## **Network Neighborhood Icon**

If you would like to remove the Network Neighborhood Icon from your Windows 95 desktop, please follow these instructions:

### **To Remove the Network Neighborhood Icon from your Desktop**

1. Place the Windows 95 Companion CD in the CD-ROM Drive.
2. If the Windows 95 CD screen appears, close it (click "X" in upper right corner).
3. Select the Windows 95 Start button.
4. Select the Settings option of the Start menu.
5. Select the Control Panel option of the Settings menu.
6. Double click on the Add/Remove Programs icon.
7. Click on the Windows Setup tab.
8. Click on the Have Disk button.
9. Type "G:\ADMIN\APPTOOLS\POLEDIT" and press Enter.
10. Check the box next to the System Policy Editor.
11. Click on the Install button.
12. Click OK.
13. Select the Windows 95 Start button.
14. Select the Accessories option of the Start menu.
15. Select the System Tools option of the Accessories menu.
16. Select the System Policy Editor option of the System Tools menu.
17. Select File Open Registry.
18. Double click on Local User icon.
19. Double click on Shell.
20. Double click on Restrictions.
21. Check the box next to Hide Network Neighborhood.
22. Click on the OK button.
23. Select the File option on the Menu Bar.
24. Select the Save Menu option.
25. Select the File option on the Menu Bar.
26. Select the Exit Menu option.
27. Remove the CD from the drive.
28. Select the Windows 95 Start button.
29. Select the Shut Down option of the Start menu.
30. Select the Restart the Computer radio button of the Shut Down dialog box.
31. Click on the Yes button.
32. The Network Neighborhood icon is now removed from the desktop

<p>Note: Improper use of the System Policy Editor may cause problems in WINDOWS 95 that can only be resolved by doing a complete restore. We recommend you remove it from the system now.</p>

**To Remove the Systems Policy Editor from your Desktop**

1. Select the Windows 95 Start button.
2. Select the Settings option of the Start menu.
3. Select the Control Panel option of the Settings menu.
4. Double click on the Add/Remove Programs icon.
5. Find the System Policy Editor on the list and double click on it (you may need to scroll down the list).
6. Click on the OK button.
