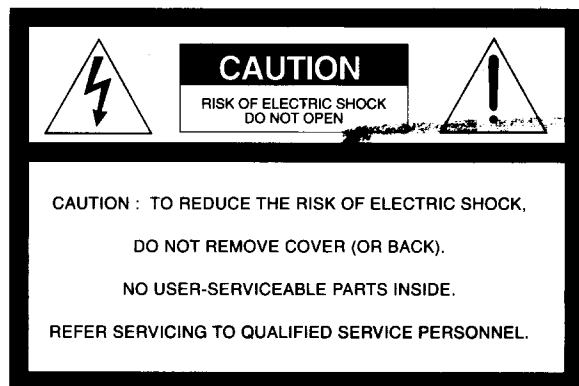

## Precautions

### Safety

- Operate the unit only on 120 V AC, 60 Hz (except for SLV-940HF CS and SLV-940HF PX).
- If anything falls into the cabinet, unplug the unit and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.
- One blade of the plug is wider than the other for the purpose of safety and will fit into the power outlet only one way. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, contact your Sony dealer.
- Unplug the unit from the wall outlet if you do not intend to use it for an extended period of time. To disconnect the cord, pull it out by the plug, never by the cord.

### Installing

- Allow adequate air circulation to prevent internal heat buildup.
- Do not place the unit on surfaces (rugs, blankets, etc.) or near materials (curtains, draperies) that may block the ventilation slots.
- Do not install the unit near heat sources such as radiators or air ducts, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust, mechanical vibration or shock.
- Do not install the unit in an inclined position. It is designed to be operated in a horizontal position only.
- Keep the unit and cassettes away from equipment with strong magnets, such as microwave ovens or large loudspeakers.

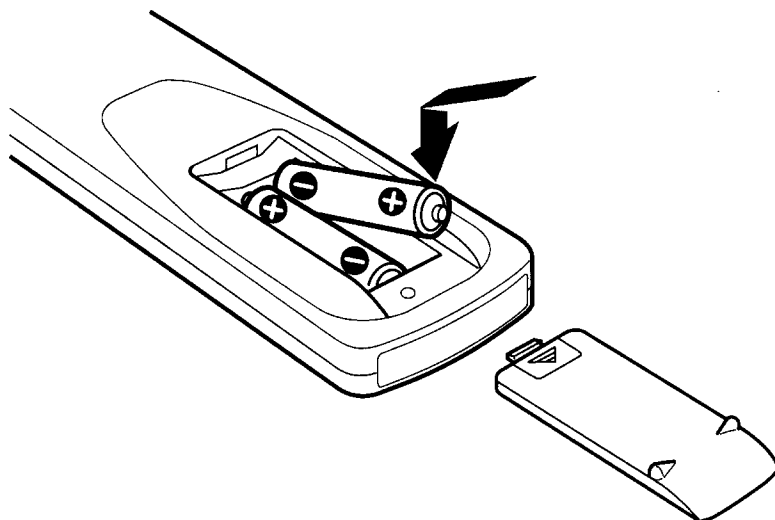
## Step 2: Setting up the remote commander

### Notes

- With normal use, the batteries should last for approximately three to six months.
- If you do not use the remote commander for an extended period of time, remove the batteries to avoid possible damage from battery leakage.
- Do not use a new battery with an old one.
- Do not use different types of batteries.

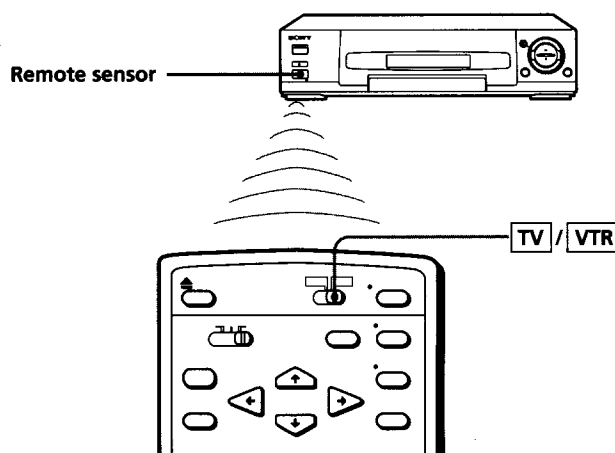
### Inserting the batteries

Insert two size AA (R6) batteries by matching the + and – on the batteries to the diagram inside the battery compartment.



### Using the remote commander

You can use this remote commander to operate this VCR and a Sony TV. To operate the VCR, set the COMMAND MODE switch on the remote commander or the VCR to VTR3. To operate the TV, set the switch to any of other positions. The POWER, VOL +/-, CH +/-, TV/VTR, channel number, ENTER, DISPLAY and AUDIO MONITOR buttons on the remote commander can be used to operate your TV.

**Notes**

- If the TV uses a different remote control system from the one programmed to work with the VCR, you cannot control your TV with the remote commander.
- If you enter a new code number, the code number previously entered will be erased.
- When you replace the batteries of the remote commander, the code number automatically resets to 1 (Sony). Reset the appropriate code number.

**Controlling other TVs with the remote commander**

The remote commander is preprogrammed to control non-Sony TVs. If your TV is listed in the table below, set the appropriate manufacturer's code number.

- 1 Set **[TV]/[VTR]** on the top of the remote commander to **[TV]**.
- 2 Press and hold down EXECUTE, and then enter your TV's code number(s) using the number buttons. Press the ENTER button. Then release EXECUTE.

Code numbers are listed below.

Now you can use the POWER, VOL +/-, CH +/- and TV/VTR buttons to control your TV. To control the VCR, reset **[TV]/[VTR]** to **[VTR]**.

## Step 3: Hookups

### Caution

Connections between the VCR's VHF/UHF connector and the antenna terminals of the TV receiver should be made only as shown in the following instructions. Failure to do so may result in operation that violates the regulations of the Federal Communications Commission regarding the use and operation of RF devices. Never connect the output of the VCR to an antenna or make simultaneous (parallel) antenna and VCR connections at the antenna terminals of your receiver.

### Note to CATV system installer

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

## Selecting the best hookup option

Before you can use your VCR for the first time, you need to connect it to your TV and set it up to receive programs for viewing and recording. This section explains how to hook up and set up your VCR so that you can start enjoying it right away. There are, however, many types of TVs available and many ways in which your TV can be hooked up. For these reasons, this manual describes several ways your VCR can be connected.

To hook up your VCR so that it works best for you, first scan through the table below. Then use the accompanying diagrams and procedures on the following pages to set up your VCR.

After you've completed the connections, follow the instructions for setup including VCR Plus+ setup. During setup, if you need more details of the procedure described, page numbers are provided where you can find complete, step-by-step instructions.

After you've completed the setup, you're ready to use your VCR. Procedures differ depending on the hookup you used. For an overview, refer to "Quick reference to using the VCR" on the back cover.

### Before you get started

- Turn off the power to all equipment.
- Do not connect the AC power cords until all of the connections are completed.
- Be sure you make connections firmly. Loose connections may cause picture distortion.
- If your TV doesn't match any of the examples provided, see your nearest Sony dealer or qualified technician.

