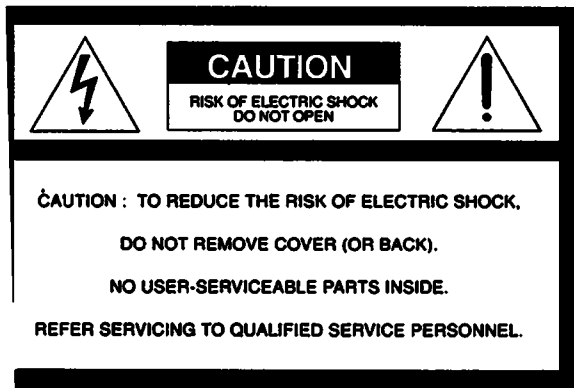

Precautions

Safety

Operate the unit only on 120 V AC, 60 Hz.
If anything falls into the cabinet, unplug the unit and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.
The blade of the plug is wider than the other for the purpose of safety and will fit into the power outlet only one way. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, contact your Sony dealer.
Unplug the unit from the wall outlet if you do not intend to use for an extended period of time. To disconnect the cord, pull it at by the plug, never by the cord.

Wall

Allow adequate air circulation to prevent internal heat buildup.
Do not place the unit on surfaces (rugs, blankets, etc.) or near materials (curtains, draperies) that may block the ventilation slots.
Do not install the unit near heat sources such as radiators or air ducts, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust, mechanical vibration or shock.
Do not install the unit in an inclined position. It is designed to be operated in a horizontal position only.

- Keep the unit and cassettes away from equipment with strong magnets, such as microwave ovens or large loudspeakers.

Step 2: Setting up the remote commander

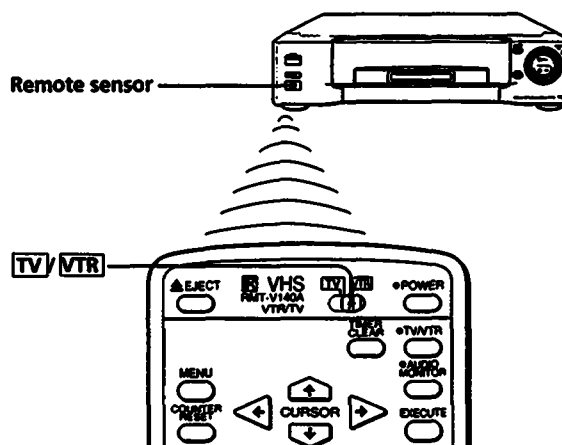
Inserting the batteries

Insert two size AA (R6) batteries by matching the + and – on the batteries to the diagram inside the battery compartment.



Using the remote commander

You can use this remote commander to operate this VCR and a Sony TV. To operate the VCR, set the COMMAND MODE switch on the VCR to VTR 3. Buttons on the remote commander marked with a dot (•) can be used to operate your TV.



Notes

- With normal use, the batteries should last for approximately three to six months.
- If you do not use the remote commander for an extended period of time, remove the batteries to avoid possible damage from battery leakage.
- Do not use a new battery with an old one.
- Do not use different types of batteries.

Controlling other TVs with the remote commander

The remote commander is preprogrammed to control non-Sony TVs. If your TV is listed in the table below, set the appropriate manufacturer's code number.

1 Set **TV/VTR** on the top of the remote commander to TV.

2 Press and hold down EXECUTE, and then enter your TV's code number(s) using the number buttons. Press the ENTER button. Then release EXECUTE.

Code numbers are listed below.

Now you can use the buttons marked with a dot (•) to control your TV. To control the VCR, reset **TV/VTR** to VTR.

Notes

- If the TV uses a different remote control system from the one programmed to work with the VCR, you cannot control your TV with the remote commander.
- If you enter a new code number, the code number previously entered will be erased.
- When you replace the batteries in the remote commander, the code number automatically resets to 1 (Sony). Reset the appropriate code number.

Step 3: Hookups

Selecting the best hookup option

Before you can use your VCR for the first time, you need to connect it to your TV and set it up to receive programs for viewing and recording. This section explains how to hook up and set up your VCR so that you can start enjoying it right away. There are, however, many types of TVs available and many ways in which your TV can be hooked up. For these reasons, this manual describes several ways your VCR can be connected.

To hook up your VCR so that it works best for you, first scan through the table below. Then use the accompanying diagrams and procedures on the following pages to set up your VCR.

Caution

Connections between the VCR's VHF/UHF connector and the antenna terminals of the TV receiver should be made only as shown in the following instructions. Failure to do so may result in operation that violates the regulations of the Federal Communications Commission regarding the use and operation of RF devices. Never connect the output of the VCR to an antenna or make simultaneous (parallel) antenna and VCR connections at the antenna terminals of your receiver.

Note to CATV system installer

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

After you've completed the connections, follow the instructions for setup including VCR Plus+ setup. During setup, if you need more details of the procedure described, page numbers are provided where you can find complete, step-by-step instructions.

After you've completed the setup, you're ready to use your VCR. Procedures differ depending on the hookup you used. For an overview, refer to "Quick reference to using the VCR" on the back cover.

