the TV to video input.
- If the TV is connected to the VCR using only the antenna, set the TV to the program position for the VCR.

2 Insert a tape.

The VCR turns on automatically.

3 Press **▶ PLAY** to start playing.

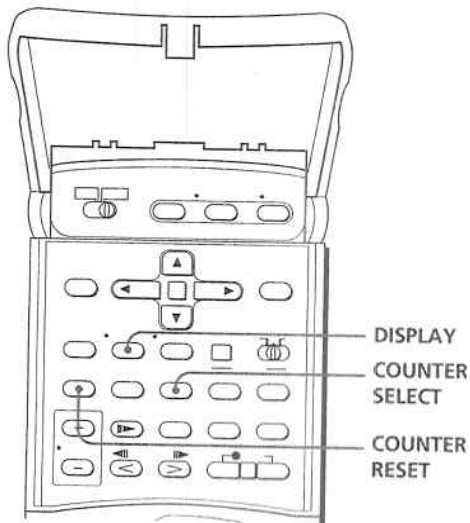
When the tape reaches the end, the VCR automatically rewinds it to the beginning. (The power remains on.)

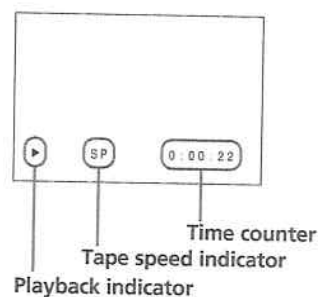

- The time counter does not advance during playback of an unrecorded tape segment.
- The remaining tape length is displayed a short moment after you insert a tape and press ▷ PLAY. "H-M" appears in the display window if the VCR cannot detect the remaining tape length.
- The remaining tape length counter halts during pause, stop, slow motion and frame-by-frame playback. The counter advances and displays correct information when you return to normal playback or press X2.
- The remaining tape length may not be displayed correctly when using the following types of tapes:
 - pre-recorded commercial tapes
 - tapes that are not reeled properly at the beginning
 - tapes that contain unrecorded segments or portions recorded with different tape speeds
 - poor-quality or non-standard tapes
 - cleaning cassettes
- The remaining tape length counter is intended for rough time measurement only.

Displaying the remaining tape length and time counter

Press DISPLAY to turn the display on or off.



Using the time counter

At the point on a tape that you want to find later, press COUNTER RESET to reset the counter to "0H00M00S." When you rewind or advance the tape to this point, refer to the counter.

Checking the remaining tape length

To check the remaining tape length, press COUNTER SELECT twice in succession during recording or playback. At the first press, the TIME CODE indicator lights up in the display window. At the second press, the REMAIN indicator lights up and the remaining tape length is displayed. To display the time counter, press COUNTER SELECT again.

When using P6-135, E6-140, and P6-165 tapes, set the TAPE SELECT switch to 135.

Displaying the DATA CODE

Set DATA CODE to ON in the SET UP MENU and press COUNTER SELECT to display the counter in the display window. When you play back tapes that have been recorded with DATA CODE signals, the date, month, and year of the recording are displayed on the TV screen. If the tape does not contain any DATA CODE information, the time counter is displayed. This VCR does not record DATA CODE signals.

- Normally set the AUDIO MONITOR switch to PCM to enjoy high-quality playback sound.
- The additionally dubbed sound can't be heard if the AUDIO MONITOR switch is set to STD (Hi-Fi).

If the sound is not heard or is heard only intermittently

When a tape which has been recorded on a video camera recorder or a video cassette recorder without the PCM function is played on this unit, set the AUDIO MONITOR setting to STD. The PCM indicator may blink, but it will not affect the sound.

When the TV/VCR connection is made to a TV without audio/video inputs

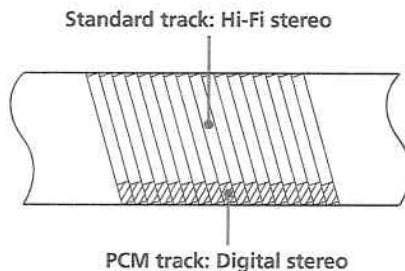
To monitor the playback sound in stereo, connect the VCR to a stereo system.

To listen to the sound on both the PCM and the standard track

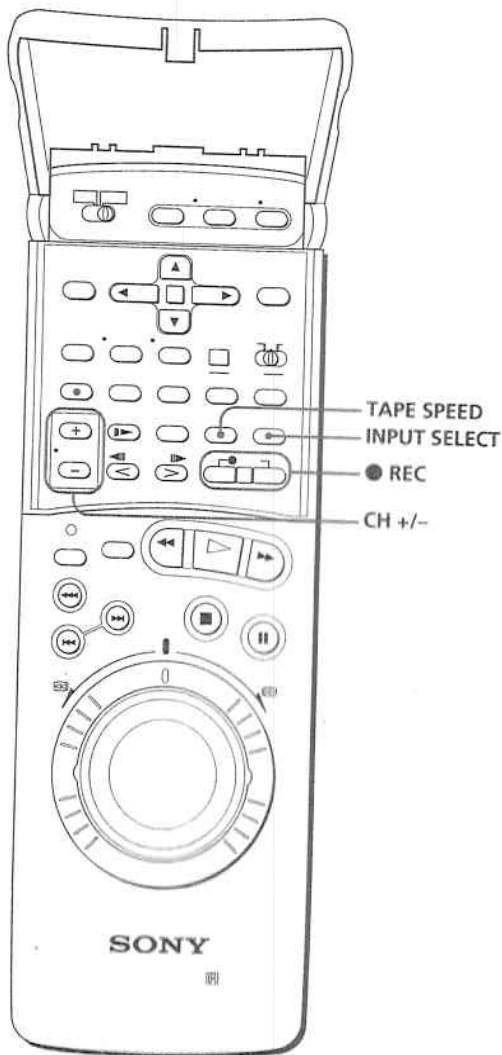
Set the AUDIO MONITOR switch on the operation panel to MIX. If the sound is hard to distinguish, use the STD AUDIO LEVEL to adjust the standard sound level. You cannot adjust the PCM sound level.

How sound is recorded on a video tape

This VCR records sound onto two different tracks. High-fidelity sound (usually stereo) is recorded onto the standard (AFM) track along with the picture. PCM (digital sound) is recorded onto the PCM track along the edge of the tape.



Recording TV programs



Tip

- To select channels, you can also use the number buttons on the remote commander. Enter the desired channel number using the number buttons, then press ENTER.

This section shows you how to record TV programs in the most basic way: manual recording. With manual recording, you start the VCR recording when the program begins, then stop it when the program ends. The VCR also provides the following ways of recording:

- Manually start recording, then stop it automatically—"Recording using the quick timer" (page 38)
- Automatically start and stop recording—"Recording TV programs using the timer" (page 41)
- Automatically start and stop recording just by entering the "Plus Code"—"Recording TV programs using VCR Plus+" (page 44)

1 Turn on your TV and tune in to the VCR:

- If the TV is connected to the VCR using the S-video cable or an audio/video cable, set the TV to video input.
- If the TV is connected to the VCR using only the antenna, set the TV to the channel for the VCR.

When using a cable box, turn it on.

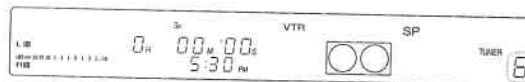
2 On the operation panel, set the PCM REC LEVEL control to "5" and the PCM REC BALANCE control to the center.

3 Insert a tape with the safety tab slid back so that the red portion does not show.

4 Press INPUT SELECT until a channel number appears in the VCR's display window.

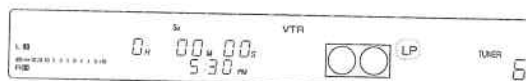


5 Select the desired channel by pressing CH +/-.



6 Select the tape speed, SP (standard play) or LP (long play), by pressing TAPE SPEED.

See "To select tape speeds" on the next page.



7 Start recording by pressing ● REC.

When the tape reaches the end, the VCR automatically rewinds it to the beginning.

Recording TV programs (continued)

Note

- If you insert a cassette with its safety tab slid to show the red portion, the VCR ejects it when you press ● REC.

Tips

- To cut out an unwanted scene while recording, press ■ PAUSE, turn the JOG dial/SHUTTLE ring on the VCR to rewind the tape to the beginning of the unwanted scene, then press ■ PAUSE to resume recording.
- The display appears on the TV screen indicating information about the tape, but the information will not be recorded on the tape.
- If you don't want to watch TV while recording, you can turn off the TV. When using a cable box, make sure to leave it on.

Notes

- If your tape ends during quick-timer recording, recording stops and the VCR turns off. The tape does not rewind automatically.
- If a power interruption occurs during quick-timer recording, recording stops and your VCR turns off. If the interruption lasts less than one hour and the power is restored before the recording end time, recording will start again from that point.

To stop recording

Press ■ STOP.

To select tape speeds

When recording, select either SP or LP. LP provides recording time twice as long as SP. However, SP provides better picture quality. You can mix SP and LP on the same tape. When playing back, the VCR automatically detects the tape speed. See the table below for the maximum recording/playback time in each speed.