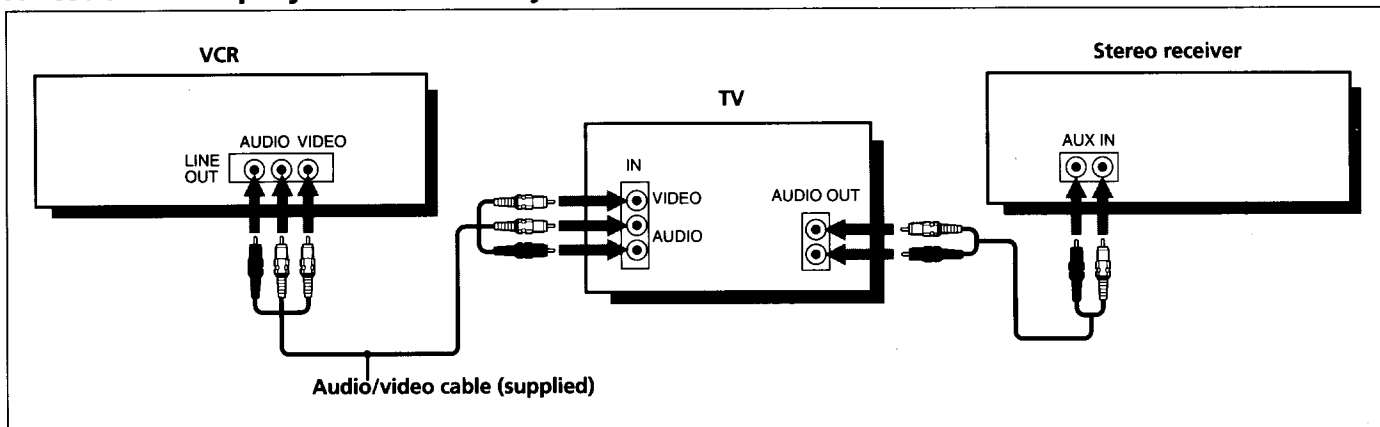


## Audio/video (A/V) hookup

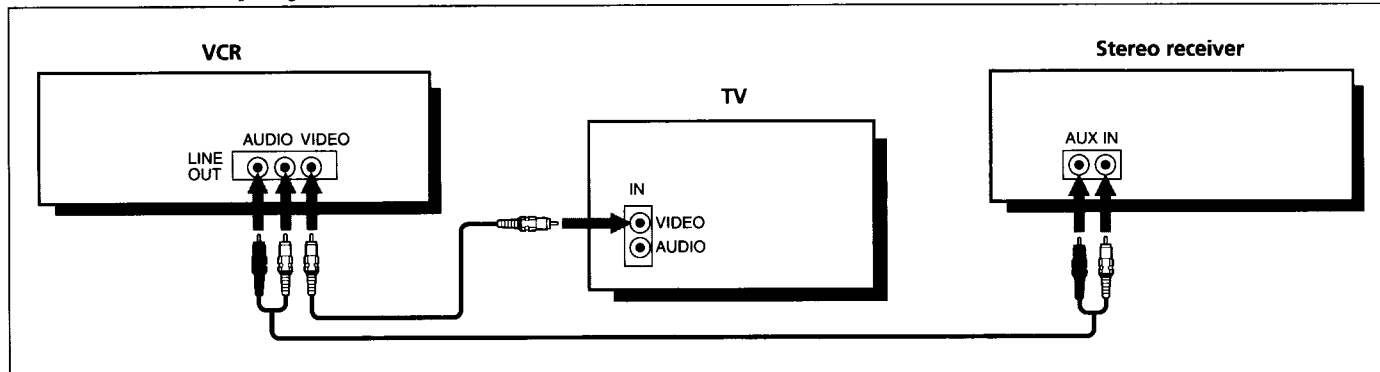
If your TV has audio/video (A/V) input jacks, you will get a better picture and sound if you hook up your VCR using these connections. In addition, for a true "home theater" experience, you should connect the audio outputs of your VCR or TV to your stereo system. If your TV doesn't have A/V inputs, see the following pages for antenna or cable hookups.

If you're planning to use your VCR only to play back pictures and movies, you're finished setting up the VCR after you've made these connections. If you want to record off-air or off your cable TV system, complete these connections first, and then go to the following pages for antenna or cable hookups.

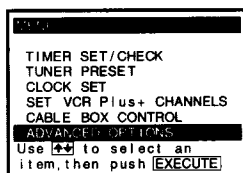

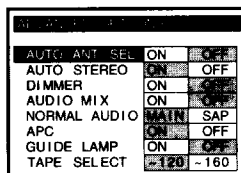
## A/V hookup: VCR setup

## Hookup 1

### Using cable box control

#### Recommended use

This hookup is recommended for most cable systems with cable boxes. It allows the VCR's cable box control feature to control the channel on the cable box, simplifying the recording process. You should use this hookup if you have a cable box, especially if your cable system scrambles all or most channels. A list of compatible cable boxes is on page 29.

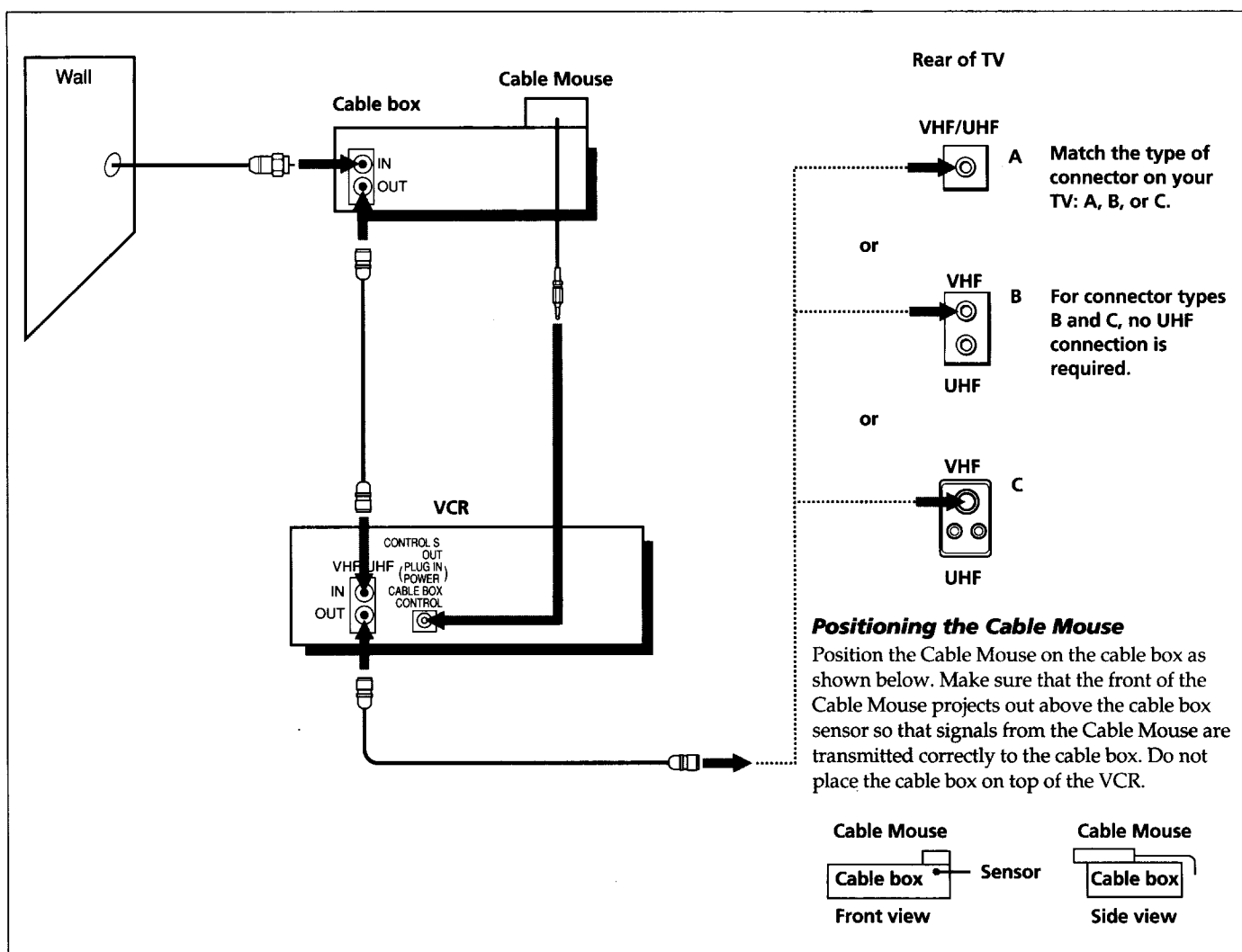

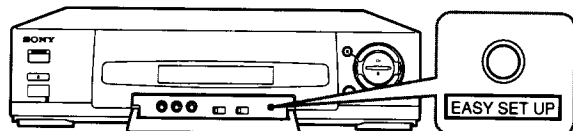
If your antenna cable is a flat cable (300-ohm twin lead cable), attach an external antenna connector (not supplied) so that you can connect the cable to the VHF/UHF IN connector. - 1 Turn off your VCR, or press the VCR's TV/VTR button until the VTR indicator in the display window goes off.
- 2 Set the A/B switch to "B."
- 3 Turn on your cable box.
- 4 Set the TV to the cable box output channel (usually 2, 3, or 4).
- 5 Set the cable box to the channel you want to watch.