Before you get started

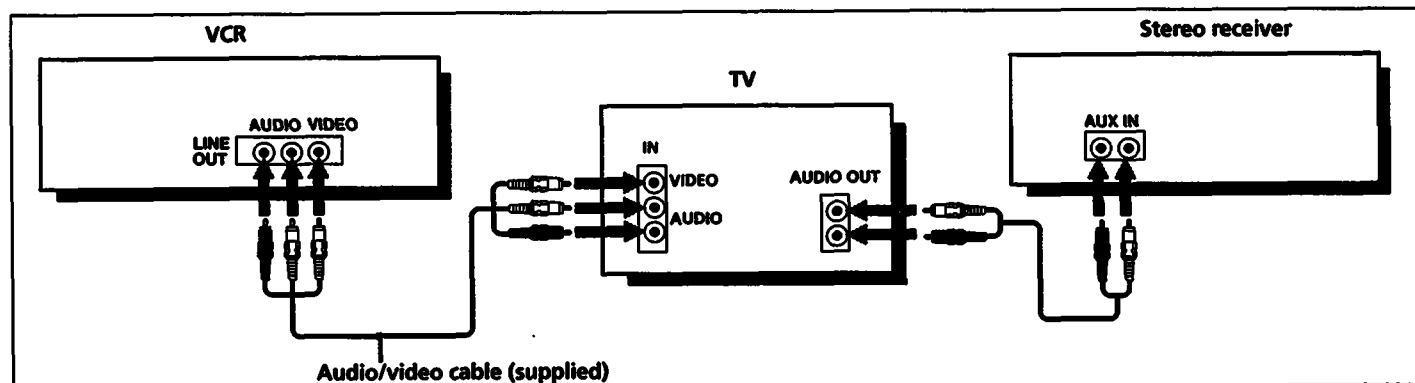
- Turn off the power to all equipment.
- Do not connect the AC power cords until all of the connections are completed.
- Be sure you make connections firmly. Loose connections may cause picture distortion.
- If your TV doesn't match any of the examples provided, see your nearest Sony dealer or qualified technician.

Audio/video (A/V) hookup

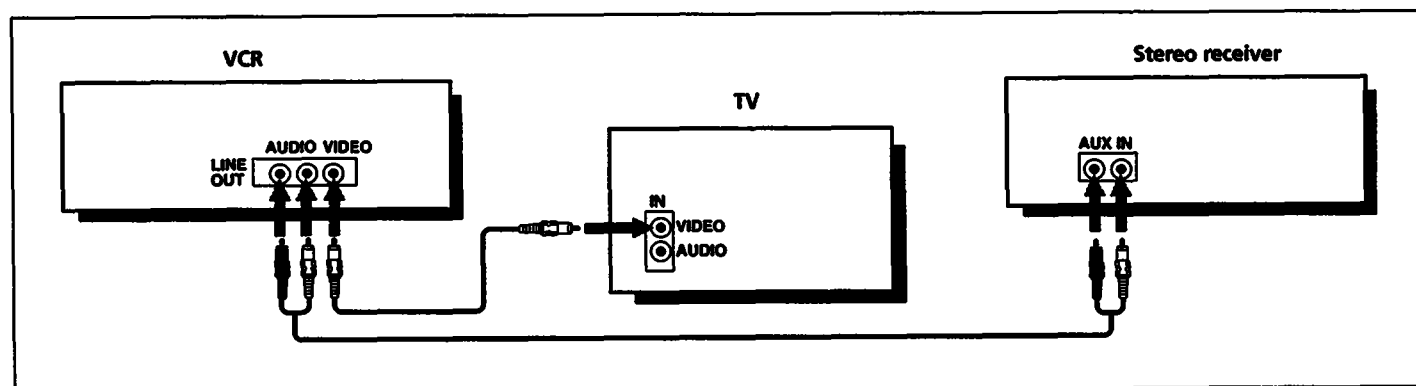
If your TV has audio/video (A/V) input jacks, you will get a better picture and sound if you hook up your VCR using these connections. In addition, for a true "home theater" experience, you should connect the audio outputs of your VCR or TV to your stereo system. If your TV doesn't have A/V inputs, see the following pages for antenna or cable hookups.

If you're planning to use your VCR only to play back pictures and movies, you're finished setting up the VCR after you've made these connections. If you want to record off-air or off your cable TV system, complete these connections first, and then go to the following pages for antenna or cable hookups.

A Use this hookup if your TV has stereo jacks



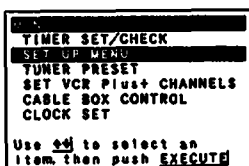
B Use this hookup if your TV doesn't have stereo jacks



A/V hookup: VCR setup

Hookup 1

Using cable box control

Recommended use

This hookup is recommended for most cable systems with cable boxes. It allows the VCR's cable box control feature to control the channel on the cable box, simplifying the recording process. You should use this hookup if you have a cable box, especially if your cable system scrambles all or most channels. A list of compatible cable boxes is on page 28.