If you use other types of tapes than those listed above, the remaining tape length may not be displayed correctly.

Recording using the quick timer

The quick timer enables you to record for a specified period of time in intervals of 30 minutes. Once you specify the recording time, the VCR automatically stops recording. Before you begin, check that the clock is set correctly.

After you start recording, press QUICK TIMER on the operation panel until the desired duration appears in the display window. The TIMER indicator on the VCR lights up. Each press increases the recording duration in increments of 30 minutes as shown below.

→ 0:00 → 0:30 → 1:00 ---- → 7:30 → 8:00

The recording duration decreases minute by minute to 0:00, then the VCR turns off automatically.

To stop recording

To stop quick-timer recording while the VCR is recording a program, press TIMER REC ON/OFF to turn off the TIMER indicator on the VCR.

To extend the recording duration while recording

Press QUICK TIMER until the desired duration appears in the display window.

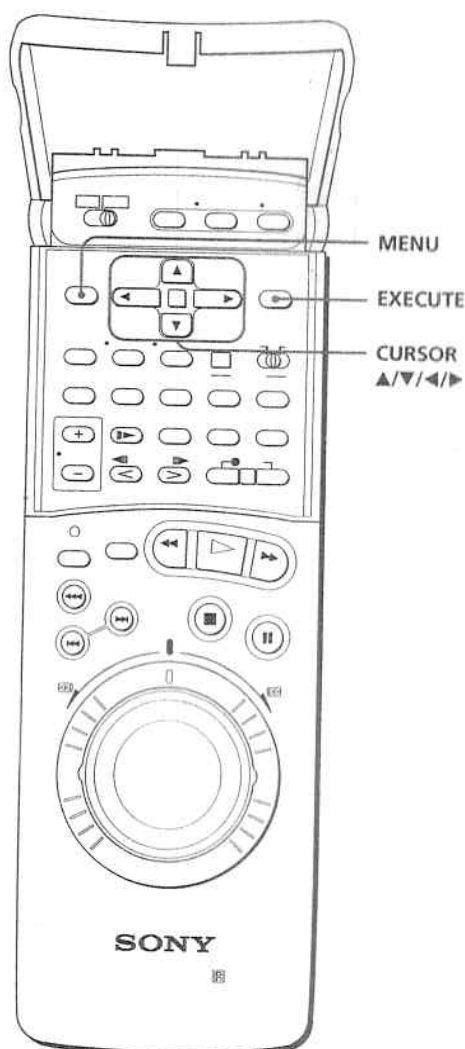
Watching a TV program while recording another

You can watch a TV program and record another at the same time.

- 1 Press TV/VTR on the top right of the remote commander to turn off the VTR indicator in the display window.
- 2 If the TV is connected to the VCR using an audio/video cable, set the TV to TV input.
If the TV is connected to the VCR using only the antenna cable, skip this step.
- 3 Select the desired channel on the TV.

Recording stereo and SAP programs

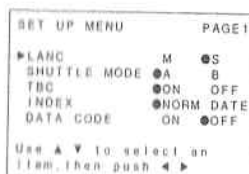
Stereo programs

This VCR automatically records stereo programs in stereo. When stereo programs are received, the STEREO indicator appears in the display window. If noise occurs while receiving a stereo program, record the program in monaural. Follow the steps below.

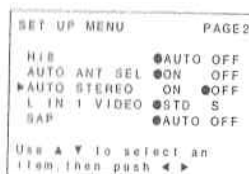

Normally, this VCR records main sound on both the PCM and the hi-fi (standard) tracks. To record SAP (Second Audio Program) sound on the hi-fi (standard) track, follow the steps below.

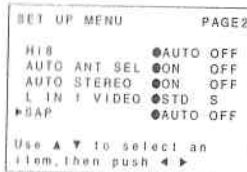

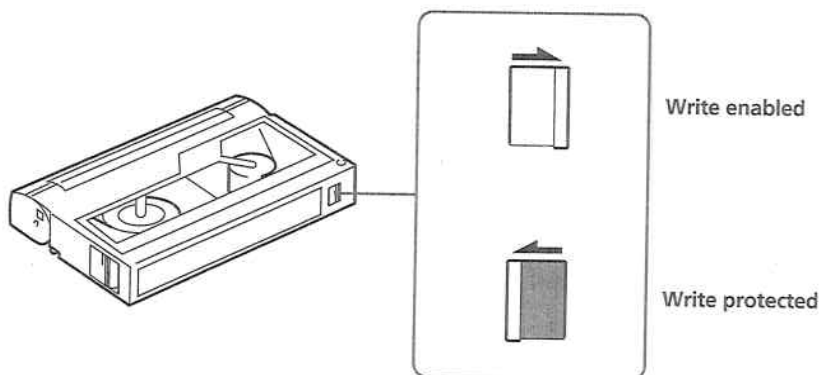

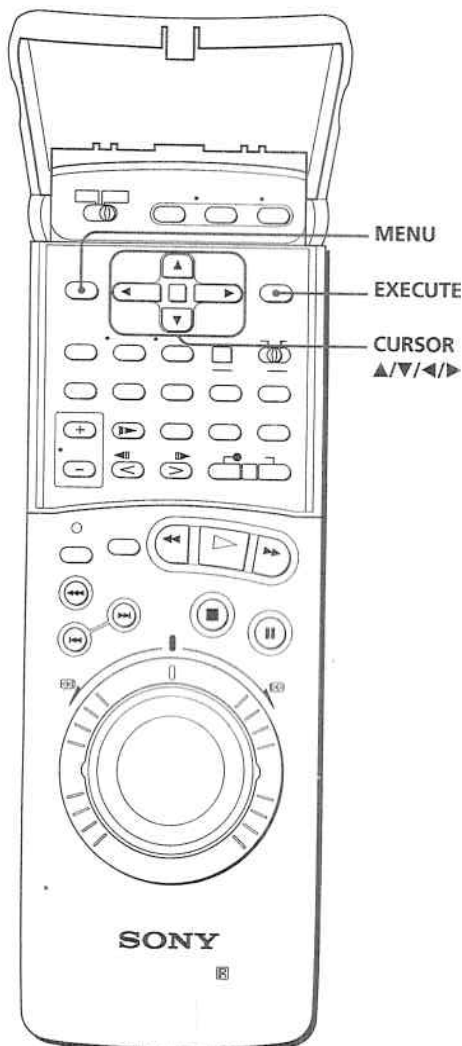
Saving a recording

Video tapes have a safety tab to protect against accidental recording. To prevent accidental erasure of a recording, slide out the tab on the cassette so that the red portion is visible. A tape with its safety tab in this position ejects if you try to record on it.

To re-record on a tape, slide the tab so that the red portion is not visible.



Recording TV programs using the timer

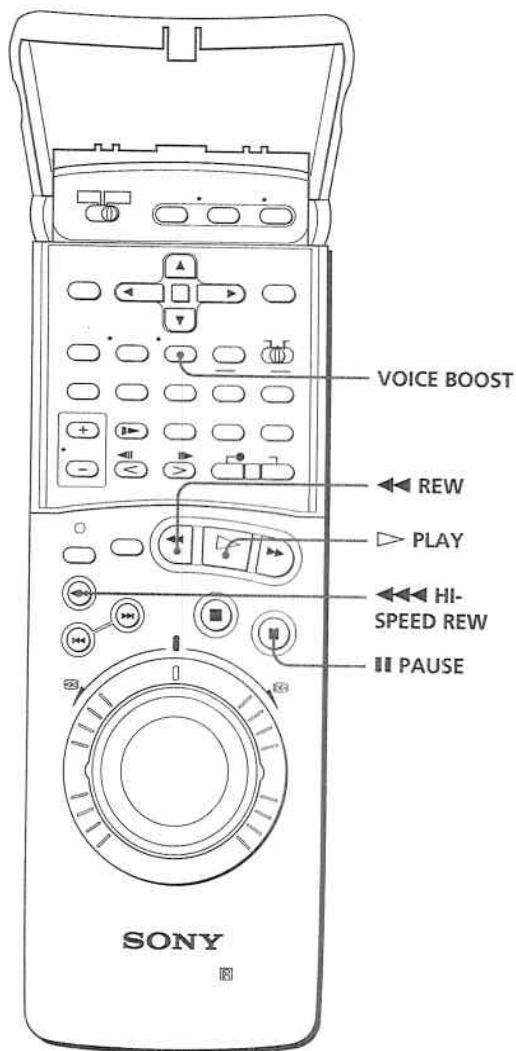
- You can improve picture quality during playback at various speeds. See "Adjusting the tracking" on page 52.

Note

- When you are displaying the TIME CODE or remaining tape length on the counter display, you can't use the TAPE RETURN button.

You can play back a tape at various speeds: high-speed, slow motion, frame by frame and so on. These options are also useful for searching for a specific point during playback. The sound is muted during these operations.

- When rewinding at high speed, you will not see the time counter. After the tape is rewound to the beginning, the time counter displays "00H00M00S."