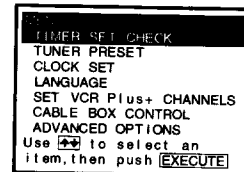

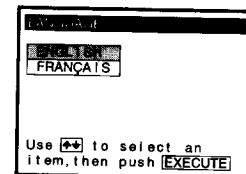

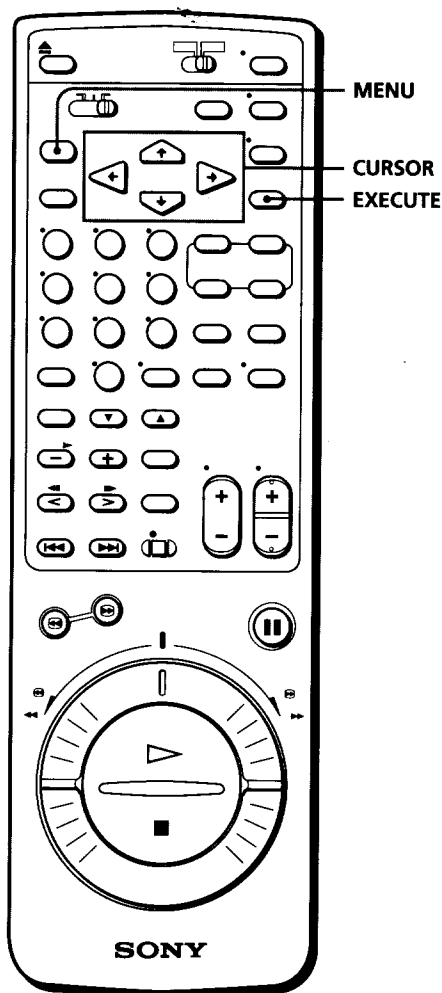

- The menu disappears automatically if you don't proceed for more than one minute.

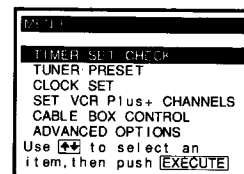

## Using the Auto Clock Set feature

Some TV and cable channels have started to transmit time signals with their broadcasts. Your VCR can pick up this time signal to automatically set the clock. After completing the steps below, when you turn off the VCR, it will automatically search for a channel that carries a time signal and set the clock. The Auto Clock Set feature only works if a channel in your area is broadcasting a time signal. If broadcasters in your area are not yet sending time signals, set the time manually (page 24).

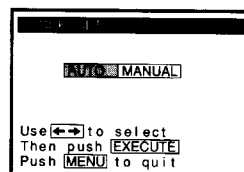

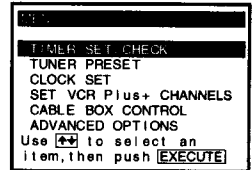
Your VCR includes a cable box control feature which allows the VCR to control most brands of cable boxes via the Cable Mouse. With cable box control, the VCR controls channels on the cable box for timer recording. You can also use the VCR's remote commander to change channels on the cable box whenever the cable box is turned on even if the VCR is turned off. To use cable box control, you need to connect the Cable Mouse (page 10) and set the code number and output channel.

This VCR is programmed with codes necessary to control channel selection on most brands of cable boxes at the time this VCR was manufactured. It is possible that new cable boxes may be introduced that cannot be controlled with this VCR's Cable Mouse. If you have a cable box that is incompatible with this VCR, contact your cable operator — they may be able to provide you with a compatible cable box.

When you set up your VCR for the first time, you can set up the cable box control using the EASY SET UP button (pages 11, 13, 15, 17 and 19). You can also set up by using the menu.

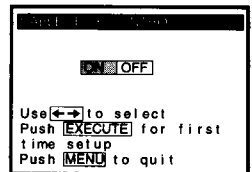

### Note

- Make sure to turn off the VCR when you plug in or unplug the Cable Mouse. If you unplug the Cable Mouse and plug it in again, turn on the VCR before you use the cable box control feature.

- Place the Cable Mouse so that it hangs out over the cable box front.
- Position the cable box away from the VCR.
- Do not place the cable box on top of the VCR.
- Point the remote commander at the VCR, not at the cable box.

### To check the cable box control setting

- 1 Press CH +/- on the remote commander. Does the channel indicator on the cable box change? (Point the remote commander at the VCR, not at the cable box.)
- 2 Press all 10 number buttons (0 to 9) on the remote commander. Does the channel indicator on the cable box change?

If the answer to both 1 and 2 is "yes," you have made the correct setting.

### If you cannot get your VCR to control the cable box

- ✓ Check that the Cable Mouse is connected to the CABLE BOX CONTROL jack on the VCR.
- ✓ Check the position of the Cable Mouse.
- ✓ Place the cable box and VCR away from each other. Do not place the cable box on top of the VCR.
- ✓ Try the setup again making sure to use the correct control code. If the cable box still does not respond you can try other codes.

If your cable box still does not operate with the Cable Mouse, contact your cable company to see if they can provide you with a compatible cable box.

VCR Plus+ is a feature in Sony VCRs that simplifies the task of programming the VCR to make timer recordings.

## How VCR Plus+ works

Whenever you want to record a TV program, all you need to do is look up the program's "PlusCode," a number assigned to each program that's published in the TV section of most newspapers, cable TV listings, and even *TV GUIDE* magazine. Then, just enter the PlusCode of the program you want and the VCR is automatically programmed to record that show. It's that simple. With VCR Plus+, you no longer have to go through a lengthy and often repetitive procedure when you set start and stop times, channel numbers, and dates. All this information is automatically sent to your VCR when you enter the program's PlusCode.

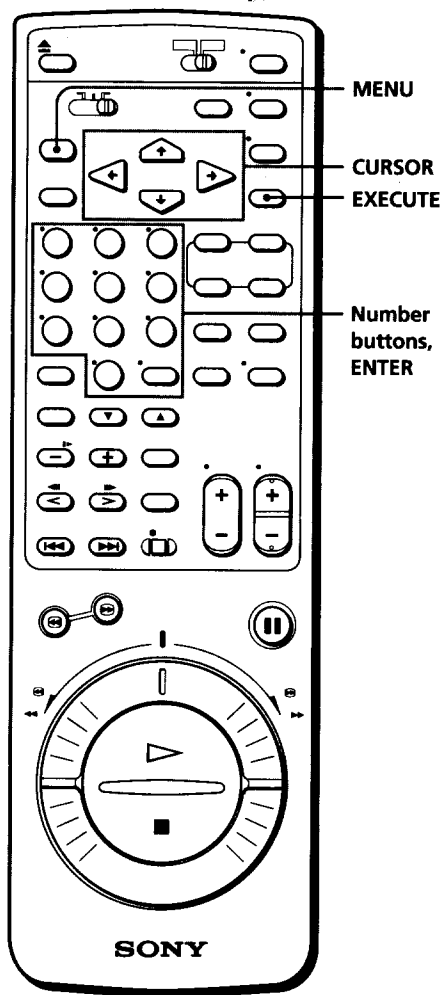
## How to set up your VCR

Setting up your VCR involves coordinating the TV channel number (the number you turn to on your TV or VCR to watch a program) with the guide channel (the number that's assigned to that channel in your program guide). To get the guide channel numbers, find the "Channel Line-up Chart" in the program guide for your area that features VCR PlusCodes. It usually looks like the example to the left.