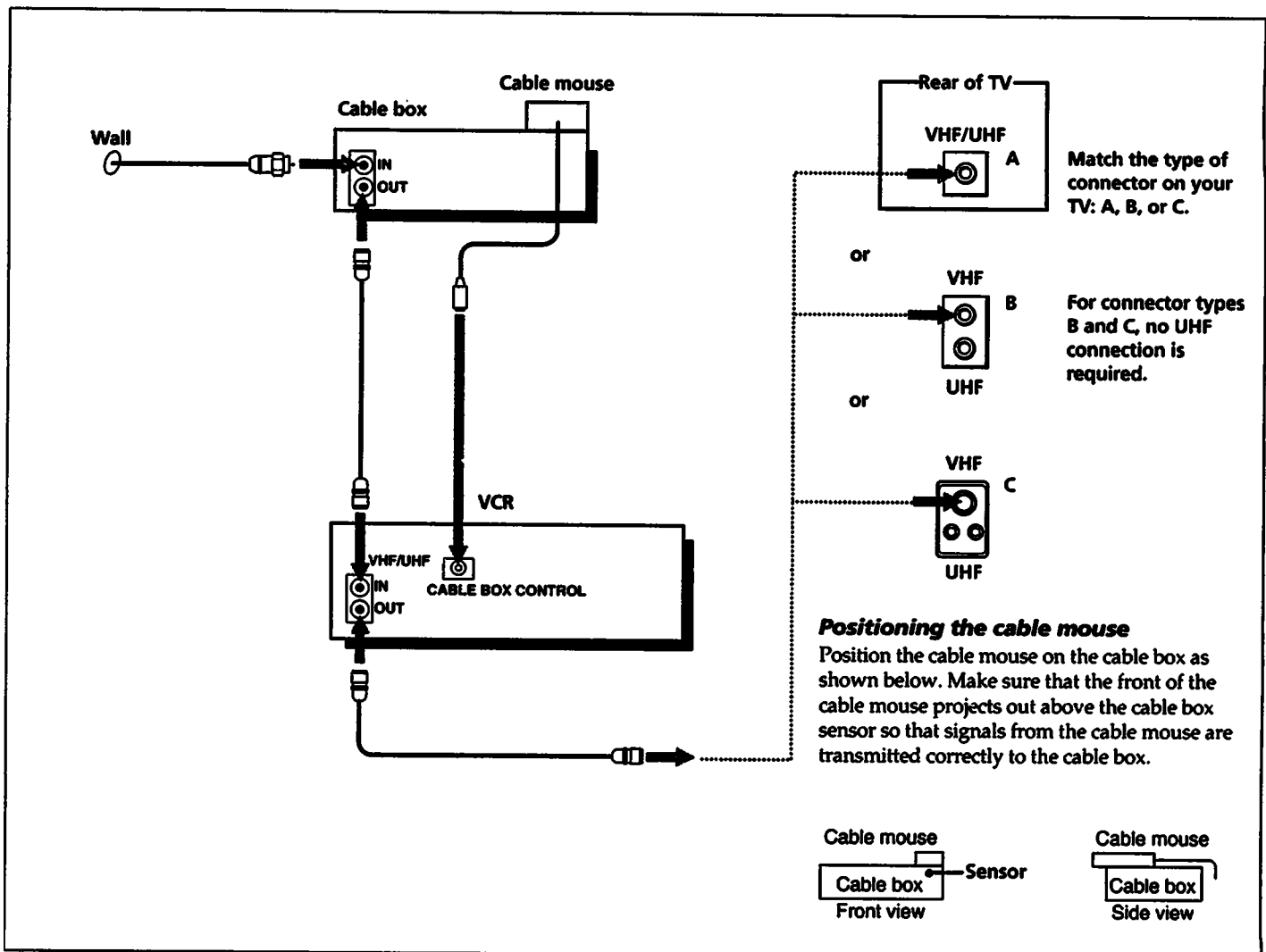

- Record any channel by using the VCR's cable box control feature to select channels on the cable box

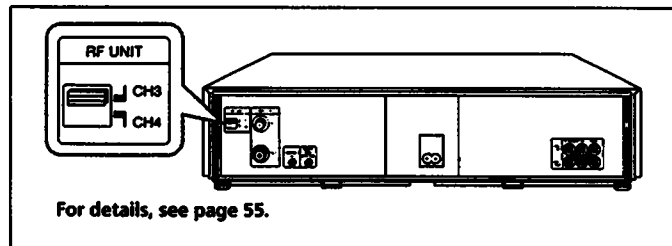

- Record one channel while watching another channel

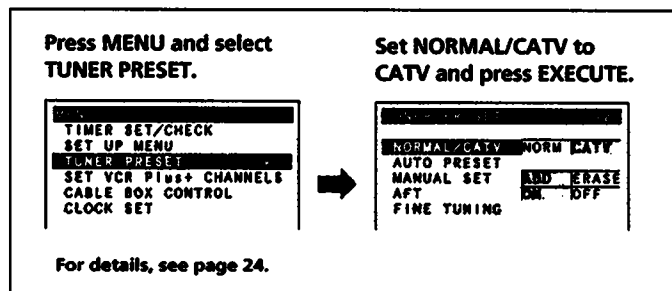

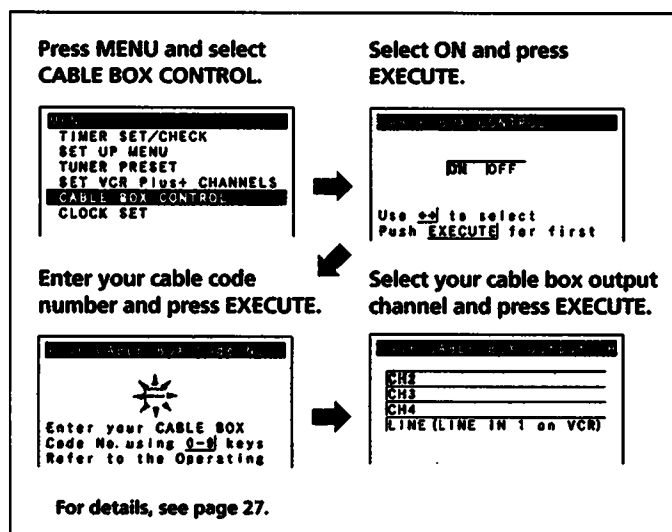

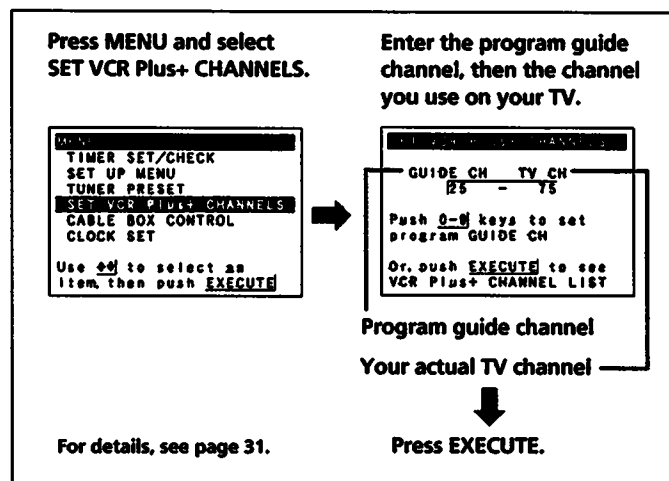


If your cable box is not compatible

Check with your cable company to see if they can provide a compatible box. If not, use Hookup 2 (or 5, if you have only a few scrambled channels) or use Hookup 4 (if you have many scrambled channels).

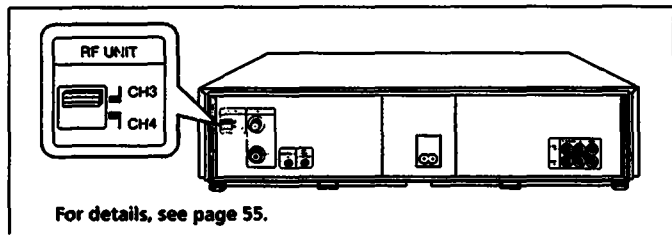


If you cannot connect your antenna cable to the VCR directly

If your antenna cable is a flat cable (300-ohm twin lead cable), attach the external antenna connector (not supplied) so that you can connect the cable to the VHF/UHF IN jack. If you have separate cables for VHF and UHF antennas, you may use a U/V band mixer. For details, see page 55.