- The VOICE BOOST function operates in standard hi-fi sound, and doesn't function when using PCM audio sound.

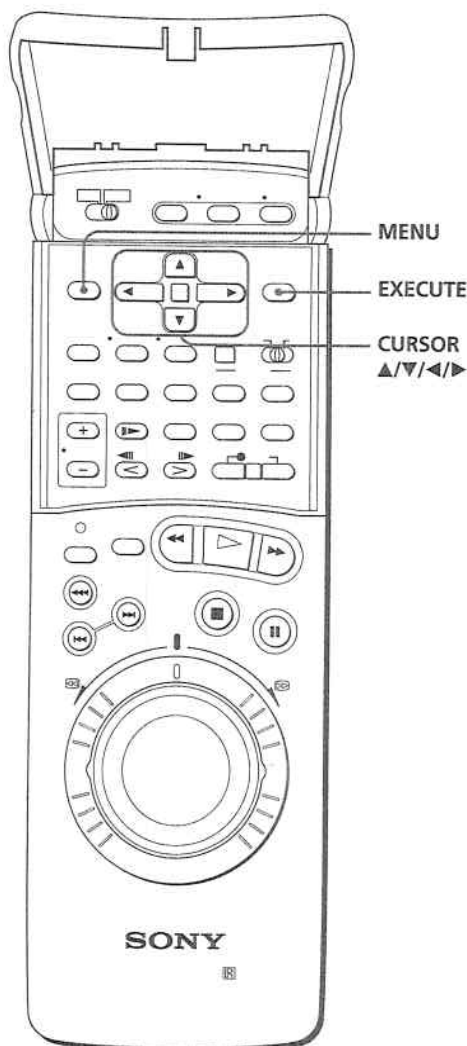

Listening more easily to conversation recorded with a video camera

When you play a tape recorded with a video camera, you can reduce external noises (such as wind and traffic sounds), and amplify the human voice portion of the audio by using the VOICE BOOST function.

- 1 Press VOICE BOOST on the remote commander.
The VOICE BOOST indicator lights up on the VCR.
- 2 To listen to a tape in normal audio, press VOICE BOOST again to turn it off.
The VOICE BOOST indicator on the VCR goes out.

Adjusting the picture



Note

- The video signal is divided into Y (brightness element) and C (color element). The time delay gap between the transmission of these two elements is known as "Y/C delay."

On this VCR you can adjust the hue, color, sharpness, and the Y/C delay. You can adjust the picture to suit your own viewing pleasure during regular tape playback. You can also adjust the tracking for slow-motion forward and reverse, and for two-times speed playback. (See page 52.)

Using this menu option you can make the following picture adjustments:

- HUE and COLOR to adjust skin color and color tone and depth etc.
- SHARPNESS to obtain a clearer more precise picture.
- Y/C DELAY to adjust color on the right or left portions of the picture.

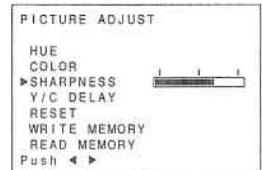

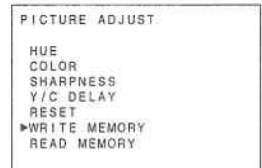

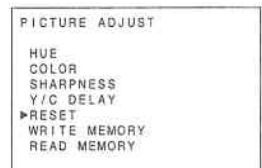
- 7** To store your settings in memory, follows steps 1 to 3, then make your settings, then do the following:

- 1 Press **CURSOR** ▲/▼ to move the cursor (▶) to **WRITE MEMORY**.
- 2 Press **EXECUTE** to enter the settings.



To recall your stored setting, press READ MEMORY.

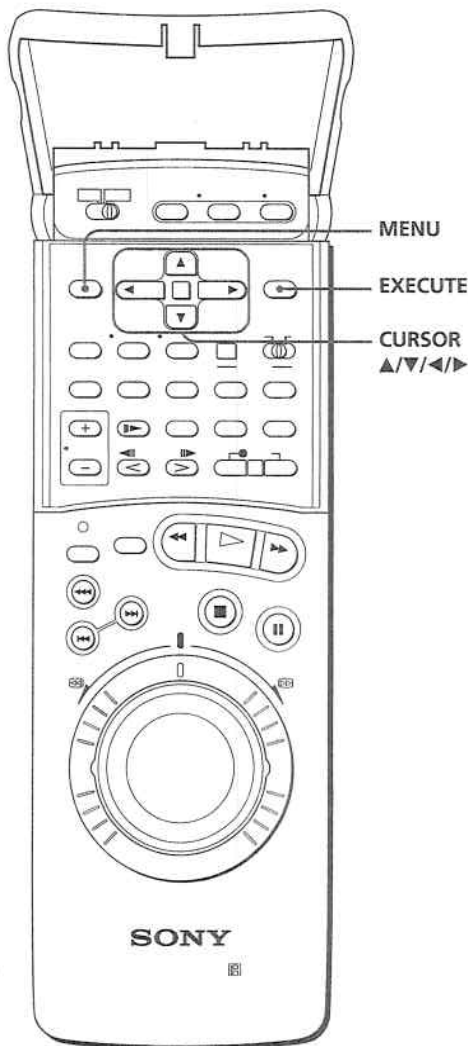
When you want to change settings, press **CURSOR** ▲/▼ to move the cursor (▶) to **RESET**, then press **EXECUTE** to delete the current settings. These are automatically reset to the default settings as adjusted at the factory at the time of shipment.



Notes

- When the **EDIT** switch is set to **ON**, the **PICTURE ADJUST** settings are automatically set to default.
- Usually the default setting are adequate unless the tape is of poor quality or recording was made on another **VCR**.

Adjusting the picture (continued)



Notes

- If the picture flickers when adjusting the tracking, return the tracking bar (■) to the center position and try again.
- When viewing in reverse slow motion, even if you have adjusted the tracking, the picture might flicker and the colors might not be clear.

The VCR automatically adjusts the picture for the best possible playback or recording. If, however you find the automatic adjustment unsatisfactory, you can adjust the picture manually.

Adjusting the tracking

Though the VCR automatically adjusts the tracking when playing a tape, distortion may occur if the tape was recorded in poor condition. If so, manually adjust the tracking condition during SLOW, - SLOW, or X2 playback. The tracking can only be adjusted automatically during normal playback.

Reducing picture noise

When you play a tape that is in poor condition you can improve the playback quality by using the DNR (Digital Noise Reduction) function.

Notes

- When changing the DNR setting, it takes approximately 3 seconds for the new setting to show on the TV screen.
- If TBC is set to OFF in the SET UP MENU, you cannot use the DNR function.

To change DNR settings

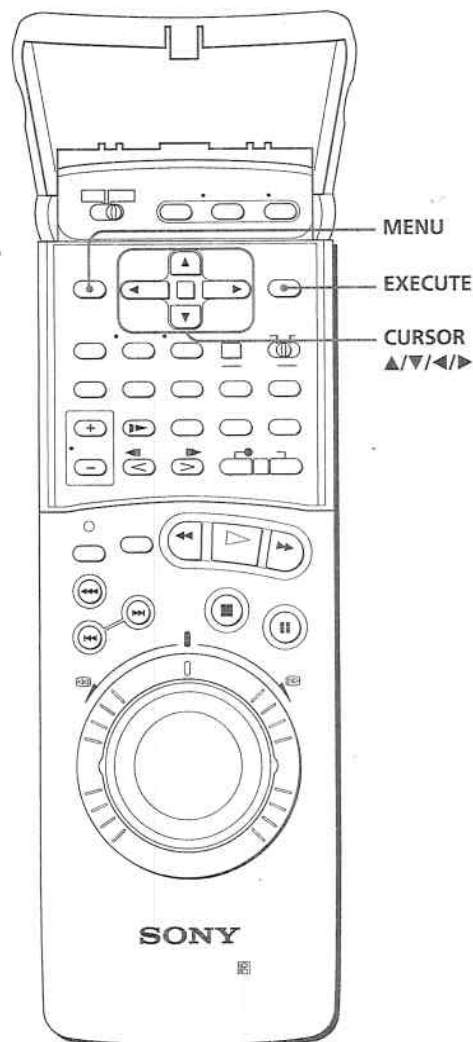
Press DNR to select the desired setting:

Searching using the index function – index search

Notes

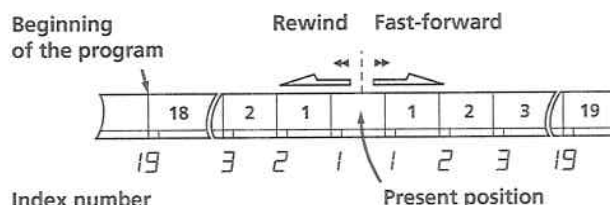
- You can't mark an index signal when you start recording from recording pause. However, while in recording pause, you can mark an index signal if the channel is changed.
- Leave an interval of at least 2 minutes for SP mode, and at least 4 minutes for LP mode, between indices so that the VCR can detect the signals correctly.
- An index signal is a 10-second preview, and the last scene of this 10-second interval remains displayed on the TV screen after the preview.