For each channel your VCR receives, use the Channel Line-up Chart to check that the channel numbers match. For example, if HBO is listed in the Channel Line-up Chart on channel 33, and your VCR receives HBO on channel 15, you need to coordinate these numbers using the following procedure. For channels in which the numbers are the same (for example, if your VCR receives HBO on channel 33, and the guide channel number is 33), you can skip this procedure.

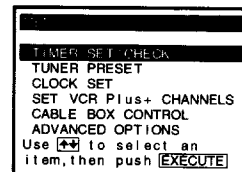

- Tapes recorded in LP mode can be played on this VCR, while playback picture quality in modes other than normal forward speed is not guaranteed.

This section shows you how to play back a video tape.

### 1 Turn on your TV and tune in to the VCR:

- If the TV is connected to the VCR using the audio/video cable, set the TV to video input.
- If the TV is connected to the VCR using only the antenna cable, set the TV to the channel for the VCR.

### 2 Open the drop down panel and insert a tape.

The VCR turns on automatically. The tape starts playing automatically if its safety tab has been removed.

### 3 Press **▷ PLAY** to start playing.

When the tape reaches the end, the VCR automatically rewinds it to the beginning. (The power remains on.)

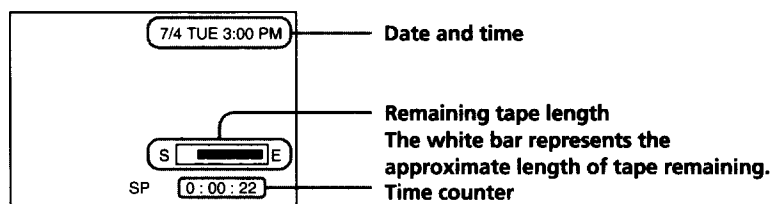

### How sound is recorded on a video tape

This VCR records sound onto two different tracks. High-fidelity sound (usually stereo) is recorded onto the main track along with the picture. Monaural sound is recorded onto the normal audio track along the edge of the tape.



### Notes

- When you play a tape recorded in monaural, the sound is heard in monaural regardless of the AUDIO MONITOR setting.
- To play a tape in stereo, you must use the A/V connections.
- If AUDIO MIX in the ADVANCED OPTIONS is set to ON, the AUDIO MONITOR button doesn't work.

### Note

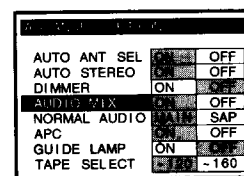
- If AUDIO MIX remains ON, the AUDIO MONITOR button remains inoperative.

### To listen to hi-fi and normal audio at the same time

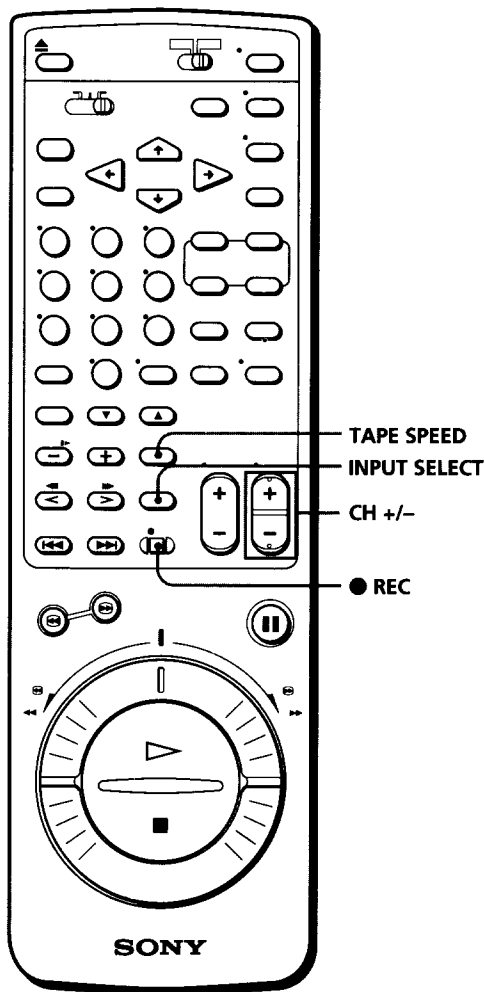
- 1 Press MENU and select ADVANCED OPTIONS.



- 2 Set AUDIO MIX to ON using the CURSOR (↑/↓/←/→) buttons. The AUDIO MONITOR button becomes inoperative, and the sound you hear is mixed.
- 3 Press EXECUTE to store the setting. After playing the tape, reset AUDIO MIX to OFF.



## Recording TV programs



### Note

- If you insert a tape with its safety tab removed, the VCR starts playing. To record on this tape, cover the tab hole.

### Tip

- To select channels, you can also use the number buttons on the remote commander. Enter the desired channel number using the number buttons, then press ENTER.

This section shows you how to record TV programs in the most basic way: manual recording. With manual recording, you start the VCR recording when the program begins, then stop it when the program ends. The VCR also provides the following ways of recording.

- Manually start recording, then stop it automatically—"Recording using the quick timer" (page 39)
- Automatically start and stop recording—"Recording TV programs using the timer" (page 42)
- Automatically start and stop recording just by entering the "Plus Code"—"Recording TV programs using VCR Plus+" (page 45)

### 1 Turn on your TV and tune in to the VCR:

- If the TV is connected to the VCR using the audio/video cable, set the TV to video input.
- If the TV is connected to the VCR using only the antenna cable, set the TV to the channel for the VCR. When using a cable box, turn it on.

### 2 Open the drop down panel and insert a tape with its safety tab in place.

### 3 Press INPUT SELECT until a channel number appears in the VCR's display window.



### 4 Select the desired channel by pressing CH +/-.



### 5 Select the tape speed, SP or EP, by pressing TAPE SPEED.

See "To select tape speeds" on the following page.



### 6 Start recording by pressing ● REC .

When the tape reaches the end, the VCR automatically rewinds it to the beginning.

**Tips**

- To cut out an unwanted scene while recording, press **|| PAUSE**, turn the DUAL MODE SHUTTLE ring on the VCR to rewind the tape to the beginning of the unwanted scene, then press **|| PAUSE** to resume recording.
- The display appears on the TV screen indicating information about the tape, but the information will not be recorded on the tape.
- If you don't want to watch TV while recording, you can turn off the TV. When using a cable box, make sure to leave it on.

**Note**

- If you've inserted a tape with its safety tab removed, the VCR ejects it when you press **● REC.**

**To stop recording**

Press **■ STOP**.

**To select tape speeds**

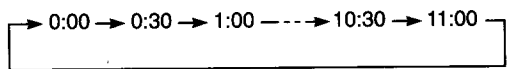
When recording, select either SP or EP. EP provides recording time three times as long as SP. However, SP provides better picture quality. You can mix SP and EP on the same tape. When playing back, the VCR automatically detects the tape speed. See the table below for the maximum recording/playback time in each speed.

Tape type	Maximum recording/playback time	
	SP	EP
T-160	2 hrs. 40 min.	8 hrs.
T-120	2 hrs.	6 hrs.
T-60	1 hr.	3 hrs.
T-30	30 min.	1 hr. 30 min.

**Recording using the quick timer**

The quick timer enables you to record for a specified period of time in intervals of 30 minutes. Once you specify the recording time, the VCR automatically stops recording. Before you begin, check that the clock is set correctly.

After you start recording, press QUICK TIMER until the desired duration appears in the display window. The TIMER indicator on the VCR lights up. Each press increases the recording duration in increments of 30 minutes as shown below.