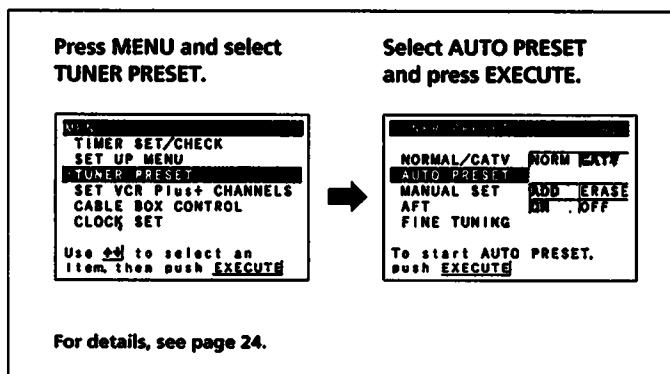

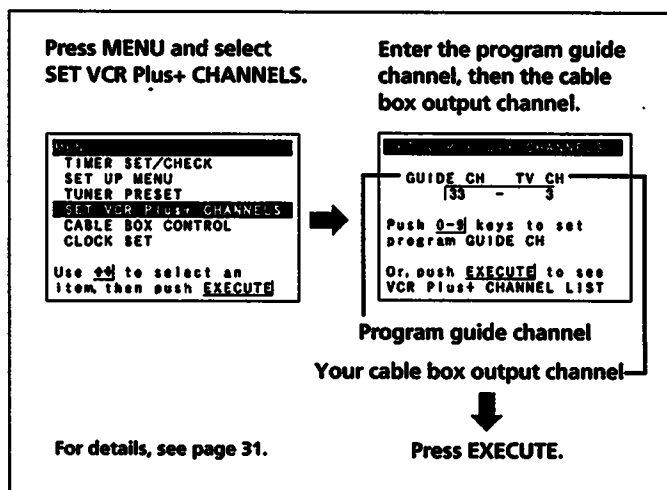

By using an A/B switch, this hookup allows you to easily record both scrambled and unscrambled channels. With the A/B switch set to position "A," you can record unscrambled channels by selecting channels directly with the VCR. You only use position "B" and the cable box to record a scrambled channel.

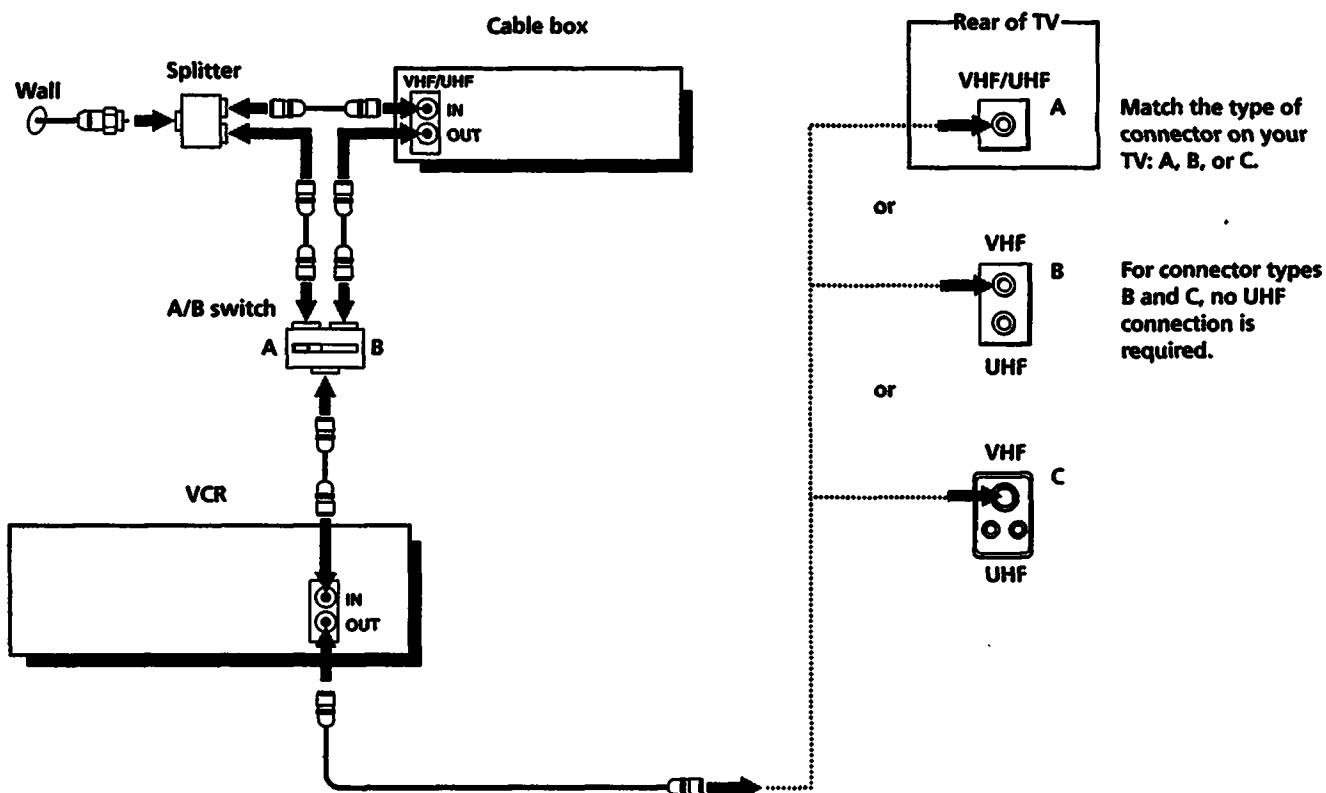

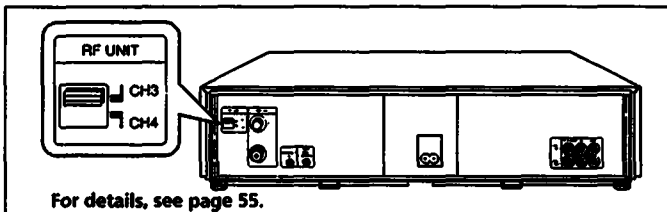

- 9 Leave the cable box on.