An index signal is automatically recorded at the beginning of a scene when you start recording. You can find specific scenes easily using the marks (index points). There two kinds of index searches you can make, "normal" and "date." You can use the "date" index for read only.

How the index function works

The index works as a divider between scenes, and is not numbered. So, when you specify the index mark later, you have to specify the relative position from the current position.



Locating an index by number – "normal" INDEX SEARCH

Locate an index by indicating how many index signals ahead or behind the scene is from the tape's current position. You can specify up to 19 index points either ahead or behind the current position. See "Using the SET UP menu" on page 32 to set the INDEX menu option.

- 1 Insert an indexed tape into the VCR, then press MENU.

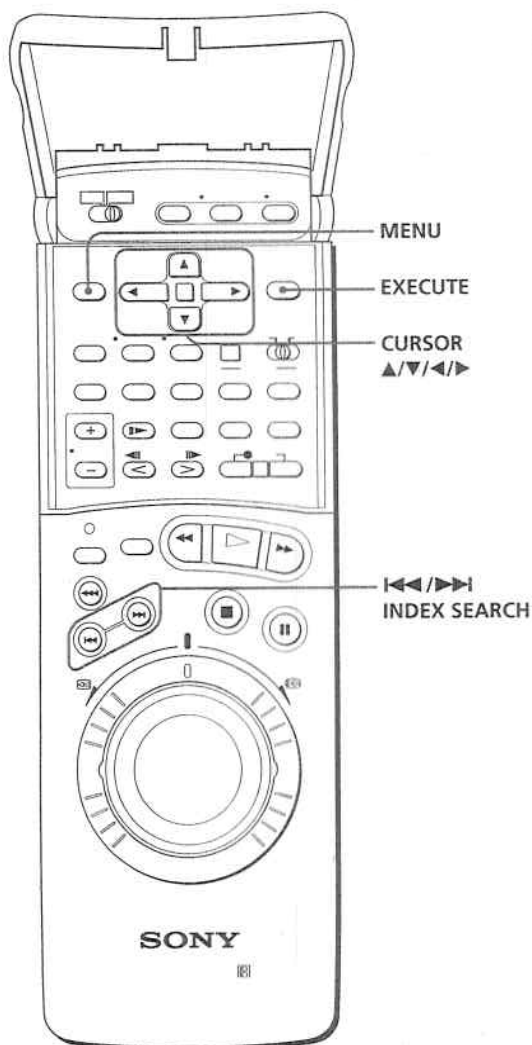

Locating an index by date – “date” INDEX SEARCH

You can locate a desired scene by date if the tape you are using was recorded on by a video camera that has a date code function. You can call up to 19 index points by searching for DATA CODE signals. See “Using the SET UP menu” on page 32 to set the INDEX menu option.

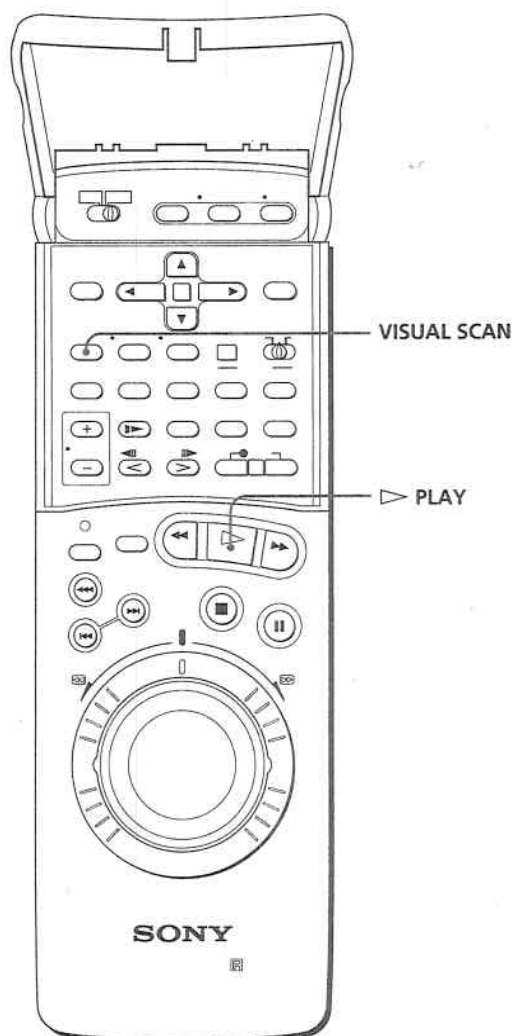

Searching using the index function – index search (continued)

Notes

- If the tape you are using has no index marks the visual scan function doesn't work.
- If the first scene appears in black and white while the other scenes may also be in black and white.
- After you press VISUAL SCAN while the tape is rewinding, the counter displays ":-:-:-:-".
- When using the visual scan function the first scene on the first few seconds of the tape may not be displayed.
- If the tape contains unrecorded portions between scenes, the screen may turn black-and-white during visual scan.



Locating up to 9 index points visually – VISUAL SCAN

Using the visual scan function you can find and play a program you've marked with an index signal. You can view up to 9 different scenes on the TV screen at the same time. Either numbered or dated indexed scenes can be viewed. When you want to find a scene but don't know the exact location you can find it by using this function. You can view up to 9 scenes on the TV screen to search for the desired scene.

1 Press VISUAL SCAN while in stop mode.

The tape rewinds automatically. When the tape is rewound to the beginning it then fast-forwards to the first index signal. The first 1 scene appears on the TV screen. The VCR then fast-forwards to the next index signal. After 9 scenes are displayed on the TV screen the VCR stops searching for index signals.

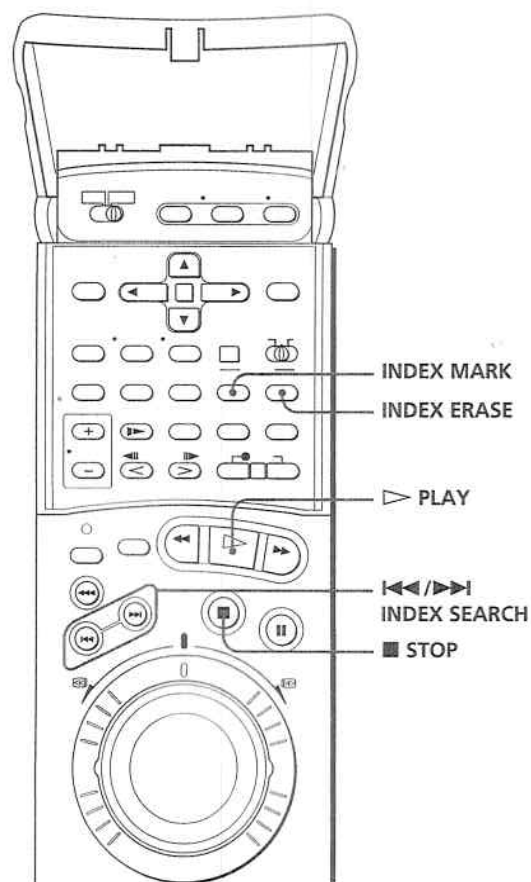

Notes

- When you mark an index signal, the recorded sound may be interrupted and a black bar appears on at the bottom of the TV screen, but the tape will not be damaged.
- Leave an interval between indices of at least 2 minutes for SP mode, and at least 4 minutes for LP mode, so that the VCR can detect the signals correctly.
- If you mark or erase an index signal on a tape that has been marked with date codes, the date codes may be erased.
- You can't mark or erase index signals on cassettes that have their safety tab in the red position.



Note

- You can't erase index signals that occur at the beginning of the tape, or those on tapes marked by a video camera or other VCR.

Marking index signals

You can mark and index anywhere on a tape, so that you can easily find the specific point later on. Press INDEX MARK while in recording or playback mode.



This VCR cannot mark a "date" index.

Erasing index signals

You can remove any unwanted "normal" index signals using this function. However, you can't erase "date" index signals.

- 1 Press INDEX SEARCH while in stop or playback mode.**
The VCR rewinds or fast-forwards the tape automatically, and playback starts when the index number indicated on the TV screen reaches "0."