The recording duration decreases minute by minute to 0:00, then the VCR turns off automatically.

**To stop recording**

Press **■ STOP**.

**To extend the recording duration while recording**

Press QUICK TIMER until the desired duration appears in the display window.

## Recording TV programs (continued)

## Watching a TV program while recording another

You can watch a TV program and record another at the same time.

- 1 Press TV/VTR to turn off the VTR indicator in the display window.
- 2 If the TV is connected to the VCR using the audio/video cable, set the TV to TV input.

If the TV is connected to the VCR using only the antenna cable, skip this step.

- 3 Select the desired channel on the TV.

## Recording stereo and bilingual programs

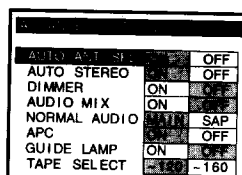
### Stereo programs

This VCR automatically records stereo programs in stereo. When stereo programs are received, the STEREO indicator on the VCR lights up. If noise occurs while receiving a stereo program, record the program in monaural. Follow the steps below.

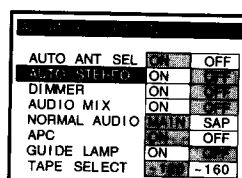
### Bilingual programs

Normally, this VCR records main sound on both main and normal audio tracks. To record SAP (Second Audio Program) sound on normal audio track, follow the steps below.

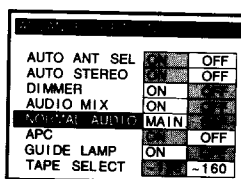
- 1 Press MENU and select ADVANCED OPTIONS.



- 2 • To record stereo programs in monaural:  
Set AUTO STEREO to OFF using the CURSOR (↑/↓/←/→) buttons.



- To record SAP sound on normal audio track:  
Set NORMAL AUDIO to SAP using the CURSOR (↑/↓/←/→) buttons.



- 3 Press EXECUTE to store the setting.

### Tip

- For information on how the VCR records sound, see "How sound is recorded on a video tape" on page 37.

### Note

- Set NORMAL AUDIO to MAIN when not recording SAP sound, or no sound is recorded on the normal audio track. If no sound is recorded on the normal audio track and you play the tape on a mono VCR, you will see only video—no audio will be heard. However, you will receive both audio and video if you play back this tape on a stereo VCR.



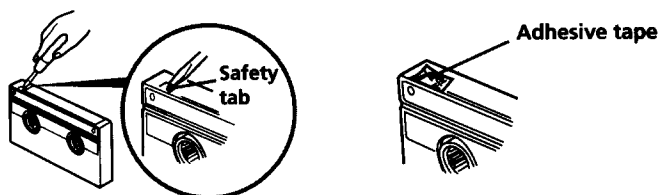
### **To monitor SAP sound while recording**

Press AUDIO MONITOR until the SAP indicator lights up in the display window.

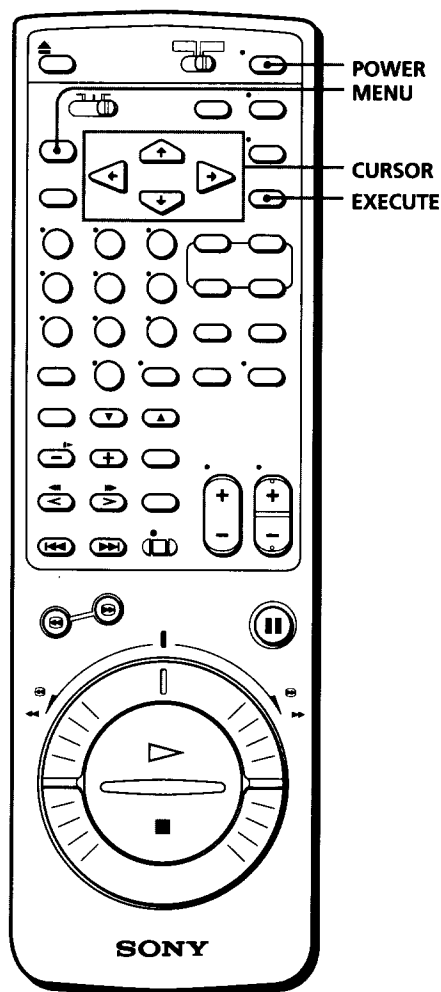
### **Saving a recording**

Video tapes have a safety tab to protect against accidental recording. To prevent accidental erasure of a recording, break off the safety tab with a screwdriver or other tool. A tape with its safety tab removed ejects if you try to record on it.

To record on a tape with its safety tab removed, cover the tab hole with adhesive tape.



## Recording TV programs using the timer



This section shows you how to let the VCR automatically start and stop recording TV programs. You can preset up to eight programs within a one month time frame. If VCR Plus+ is available in your area, see the section "Recording TV programs using VCR Plus+" on page 45 for easier timer recording.

- Insert a tape with its safety tab in place. Make sure the tape is longer than the total recording time.

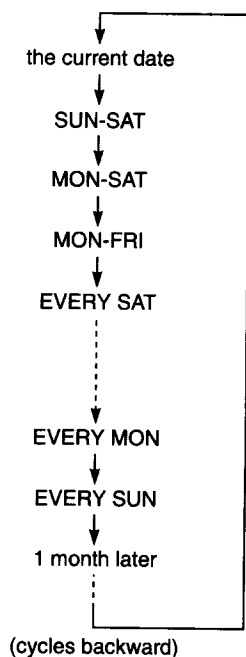

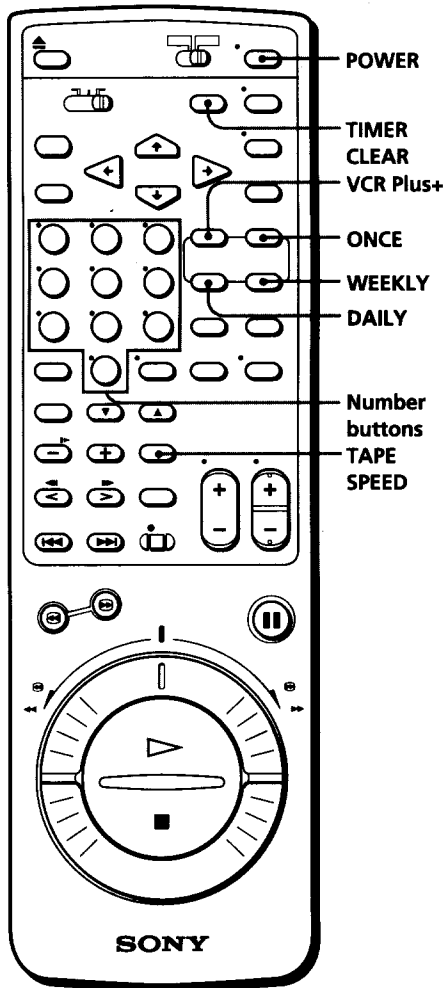


### Daily/weekly recording

Daily recording records the same program every day of the week; weekly recording records the same program on the same day, every week.

When you set the date to start recording in step 2 of "Recording TV programs using the timer," press CURSOR ↓ until the desired day appears. Each time you press the button, the indication changes as shown on the left.

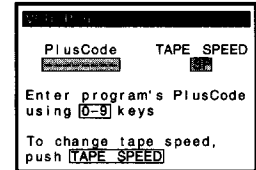
This section shows you another way of timer recording: recording using VCR Plus+. This allows you to record TV programs more easily. Just enter the program's "PlusCode," and the VCR will automatically record the program. You can preset up to eight programs within a one month time frame.

- Insert a tape with its safety tab in place. Make sure the tape is longer than the total recording time.
- Turn on your TV and tune in to the VCR.  
When using a cable box, turn it on.

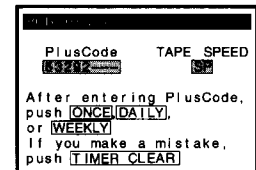
### 1 Press VCR Plus+.