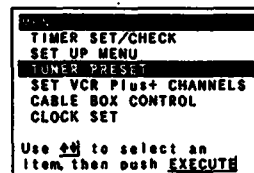
To watch TV

- 1 Turn off your VCR, or press the VCR's TV/VTR button until the VTR indicator in the display window goes off.
- 2 Set the A/B switch to "B."
- 3 Turn on your cable box.
- 4 Set the TV to the cable box output channel (usually 2, 3, or 4).
- 5 Set the cable box to the channel you want to watch.

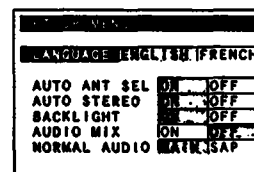
Selecting the language (Canadian model only)

If you prefer French to English, you can change the on-screen language.

- 1 Press MENU.**
The main MENU appears on the TV screen.

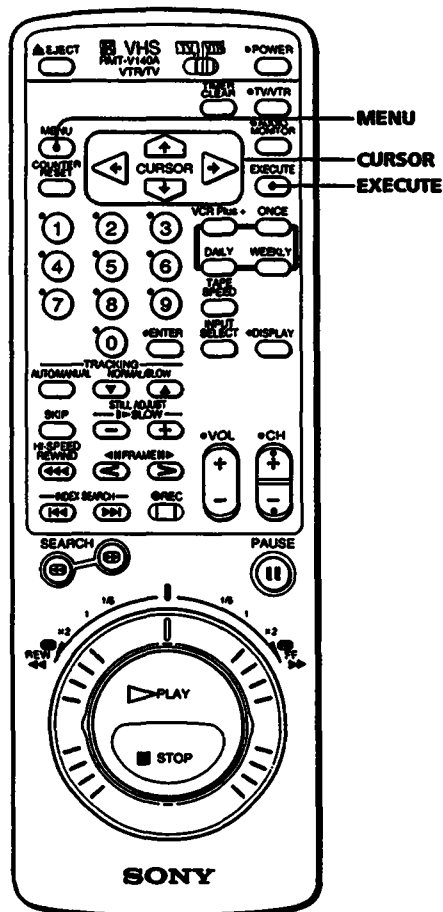

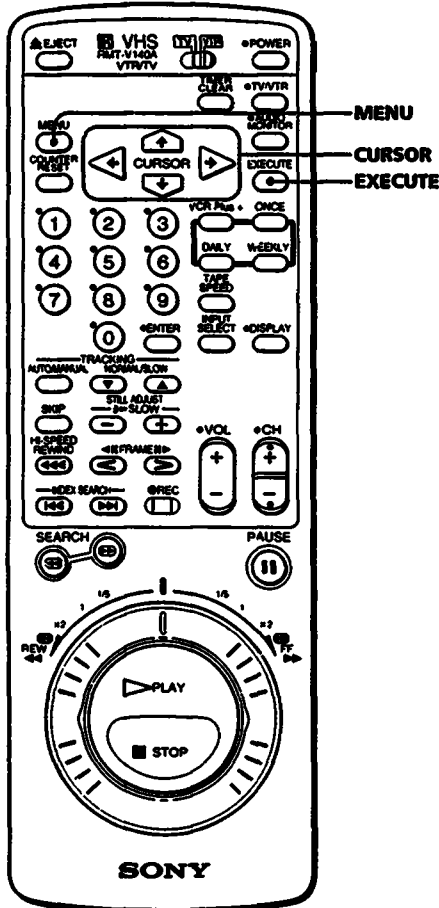


- 3 Press CURSOR ↑/↓ to move the cursor (I) to LANGUAGE.**

- 4 Press CURSOR ←/→ to select ENGLISH or FRENCH, then press EXECUTE.**



Setting the clock



Note

- The menu disappears automatically if you don't proceed for more than one minute.
- The clock cannot be set automatically if you don't receive a channel that carries a time signal in your area. If so, set the clock manually.
- If there are only a few channels in your area that carry time signals, setting the clock automatically may take several minutes. If nothing happens even after you wait several minutes, set the clock manually.

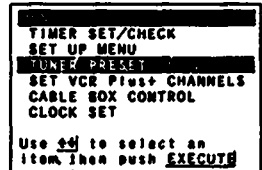
Set the time and date to use the timer feature for recording programs.

Using the Auto Clock Set feature

Some TV and cable channels are beginning to transmit time signals with their broadcasts (this is called Extended Data Services – EDS). Your VCR can use this time signal to automatically set the clock. After you complete the steps below, when you turn off the VCR, it will automatically look for a channel that carries a time signal and set the clock. The Auto Clock Set feature only works if a channel in your area is broadcasting a time signal. Use the manual method until broadcasters in your area start sending time signals.

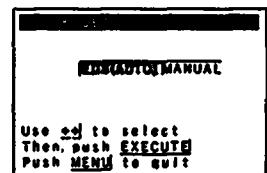
1 Press MENU.

The main MENU appears on the TV screen.



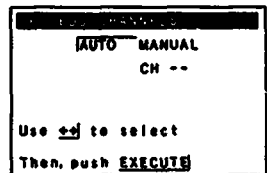
2 Press CURSOR ↑/↓ to move the cursor (I) to CLOCK SET, then press EXECUTE.

The CLOCK SET menu appears on the TV screen.



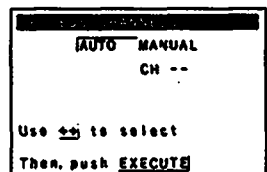
3 Press CURSOR ←/→ to select EDS (AUTO), then press EXECUTE.

The SET EDS CHANNEL menu appears on the TV screen.