- 2 Press INDEX ERASE during the 10-second preview for the index you want to erase. To stop erasing index signals, press PLAY or STOP.**

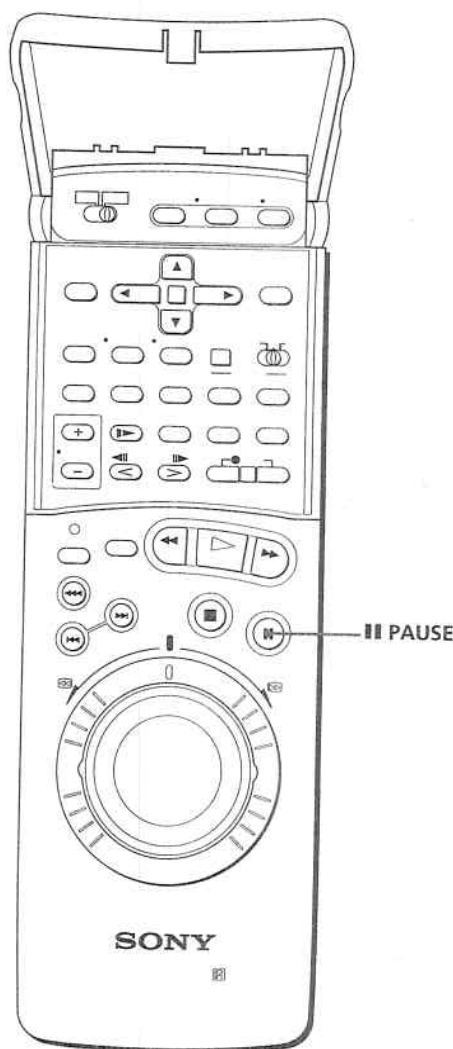


Editing


Shuttle editing

Note

- During shuttle editing, use the JOG dial/SHUTTLE ring on the VCR, not on the remote commander.



This section shows you how to edit VCR recordings in the most basic way: shuttle editing. The VCR also provides the following ways of editing:

- Editing to or from another VCR or camcorder—"Editing with another VCR" (page 60).
- Editing via the LANC  or CONTROL S jacks of two VCRs—"Synchronized editing" (page 62).
- Taking events from one tape and assembling them onto another tape in any order—"Assemble editing" (page 66).
- Adding music or narration on the PCM track—"Audio dubbing" (page 70).

During recording

If you want to cut out events such as TV commercials, you can pause recording and play back the tape in the reverse direction until the beginning of an unwanted event is reached. Then, record over it. This feature only works from the VCR. During timer recording, you can't use this function.

1 Press II PAUSE during recording.

The VCR enters recording pause mode.

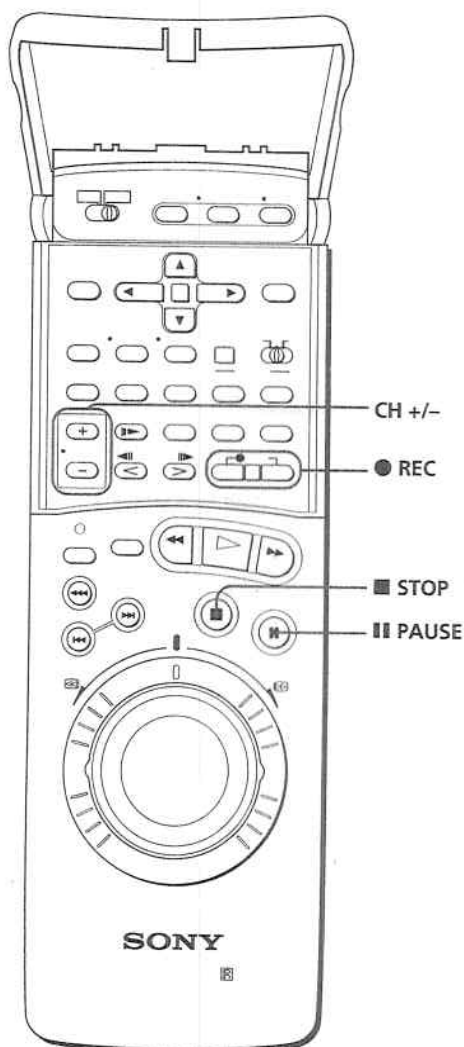
2 Turn the JOG dial/SHUTTLE ring on the VCR counter-clockwise to rewind the tape until the unwanted event appears.

If you turn the JOG dial/SHUTTLE ring, you can select the playback speed by how fast you turn it, and if you turn it.

When you release the dial or ring, the VCR enters recording pause mode.

3 Press II PAUSE when a desired event appears on the screen.

Recording starts.



Note

- The picture may be distorted for a moment at the cut-out point (recording end point).

During playback

You can re-record onto an unwanted portion of a pre-recorded tape. Use the JOG dial/SHUTTLE ring on the VCR.

- 1 When an unwanted event appears during playback, press **II PAUSE**.**
The VCR enters the playback pause mode.
- 2 Turn the JOG dial/SHUTTLE ring on the VCR until the beginning of the unwanted event appears on the screen.**
Turn the JOG dial/SHUTTLE ring to the desired playback speed. When you release the dial or ring, the VCR enters playback pause mode.
- 3 Press **● REC** on the VCR or the remote commander.**
The VCR enters recording pause mode.
- 4 Select a new program for re-recording. Press CH +/- on the remote commander or CHANNEL +/- on the VCR.**
If you have made the connection using the line input jacks, press INPUT SELECT.
- 5 Press **II PAUSE** when the event you want to record appears on the screen.**
Recording begins.

To stop recording

Press **■ STOP**.

Editing with another VCR

Tips

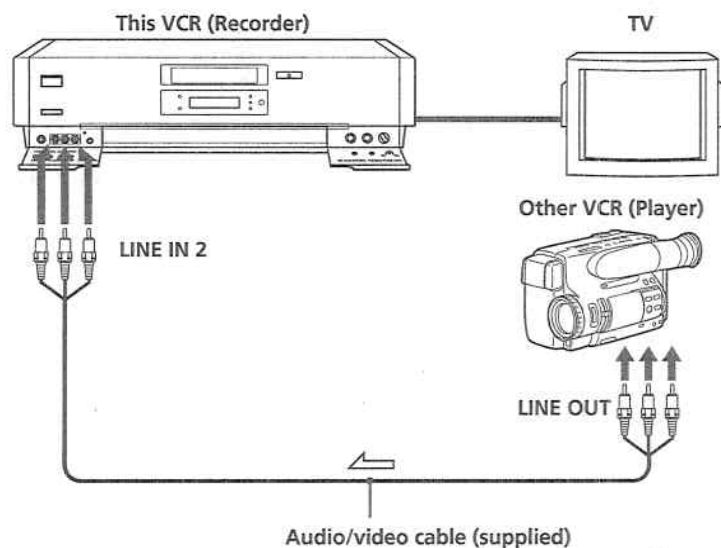
- Make sure you connect the plugs to jacks of the same color.
- To connect the playback VCR, you can use the LINE IN 1 jacks as well. In this case, press INPUT SELECT to display "L1" in the display window.
- If the playback VCR is a monaural type and you use LINE IN 2 on the front of the VCR, connect to the AUDIO L (white) jack.

Notes

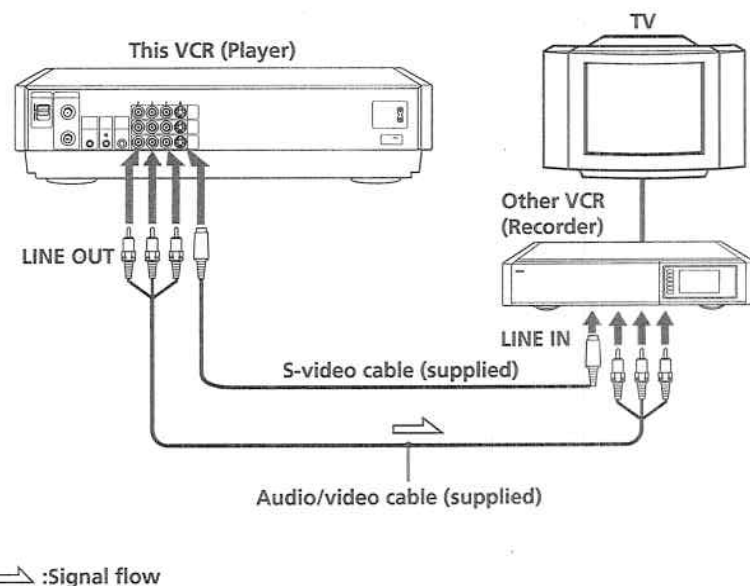
- If the playback VCR has an S-video connector, use the supplied S-video cable unless you have used it for the TV-VCR connection. This connection gives you a picture of higher quality than using the video cable. When using VIDEO or LINE IN 1 S VIDEO, set L IN 1 VIDEO to S in the SET UP MENU. If you use the VIDEO IN jack and S VIDEO IN connector at the same time when using LINE IN 2, the S VIDEO IN connector takes priority.
- When connecting the VCRs, do not simultaneously connect the LINE IN and LINE OUT jacks on your VCR. A humming noise may occur if you do this.
- When using this VCR for playback, press EDIT on the VCR, or the on-screen information will appear on the TV screen.