If the clock needs to be set, "Please set the clock" appears on the screen and the VCR automatically enters the clock setting mode.

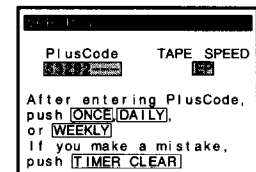


### 2 Enter the desired program's PlusCode using the number buttons.

If you make a mistake, press TIMER CLEAR and enter the PlusCode again.



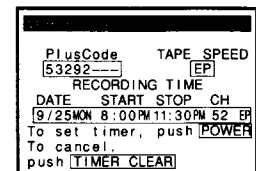
### 3 Select the tape speed, SP or EP, by pressing TAPE SPEED.



### 4 Press ONCE, DAILY or WEEKLY according to the following:

The recording information appears on the TV screen: date, program start and stop times, channel number and tape speed. Check that the information is correct. If it is not, press TIMER CLEAR to cancel. To preset another timer setting, repeat steps 1 to 4.



## Notes

- You cannot set VCR Plus+ in the following cases:
  - When the VCR is turned off.
  - While recording using the timer or quick timer.
- The timer will not accept settings in the following cases:
  - When you select DAILY for a Saturday and Sunday program.
  - When you select DAILY or WEEKLY for a program more than seven days ahead.
  - When you enter the PlusCode of a program that has already ended.

## When the timer settings overlap

The VCR will not record overlapping programs. If any of your timer settings overlap, change the settings.

### Case 1: If you preset two programs to start recording at the same time...

The program listed first in the TIMER SET/CHECK menu has priority over the other program. The timer setting of the lower priority program will be erased from the TIMER SET/CHECK menu when the first program begins recording.

### Case 2: If you preset program 2 to start recording at the same time you preset program 1 to finish recording...

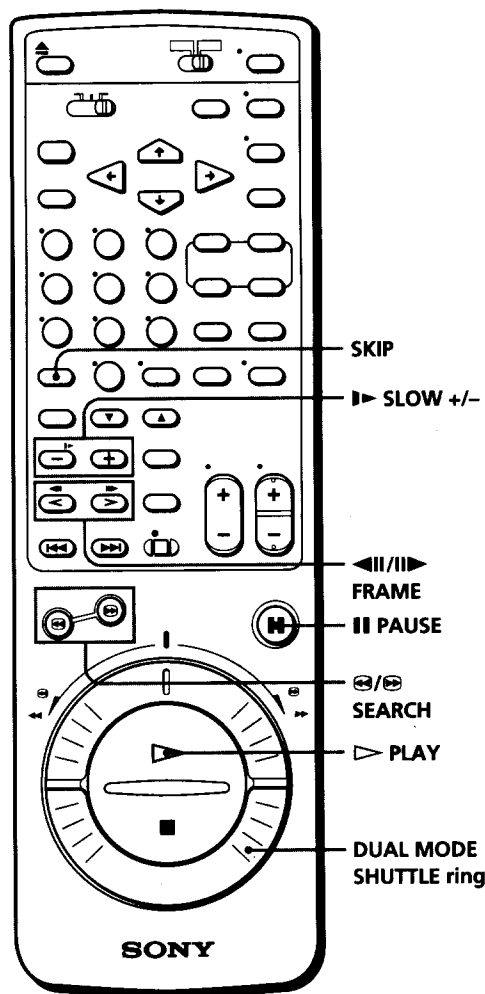
The last 20 seconds of program 1 will not be recorded because the VCR will enter recording pause for program 2 before program 1 is finished.

### Case 3: If you preset program 2 to start recording before program 1 is finished recording...

Program 2 will start recording before program 1 has finished.



## Additional Operations Playing/searching at various speeds



### Tip

- Adjust the picture using the ▼/▲ TRACKING NORMAL/SLOW STILL ADJUST buttons if:
  - Streaks appear while playing in slow motion.
  - Bands appear on the top or bottom while pausing.
  - The picture shakes while pausing.

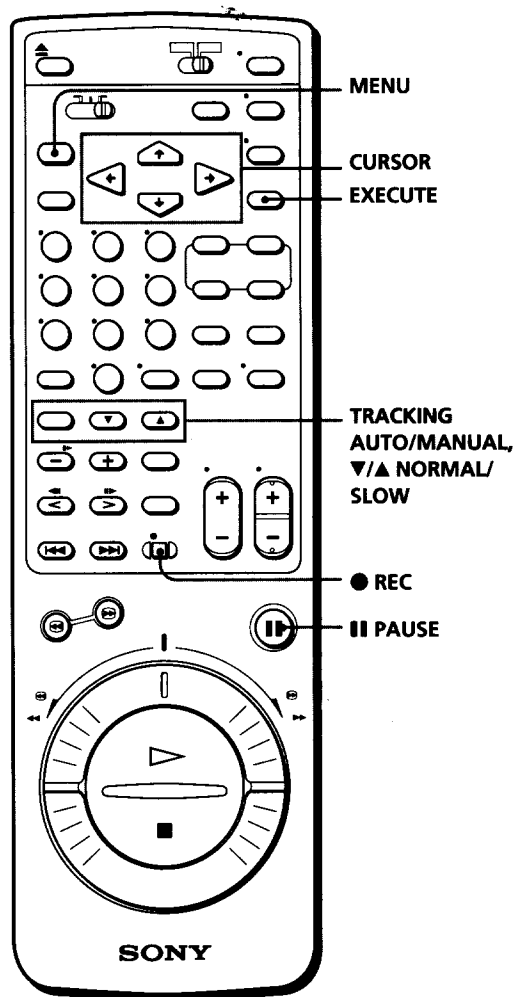
### Note

- Tapes recorded in LP mode can be played on this VCR, while playback picture quality in modes other than normal forward speed is not guaranteed.

You can play back a tape at various speeds: high-speed, slow motion, frame by frame and so on. These options are also useful for searching for a specific point during playback. The sound is muted during these operations.

## Adjusting the picture



### Note

- Auto tracking adjustment is not possible for tapes recorded in LP mode.

### Notes

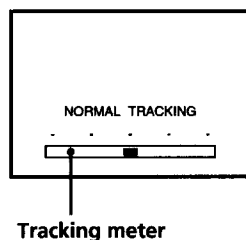
- Tapes recorded using the APC function are played normally on VCRs that do not have the APC function.
- Press **PAUSE** to release recording after the APC indicator stops flashing. If you start recording before the APC indicator stops flashing, the APC function is cancelled.

The VCR automatically adjusts the picture for the best possible playback or recording. If, however, you find the automatic adjustment unsatisfactory, you can adjust the picture manually.

## Adjusting the tracking

Though the VCR automatically adjusts the tracking when playing a tape (the AUTO TRACKING indicator flashes in the display window, then lights steadily), distortion may occur if the tape was recorded in poor condition. If so, manually adjust the tracking condition.

Press the **▼/▲ TRACKING NORMAL/SLOW** buttons to display the tracking meter. The distortion should disappear as you press one of the two buttons. If you cannot get a clear picture with manual adjustment, press **TRACKING AUTO/MANUAL** to return to automatic adjustment.



## About Adaptive Picture Control (APC)

Adaptive Picture Control (APC) automatically improves recording and playback quality by adjusting the VCR to the condition of the video heads and tape. To maintain better picture quality, we recommend that you set APC to ON in the ADVANCED OPTIONS menu (with the APC indicator in the display window lit.)