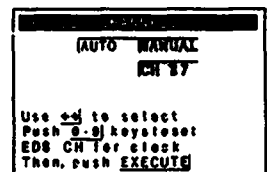


4 Press CURSOR ←/→ to select AUTO or MANUAL.

If you set to AUTO:
The VCR automatically searches for a channel that carries a time signal. (Use this method if you don't know of a channel that carries a time signal.)



If you set to MANUAL:
Set a channel that carries a time signal by using the number buttons and the -/- (ten's digit) button. (Use this method if you do know of a channel that carries a time signal.)

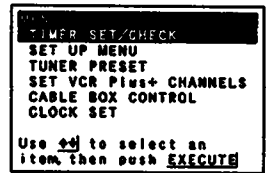
Setting up cable box control

Your VCR includes a cable box control feature which allows the VCR to control most brands of cable boxes via the cable mouse. With cable box control, the VCR controls channels on the cable box for timer recording. You can also use the VCR's remote commander to change channels on the cable box whenever the cable box is turned on. To use cable box control, you need to connect the cable mouse (page 10) and set the code number and output channel.

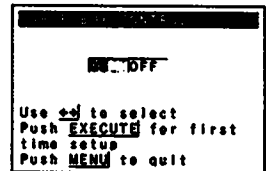
This VCR is programmed with codes necessary to control channel selection on most brands of cable boxes at the time this VCR was manufactured. It is possible that new cable boxes may be introduced that cannot be controlled with this VCR's cable mouse. If you have a cable box that is incompatible with this VCR, contact your cable operator — they may be able to provide you with a compatible cable box.

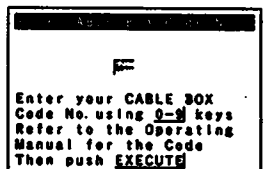

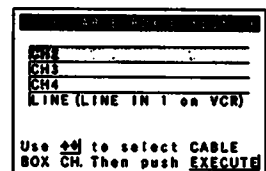

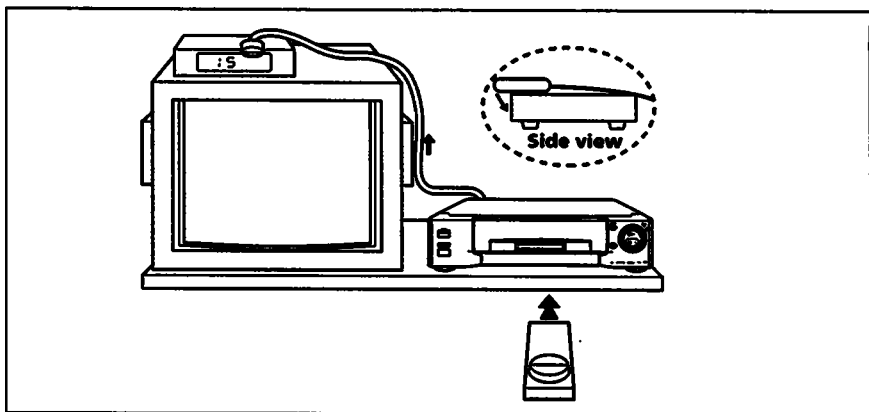
If the answer to both 1 and 2 is "yes," you have made the correct setting.

If you cannot get your VCR to control the cable box

- ✓ Check the position of the cable mouse.
- ✓ Place the cable box and VCR away from each other. Do not place the cable box on top of the VCR.
- ✓ Try the setup again making sure to use the correct control code. If the cable box still does not respond you can try other codes.

If your cable box still does not operate with the cable mouse, contact your cable company to see if they can provide you with a compatible cable box.

Tips for normal viewing



- Place the cable mouse so that it hangs out over the cable box front.
- Position the cable box away from the VCR.
- Do not place the cable box on top of the VCR.
- Point the remote commander at the VCR, not at the cable box.

VCR Plus+ is a feature in Sony VCRs that simplifies the task of programming the VCR to make timer recordings.

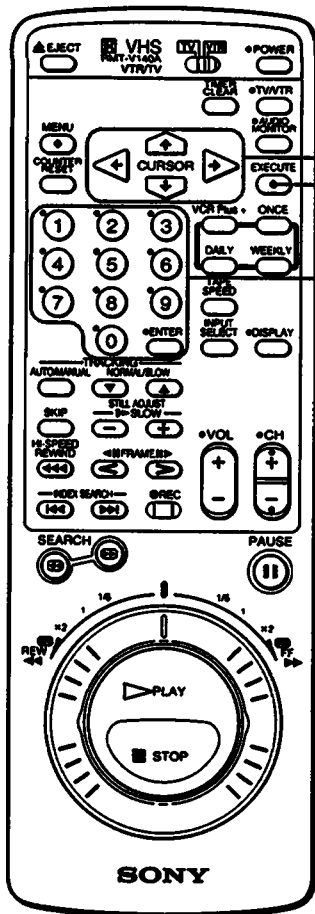
How VCR Plus+ works

Whenever you want to record a TV program, all you need to do is look up the program's "PlusCode," a number assigned to each program that's published in the TV section of most newspapers, cable TV listings, and even *TV GUIDE* magazine. Then, just enter the PlusCode of the program you want and the VCR is automatically programmed to record that show. It's that simple. With VCR Plus+, you no longer have to go through a lengthy and often repetitive procedure when you set start and stop times, channel numbers, and dates. All this information is automatically sent to your VCR when you enter the program's PlusCode.

How to set up your VCR

Setting up your VCR involves coordinating the TV channel number (the number you turn to on your TV or VCR to watch a program) with the guide channel (the number that's assigned to that channel in your program guide). To get the guide channel numbers, find the "Channel Line-up Chart" in the program guide for your area that features VCR PlusCodes. It usually looks like the example to the left.

For each channel your VCR receives, use the Channel Line-up Chart to check that the channel numbers match. For example, if HBO is listed in the Channel Line-up Chart on channel 33, and your VCR receives HBO on channel 15, you need to coordinate these numbers using the following procedure. For channels in which the numbers are the same (for example, if your VCR receives HBO on channel 33, and the guide channel number is 33), you can skip this procedure.