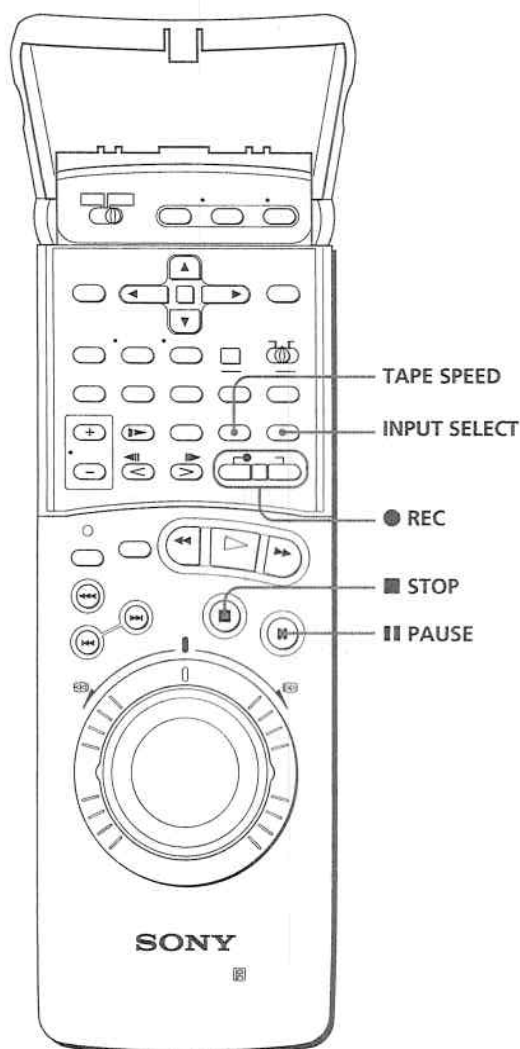

Operation (when recording on this VCR)

Before you start editing

- Press INPUT SELECT to display "L2" in the display window.
- Press TAPE SPEED to select the recording tape speed (SP/LP).
- If the other (playback) VCR has an EDIT function, set it to ON.

- 1** Insert a source tape into the playback VCR. Search for the point to start playback and set the VCR to playback pause.
- 2** Insert a tape into this (recording) VCR. Search for the point to start recording and press **|| PAUSE**.
- 3** Press **● REC** on this VCR and set it to recording pause.
- 4** To start editing, press the **|| PAUSE** buttons on both VCRs to release the VCRs from pause.
For best results, press the pause button on the playback VCR just before pressing **|| PAUSE** on this VCR.

To stop editing

Press the **■ STOP** buttons on both VCRs.

Note

- Make sure that the safety tab is in the correct position. If the playback VCR is a VHS model, make sure that the safety tab on the source tape has been removed.



Tips

- To make your editing more precise, release the VCRs from pause by pressing **|| PAUSE** buttons on the VCRs, not on the remote commander.
- To cut out unwanted events while editing, press **|| PAUSE** on this VCR when an unwanted event begins. When it ends, press **|| PAUSE** again to resume recording (assemble editing).

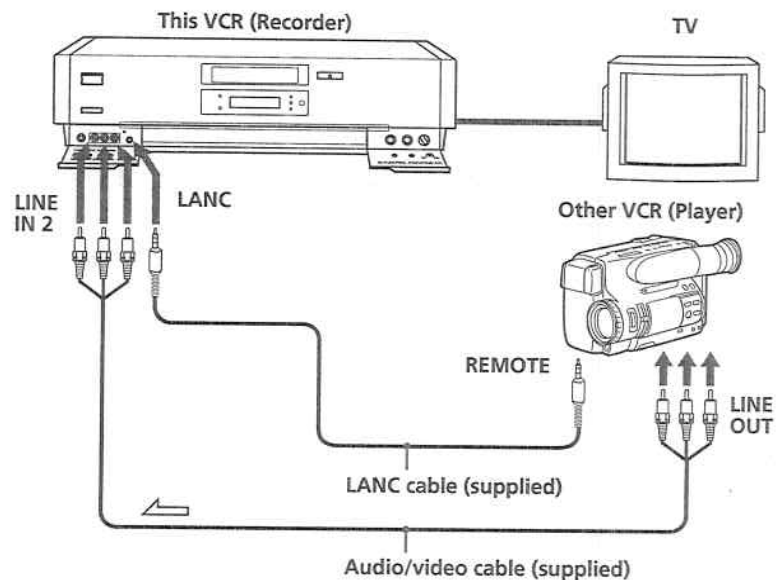
Synchronized editing

Notes

- If the playback VCR is a monaural type and you use LINE IN 2 on the front of the VCR, connect to the AUDIO L (white) jack.
- When connecting the VCRs, do not connect both LINE IN and LINE OUT jacks on your VCRs simultaneously. Doing so may cause a humming noise.
- If the playback VCR has an S-video connector, use the supplied S-video cable. This connection gives you a picture of higher quality than using the video cable. When using VIDEO or LINE IN 1 S VIDEO, set L IN 1 VIDEO to S in the SET UP MENU. If you use the VIDEO IN jack and S VIDEO IN connector at the same time when using LINE IN 2, the S VIDEO IN connector takes priority.
- You cannot set the LANC mode to M for the playback VCR. Set the LANC mode to M for this VCR to make it control the playback VCR.
- Do not use the same LANC mode setting for both VCRs, as this may cause a malfunction.
- When using this VCR for playback, press EDIT on the VCR, or the on-screen information will appear on the TV screen.



If the playback VCR has a LANC  or CONTROL S jack, connect the VCRs via the LANC  or CONTROL S jacks. This additional connection lets you control both VCRs from one VCR for easier editing.

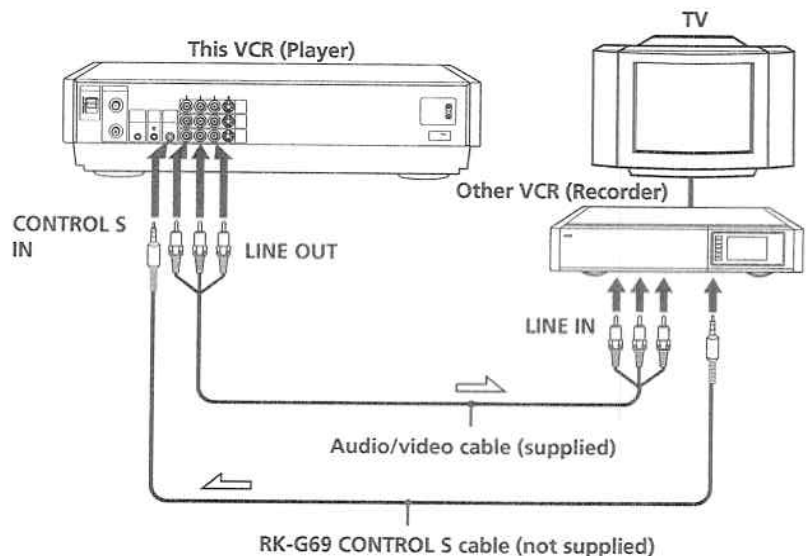
How to hook up via the LANC jacks



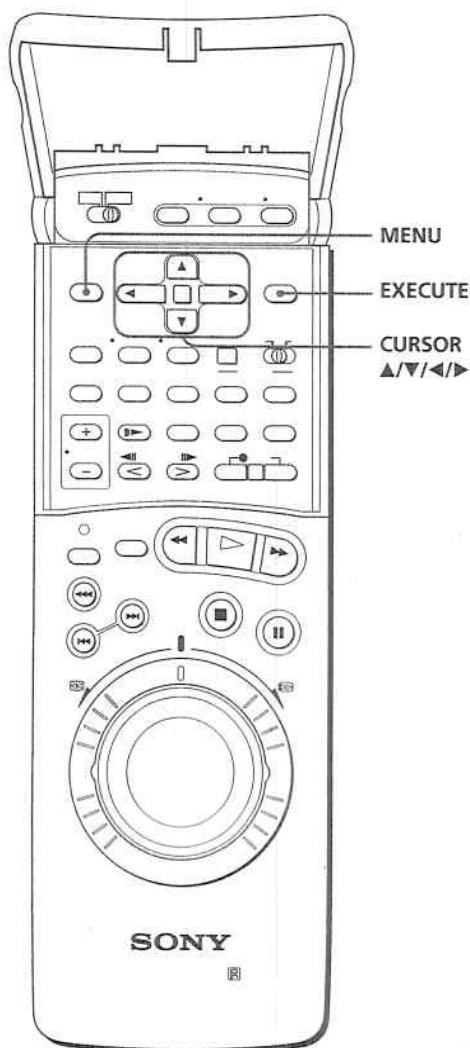
 :Signal flow

How to hook up via the CONTROL S jacks

The CONTROL S connection only enables you to pause and release pause. Use the LANC  jack if the recording VCR has both LANC  and CONTROL S jacks.

Notes

- You can't do synchronized editing on VCRs that do not have a LANC connector.
- If the tape recording condition of the playback VCR is poor, this VCR may display a blue color on the TV screen for a moment. This is not an indication of a malfunction.

Setting the LANC mode

The LANC mode setting determines which VCR controls which. Here's how to control the playback VCR from this VCR.