### To use APC during playback

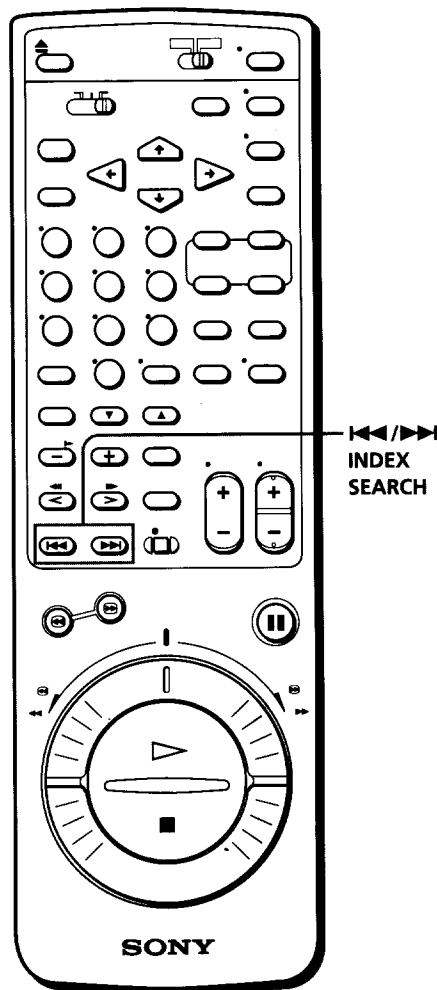
The APC function automatically works on all types of tapes, including rental tapes. You can play a tape using the APC function even if the tape was not recorded with it.

### To use APC while recording

Whenever you insert a tape and first start recording, the VCR adjusts to the tape using the APC function (the APC indicator flashes rapidly). This adjustment is retained until the tape is ejected. There is a short delay before the VCR actually starts recording while the VCR analyzes the tape.

If you want to start recording precisely the first time you record, set the VCR to recording pause mode (the APC indicator flashes slowly) and press **REC** to let the VCR analyze the tape. When the APC indicator stops flashing, press **PAUSE** to start recording. Recording begins immediately.

## Searching using the index function



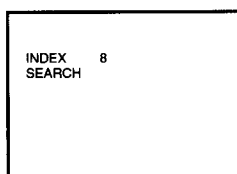
The VCR automatically marks an index signal at the point where recording starts (with the exception of when you start recording from recording pause). Use this as a reference to find the beginning of the recording. Since the index number indicates the relative position from the current position, specify how many index signals ahead or behind the specific index signal is from the current position. The VCR can search up to 99 index signals ahead or behind of the current position.

### 1 Insert an indexed tape into the VCR.

### 2 Press the **INDEX SEARCH** buttons repeatedly until the index number you want appears on the TV screen:

- To locate succeeding programs, press **INDEX SEARCH**.
- To locate preceding programs, press **INDEX SEARCH**.

The VCR starts searching and the index number on the TV screen counts down to zero. Playback starts automatically from that point.



## Editing Editing with another VCR

### Tips

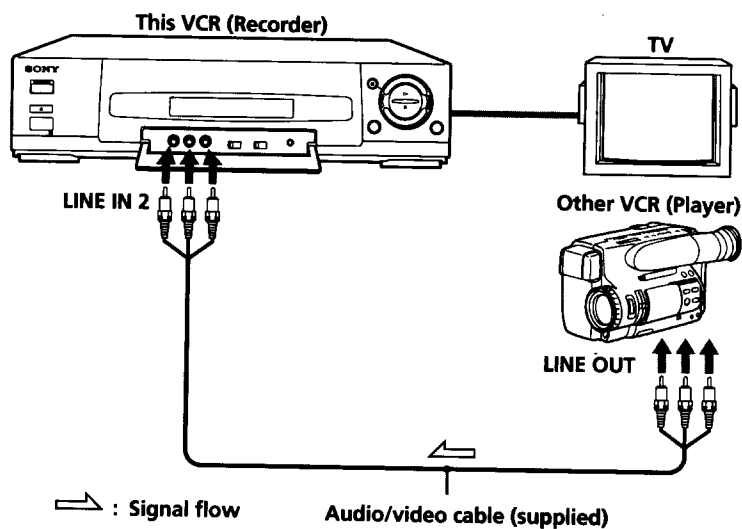
- Make sure you connect the plugs to jacks of the same color.
- To connect the other VCR, you can use the LINE IN 1 jacks as well. In this case, press INPUT SELECT to display "L1" in the display window.
- If the other VCR is a monaural type, leave the red plugs unconnected.

### Note

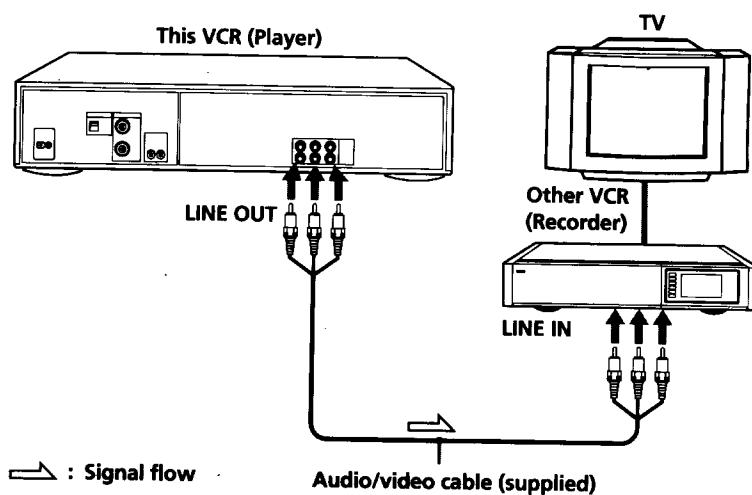
- When connecting the VCRs, do not simultaneously connect the LINE IN and LINE OUT jacks on your VCR. A humming noise may occur if you do this.

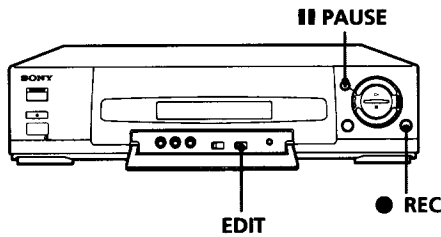

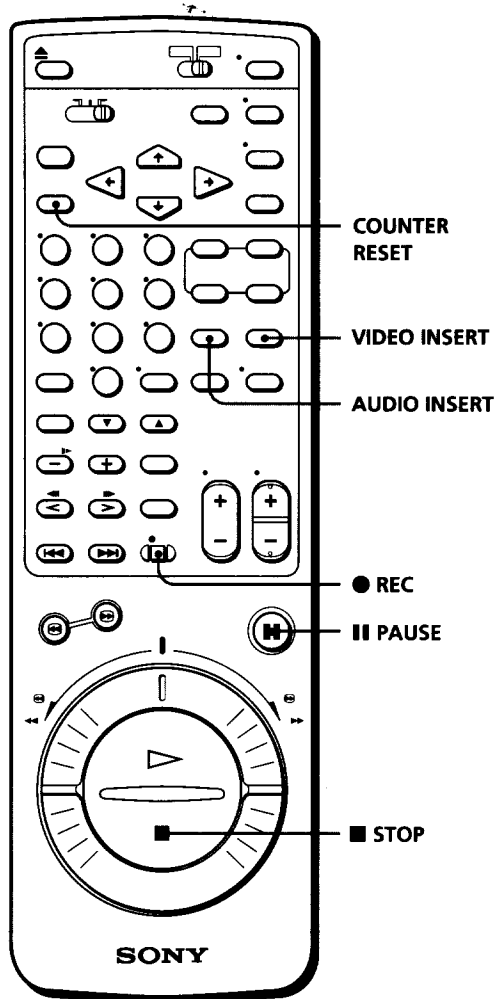

- To release the VCRs from pause, use the **II PAUSE** buttons on the VCRs so that you can edit more precisely.
- To cut out unwanted scenes while editing, press **II PAUSE** on this VCR when an unwanted scene begins. When it ends, press **II PAUSE** again to resume recording (Assemble Editing).

## Insert editing



### Note

- You must be in playback pause mode before pressing an INSERT button. (If you are in recording pause mode, you cannot use the insert features.)