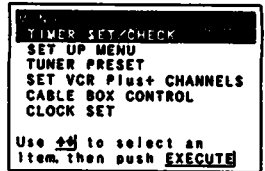

Displaying the time, remaining tape length and time counter

Using the time counter

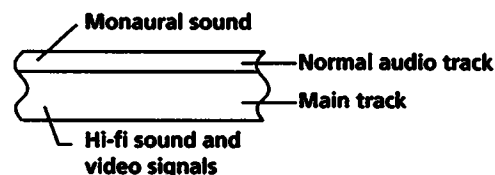

How sound is recorded on a video tape

This VCR records sound onto two different tracks. High-fidelity sound (usually stereo) is recorded onto the main track along with the picture. Monaural sound is recorded onto the normal audio track along the edge of the tape.

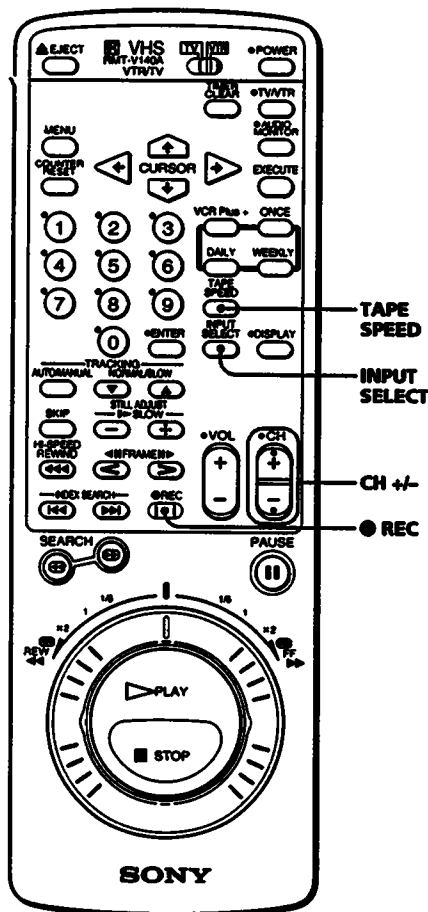

- To cut out an unwanted scene while recording, press **|| PAUSE**, turn the DUAL MODE SHUTTLE ring on the VCR to rewind the tape to the beginning of the unwanted scene, then press **|| PAUSE** to resume recording.
- The display appears on the TV screen indicating information about the tape, but the information will not be recorded on the tape.
- If you don't want to watch TV while recording, you can turn off the TV. When using a cable box, make sure to leave it on.

Notes

- If your tape ends during quick-timer recording, recording stops and the VCR turns off. The tape does not rewind automatically.
- If a power interruption occurs during quick-timer recording, recording stops and your VCR turns off. If the interruption lasts less than three hours and the power is restored before the recording end time, recording will start again from that point.

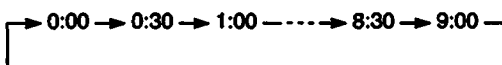

Recording using the quick timer

The quick timer enables you to record for a specified period of time in intervals of 30 minutes. Once you specify the recording time, the VCR automatically stops recording. Before you begin, check that the clock is set correctly.

After you start recording, press QUICK TIMER until the desired duration appears in the display window. The TIMER indicator on the VCR lights up. Each press increases the recording duration in increments of 30 minutes as shown below.



The recording duration decreases minute by minute to 0:00, then the VCR turns off automatically.

To stop recording

To stop while the VCR is recording a program, press **■ STOP** to turn off the TIMER indicator on the VCR.

To extend the recording duration while recording

Press QUICK TIMER until the desired duration appears in the display window.

Watching a TV program while recording another

You can watch a TV program and record another at the same time.

- 1 Press TV/VTR on the top right of the remote commander to turn off the VTR indicator in the display window.
- 2 If the TV is connected to the VCR using the audio/video cable, set the TV to TV input.
If the TV is connected to the VCR using only the antenna cable, skip this step.

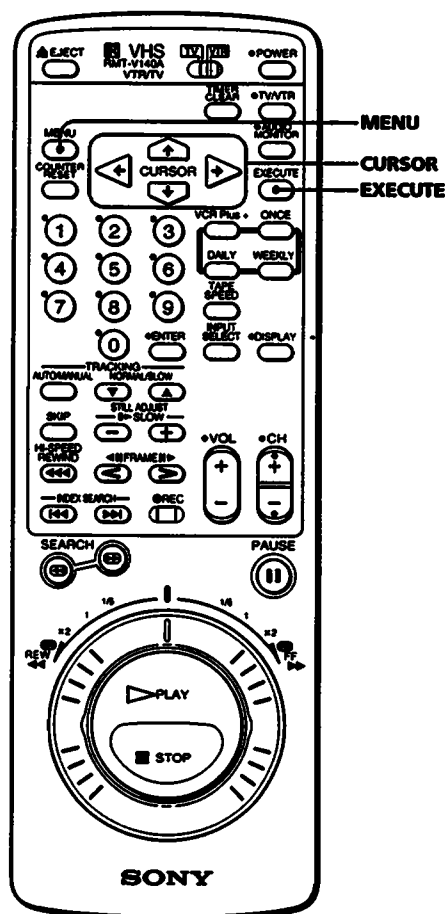
Saving a recording

Video tapes have a safety tab to protect against accidental recording. To prevent accidental erasure of a recording, break off the safety tab with a screwdriver or other tool. A tape with its safety tab removed ejects if you try to record on it.

To record on a tape with its safety tab removed, cover the tab hole with adhesive tape.

Adjusting the picture

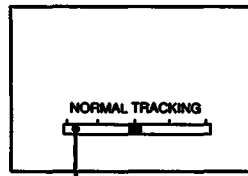
The VCR automatically adjusts the picture for the best possible playback or recording. If, however, you find the automatic adjustment unsatisfactory, you can adjust the picture manually.



Adjusting the tracking

Though the VCR automatically adjusts the tracking when playing a tape (the AUTO TRACKING indicator flashes in the display window, then lights steadily), distortion may occur if the tape was recorded in poor condition. If so, manually adjust the tracking condition.