1 Press MENU and select SET UP MENU.

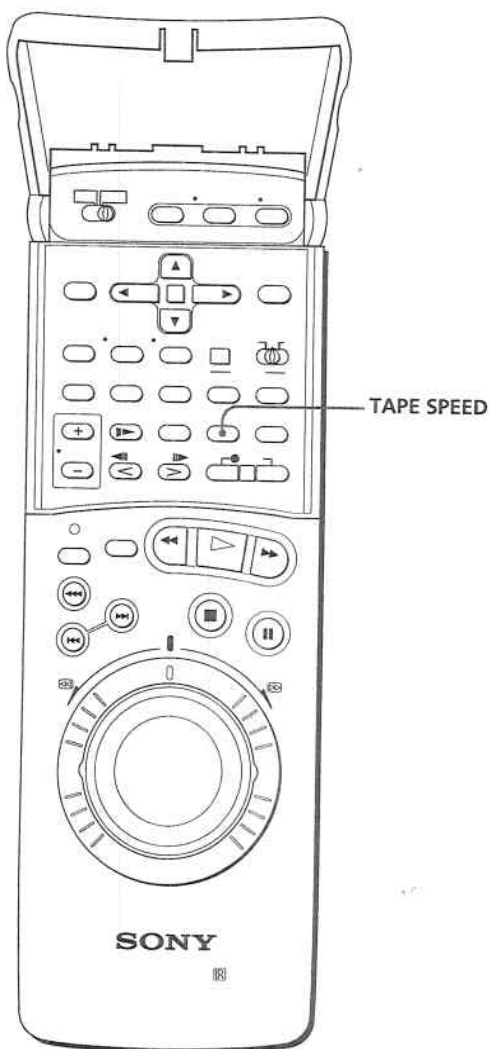

Set LANC to S on this VCR and to M on the playback VCR.

About LANC

LANC stands for Local Application Control System. The LANC connector is used for controlling the tape transport of video equipment and peripherals connected to it. This connector has the same function as connectors indicated as CONTROL L or REMOTE.

Operation (when recording on this VCR)

Before you start editing

- Make connections according to the illustration on page 62.
- If the playback VCR is equipped with an S-video output connector, use the supplied S-video cable for additional connection of the VCRs.
- If the playback VCR is a monaural type, connect the white plug to its audio output jack and the white plug on the other end to the LINE IN 2 AUDIO L (white) jack of this VCR.

On the playback VCR

- If available, activate the EDIT mode.
- If available, set LANC to S or equivalent.

On this VCR

- Set LANC to M in the SET UP MENU. See "Using the SET UP menu" on page 32.
- Adjust the recording level. For details, see page 37.
- Check if the playback VCR has a JOG/SHUTTLE function, then set SHUTTLE MODE to either A or B. (See "Using the SET UP menu" on page 32.) Note that some VCRs do not have a JOG/SHUTTLE function.
- Select the tape speed, SP or LP, using the TAPE SPEED button.

- 1** Insert a source tape into the playback VCR. Insert a tape for recording into this VCR.

 - 2** Press **EDIT STANDBY** on this VCR so that the **EDIT STANDBY** indicator lights up on the operation panel.
This VCR enters recording pause and the playback VCR enters pause.

 - 3** Press **LANC REMOTE** on the VCR so that the **LANC REMOTE** indicator lights up on the operation panel. Then turn the **JOG dial/SHUTTLE** ring to locate the start point on the playback VCR.
You can also use the tape transport buttons on this VCR.

 - 4** Release the **JOG dial/SHUTTLE** ring when you have found the desired point.
The playback VCR enters playback pause. If you have used any of the tape transport buttons, set the playback VCR to playback pause.

 - 5** Press **LANC REMOTE** on the VCR so that the indicator goes off. Then turn the **JOG dial/SHUTTLE** ring to locate the insertion start point on this VCR's tape.

 - 6** Press **SYNCHRO EDIT/START**.
Synchronized editing starts.

 - 7** When you have finished your editing session, press **SYNCHRO EDIT/START**.
Both VCRs enter recording pause.

 - 8** To edit more scenes, repeat steps 3 to 7.

 - 9** When you have finished your editing session, press **EDIT STANDBY**.

Assemble editing

Tips

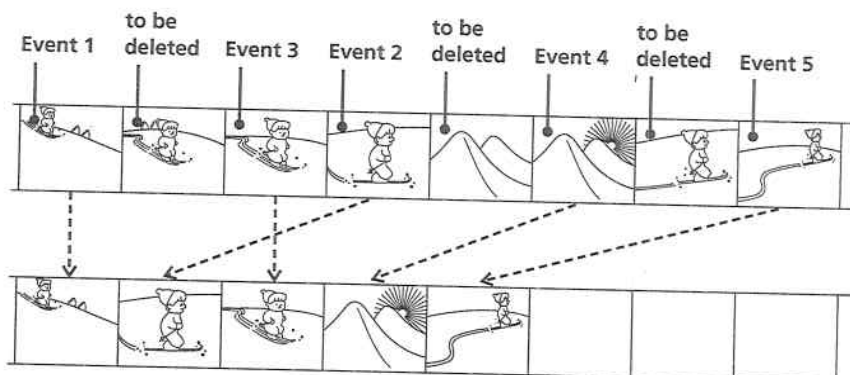
- If the playback VCR you're using does not have the TIME CODE WRITE function but only a real-time counter, precise editing cannot be guaranteed.
- For the TIME CODE WRITE function to work correctly, you must enter the time code on the entire portion of the tape you want to edit.
- When using the TIME CODE WRITE function, you can easily search for a desired event as each frame is given a readable code signal.

Notes

- The TIME CODE WRITE function on this VCR and that on professional-level VCRs are not compatible.
- If you press another button while writing the time code, writing stops automatically.
- If you use a tape that has been recorded in both SP and LP tape speeds, the TIME CODE WRITE function may not work properly.
- If you connect to a video camera that shows streaks or snow when freezing the picture, the text on the screen may be difficult to read. Make your editing decisions visually to ensure that the events you want to edit are precisely aligned.
- When using the TIME CODE WRITE function, a black band may appear at the bottom of the screen. This is not an indication of a malfunction. This black band will not appear on the events you are going to edit.

With this function you can take events from one tape and assemble edit them onto another tape.

You can insert as many events onto the new tape that you require. Using the assemble editing function, you can assemble edit up to eight different events at a time.



Using the TIME CODE WRITE function on a playback tape

When you connect this VCR to a VCR that features the TIME CODE WRITE function, you can use this function for assemble editing. This function allows you to perform more precise editing. It inserts frame position signals on the tape, and thus indexes (by numbers) the portions to be edited. However, if there are unrecorded segments on the portion that you want to edit, precise editing can't be guaranteed. In this case you must enter the time codes onto the playback tape in the other VCR.

- 1 Rewind the playback tape to the beginning.
- 2 Press \triangleright PLAY, then press \blacksquare PAUSE.
- 3 Press TIME CODE WRITE on the VCR.
- 4 Press \blacksquare PAUSE to start playback.
Time code information is automatically written onto the tape.
- 5 Press \blacksquare STOP at the end point of the portion that you want to edit.
Time code insertion stops.

Operation (when recording on this VCR)

Notes

- When you use LANC REMOTE, you can control tape operation on the playback VCR.
- Set the SHUTTLE MODE option on the playback VCR to either A or B to match the setting on this VCR. See "Using the SET UP menu" on page 32.
- Make sure that the cassette you insert into this VCR has its tab set to REC.
- The ASSEMBLE button is only operable in stop mode.

Before you start editing

- Connect this VCR to the playback VCR using the same connections as illustrated in the section "Synchronized editing" on page 62. (Be sure to read the operating instructions for the playback VCR before making connections.)
- Set the TV to video input.
- Press INPUT SELECT to select the line input that the playback VCR is connected to.
- If the playback VCR has a TIME CODE function, activate it to display the time code in the display window counter.
- On the playback VCR, set the SHUTTLE MODE to either A or B (see page 32).

1 Press ASSEMBLE on this VCR.

The assemble editing menu appears on the TV.

Tip

- The TOTAL TIME figure gives the total time for all the events. The tape speed of the recording tape must match that of the events to be entered, or the events will not be recorded properly.

Notes

- Leave a space of about two seconds between the IN frame and OUT frame, or the events cannot be marked correctly.
- When you want to stop assemble editing, press ASSEMBLE again.
- When the TIME CODE is less than 0:01:00:00, the editing will not be very precise. In this case, do the editing manually as described in the "Synchronized editing" section on page 62.

5 Find the last scene of the event you want to assemble edit.

Once the end of the first event has been found, go to step 6.

6 Press MARK on the VCR to mark the "OUT" frame.

"IN" flashes, and the total time of the event you have selected is displayed. After a couple of seconds, the VCR is ready for setting the next event.

"EXE" appears on the TV screen, and assemble editing starts. When editing is completed, the VCR enters the recording pause mode.

Tip

- For the purpose of protecting the tape, when you are in recording pause mode, after 5 minutes the VCR automatically enters the stop mode.

Notes

- When you press BACK, the VCR returns to the last frame of the event you have selected. Press BACK again to return to the first frame of the event.
If you haven't designated an end frame, the tape records through to the end.
- If you press ■ PAUSE during assemble editing, the event you are editing is set. If you have another event, the next event is also automatically edited.
- During fast-forwarding or rewinding, if the TIME CODE indicator on the playback VCR should show ":-:-", the assemble editing function may not work. In this case, please use the synchronized editing function instead.

To assemble edit more than 8 events

Repeat the above described procedure to assemble edit the additionally required number of events.

- 1 After you've finished one assemble editing session, press ASSEMBLE. The assemble editing mode is cancelled. The contents stored in memory are deleted.
- 2 When the VCR enters recording pause mode, press ■ STOP.
- 3 Repeat from step 1 on page 67.

To change the settings stored in memory

Press BACK on the VCR.

Only the last event you have entered for assemble editing can be changed. If you press BACK twice in a row, the event entered last is deleted.

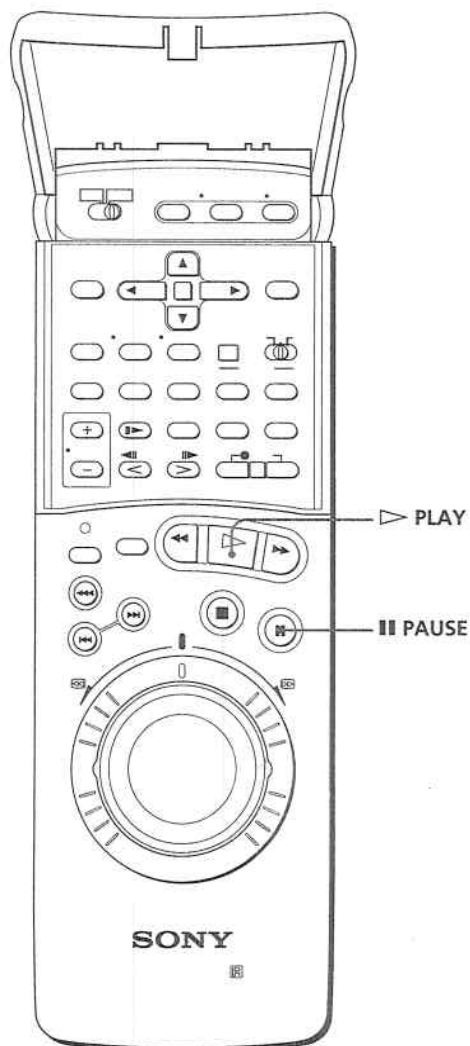

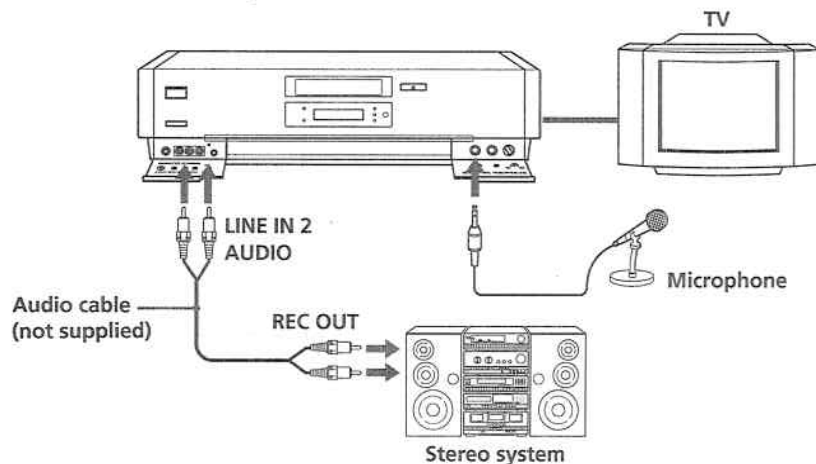

Audio dubbing



You can add music or narration on a pre-recorded tape while watching the VCR playback picture. Audio-dubbed sound is recorded on the PCM track. (See page 36.)

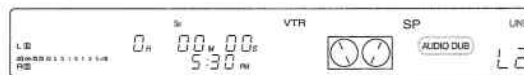


Operation

Before you start editing

- Press INPUT SELECT to display "L2" in the display window.
- Set the AUDIO MONITOR selector to PCM.

- 1 Set the PCM REC LEVEL control to the desired setting.**
This allows you to balance the sound level of the sound to be dubbed against that of the standard track.
- 2 Press ▷ PLAY.**
- 3 Find the start point of the tape portion that you want to dub new sound onto, and press II PAUSE.**
- 4 Press AUDIO DUB.**
The AUDIO DUB indicator lights up in the display window.



Notes

- You must be in playback pause mode before pressing AUDIO DUB. (If you are in recording pause mode, you cannot use the audio dubbing features.)
- Audio dubbing cannot be done if the safety tab on the cassette is slid to the show the red portion.

5 Press **II PAUSE** when you start the playback source, or want to start adding narration using a microphone.

6 When you have finished your audio dubbing session, press **■ STOP** on this VCR.

- For fade-in operation, adjust the PCM REC LEVEL control from the zero point to the normal position.
For fade-out operation, turn it from the normal position to the zero point.
- The sound from the LINE IN AUDIO 1 or 2 jacks and the MIC jack on the front panel can be mixed.

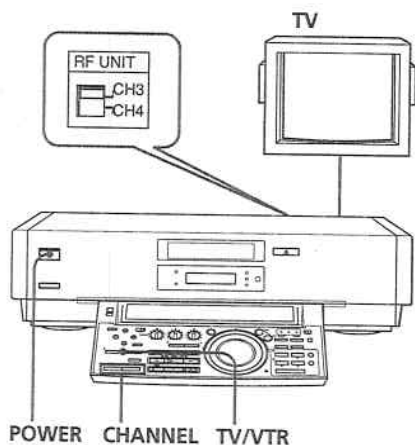
Notes

- The dubbed sound cannot be played back by a VCR without PCM recording or playback functions.
- Dubbing erases the pre-recorded sound on the PCM track.
- During dubbing, black bars may appear in the lower parts of the screen. This does not affect the recorded images.
The picture may shake or colors may fade on certain TVs.
- Sound from a microphone is recorded in monaural.
- When the microphone is not in use, do not connect the microphone to the MIC jack, or the sound will be mixed with the sound from LINE IN AUDIO 1 or 2.
- If you dub new sound onto a tape that contains DATA CODE information, this information is erased.

To listen to the sound on both the PCM and the standard track
Set the AUDIO MONITOR switch on the operation panel to MIX. If the sound is hard to distinguish, use the STD AUDIO LEVEL to adjust the standard sound level. You cannot adjust the PCM sound level.

Setting the RF unit

When connecting the VCR to the TV using only the antenna, you must set the RF UNIT switch on the rear of the VCR so that the TV can receive the correct signal from the VCR.

If you connect the VCR to the TV using the supplied audio/video cable, you can skip this step.

- 1 Set the RF UNIT switch on the rear of the VCR to CH3 or CH4, whichever channel is not used in your area. If both are used, set the switch to either channel.

- 2 Press POWER to turn on the VCR.

- 3 Press TV/VTR to turn on the VTR indicator in the VCR's display window.

- 4 Press CHANNEL +/- to display a channel number in the display window. Select an active channel number in your area.

- 5 Turn on your TV and set it to the channel you selected in step 1 (channel 3 or 4).

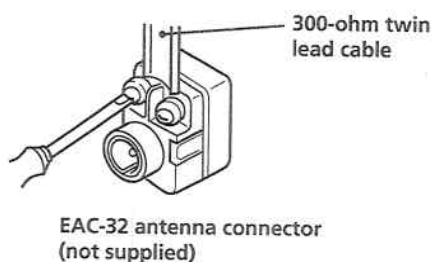
The selected TV channel broadcast appears on the TV screen. If the channels change when you press CHANNEL +/-, you have made the correct setting.

Attaching the external antenna connector

When using a 300-ohm twin lead cable for VHF/UHF antenna, use the EAC-32 antenna connector (not supplied) to connect the antenna to the VCR.

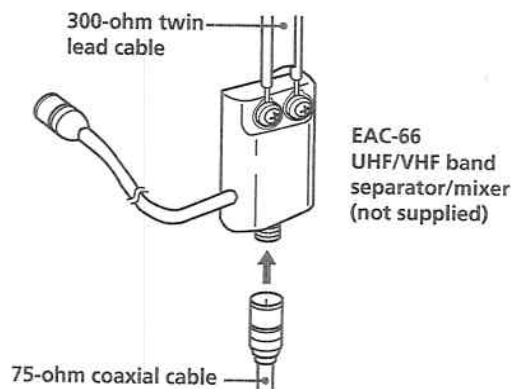

Attaching an UHF/VHF band mixer

When using both 75-ohm coaxial cable and 300-ohm twin lead cable for VHF/UHF antenna, use the EAC-66 UHF/VHF band separator/mixer (not supplied) to connect the antenna to the VCR.

- 1 Loosen the screws on the mixer.
- 2 Wind the twin leads around the screws on the mixer.
- 3 Retighten the screws.
- 4 Connect the 75-ohm coaxial cable to the mixer.