Press the ▼/▲ TRACKING NORMAL/SLOW buttons to display the tracking meter. The distortion should disappear as you press one of the two buttons. If you cannot get a clear picture with manual adjustment, press TRACKING AUTO/MANUAL to return to automatic adjustment.

About Adaptive Picture Control (APC)

Adaptive Picture Control (APC) automatically improves recording and playback quality by adjusting the VCR to the condition of the video heads and tape. To maintain better picture quality, we recommend that you leave APC on (with the APC indicator in the display window lit).

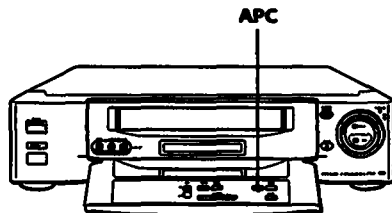
To use APC during playback

The APC function automatically works on all types of tapes, including rental tapes. You can play a tape using the APC function even if the tape was not recorded with it.

To use APC while recording

Whenever you insert a tape and first start recording, the VCR adjusts to the tape using the APC function (the APC indicator flashes rapidly). This adjustment is retained until the tape is ejected. There is a short delay before the VCR actually starts recording while the VCR analyzes the tape.

If you want to start recording precisely the first time you record, set the VCR to recording pause mode (the APC indicator flashes slowly) and press ● REC to let the VCR analyze the tape. When the APC indicator stops flashing, press ■ PAUSE to start recording. Recording begins immediately.

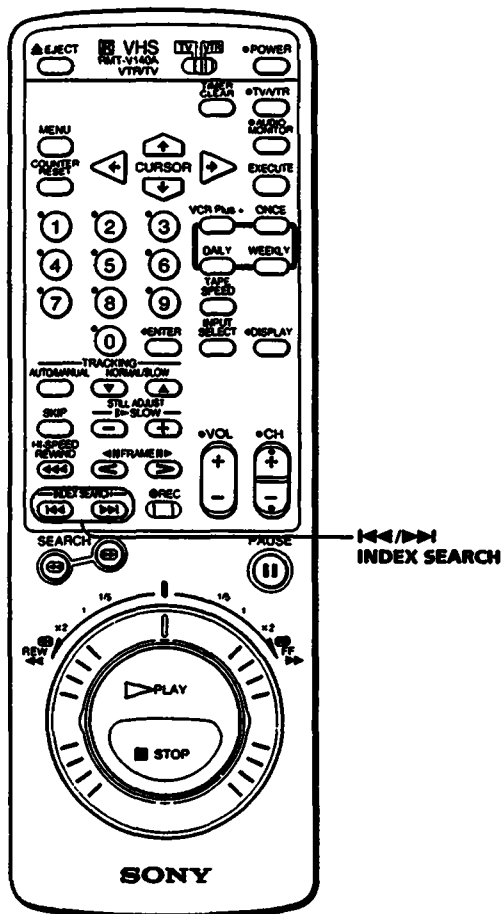


Notes

- Tapes recorded using the APC function are played back normally on VCRs that do not have the APC function.
- Press ■ PAUSE to release recording **after** the APC indicator stops flashing. If you start recording before the APC indicator stops flashing, the APC function is cancelled.

Searching using the index function

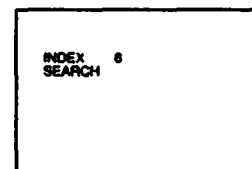
The VCR automatically marks an index signal at the point where recording starts (with the exception of when you start recording from recording pause). Use this as a reference to find the beginning of the recording. Since the index number indicates the relative position from the current position, specify how many index signals ahead or behind the specific index signal is from the current position. The VCR can search up to 99 index signals ahead or behind of the current position.



1 Insert an indexed tape into the VCR.

2 Press the **INDEX SEARCH** buttons repeatedly until the index number you want appears on the TV screen:

- To locate succeeding programs, press **INDEX SEARCH**.
- To locate preceding programs, press **INDEX SEARCH**.



The VCR starts searching and the index number on the TV screen counts down to zero. Playback starts automatically from that point.

Setting the RF unit

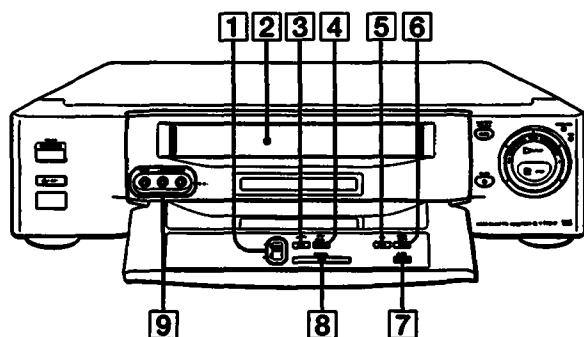

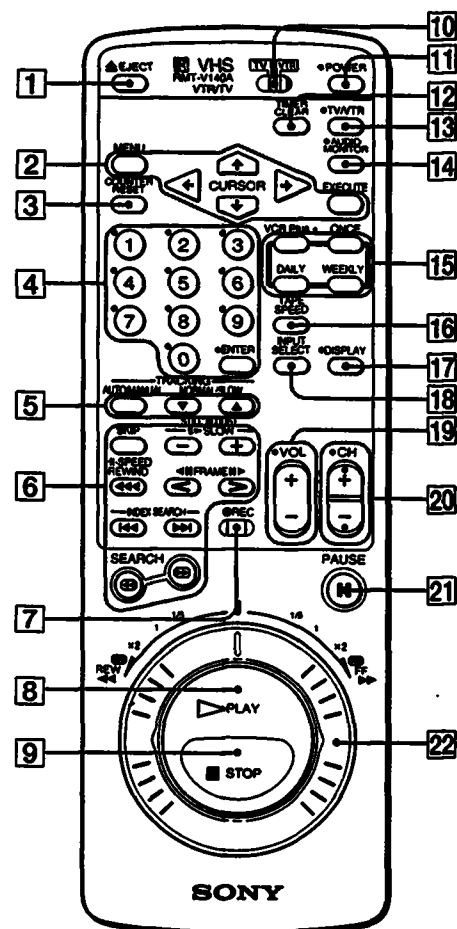