You can replace unwanted scenes with other scenes by recording pictures and/or sound over the rerecorded tape. With the video insert function, the original video and hi-fi sound are replaced while the original monaural sound is retained. With the audio insert function, the original monaural sound is replaced. The original video and hi-fi sound, however, are left intact.

### Before you begin

- Follow the instructions on page 52 to hook up your VCRs. To insert sound using a stereo system, see "To hook up with a stereo system" on the next page.
- Press INPUT SELECT to display "L2" in the display window.

- 1 Insert a source tape into the playback VCR or into the stereo system. Search for the point to start playback and set it to playback pause.**
- 2 Insert the prerecorded tape into this (recording) VCR. Search for the end of the unwanted scene and press II PAUSE.**
- 3 Press COUNTER RESET on this VCR to reset the counter to "0H00M00S."**
- 4 Rewind the tape to the beginning of the unwanted scene.**  
This VCR pauses.

- 5 Press the INSERT buttons according to the following:**

To insert	Press	So that
Both picture and sound	INSERT AUDIO, then INSERT VIDEO	"A/V INS II" appears on the TV screen, and "AV INSERT" appears in the display window.
Picture only	INSERT VIDEO	"VID INS II" appears on the TV screen, and "V INSERT" appears in the display window.

**6 To start editing, simultaneously press the II PAUSE buttons on this VCR and on the other VCR or stereo system.**

When the counter of this VCR reaches "0H00M00S," editing stops automatically.

**To stop editing**

Press the ■ STOP buttons on this VCR and on the other VCR or stereo system.

**To hook up with a stereo system**

Connect LINE IN 2 AUDIO of this VCR and the audio out jacks of the stereo system, using the RK-C510KS audio cable (not supplied).

Display "LINE 2" on the TV screen using INPUT SELECT.

# Synchronized editing

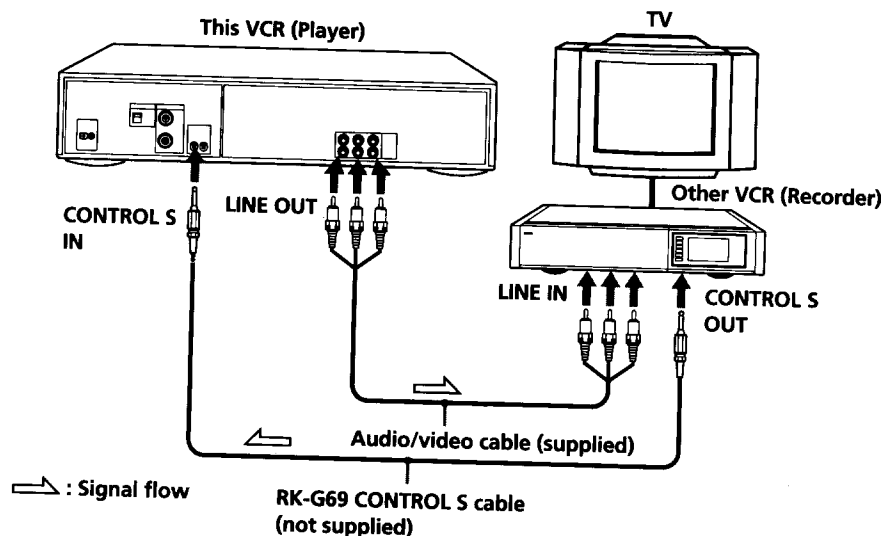
If other VCR has a CONTROL S OUT jack for synchronized editing, connect the VCRs via the CONTROL S jacks. This additional connection lets you control both VCRs from one VCR for easier editing.

## Note

- The CABLE BOX CONTROL jack on this VCR outputs a signal to control the cable box but does not output a control signal for synchronized editing.

## How to hook up via the CONTROL S jacks

The CONTROL S connection only enables you to pause and release pause.

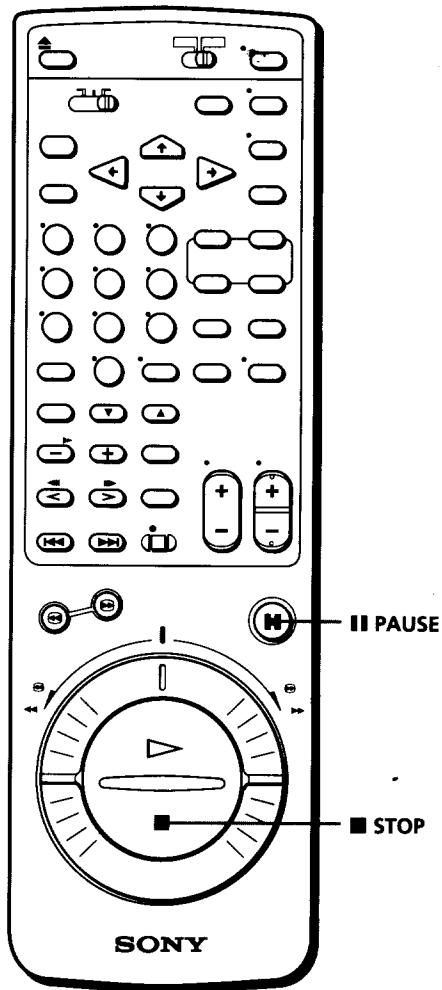




## Operation (when recording on the other VCR)

### Before you start editing

- On this VCR, set the EDIT switch to ON. If the other VCR has a similar switch, set it to ON as well.



**1** Insert a source tape with its safety tab removed into this (playback) VCR. Search for the point to start playback and set it to playback pause.

**2** Insert a tape into the other (recording) VCR. Search for the point to start recording and press **II PAUSE**.

**3** Press **● REC** on the other VCR to pause for recording.

**4** To start editing, press **SYNCHRO EDIT** on the other VCR.

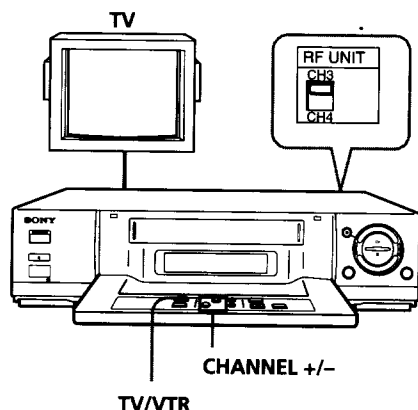
**5** At the point you want to stop recording, press **SYNCHRO EDIT** to stop editing.  
Both VCRs return to pause.

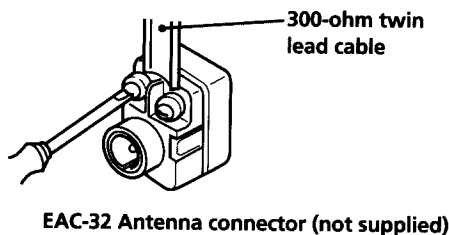


### Setting the RF unit

When connecting the VCR to the TV using only the antenna cable, you must set the RF UNIT switch on the rear of the VCR so that the TV can receive the correct signal from the VCR.

If you connect the VCR to the TV using the supplied audio/video cable, you can skip this step.

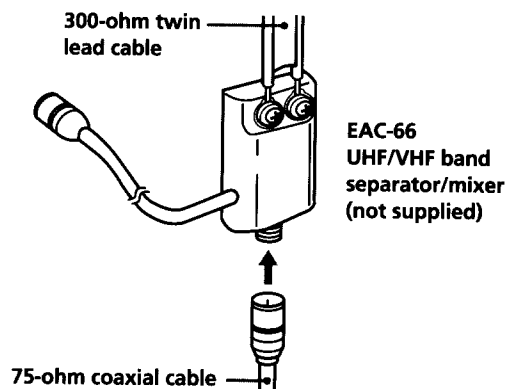
- 1** Set the RF UNIT switch on the rear of the VCR to CH3 or CH4, whichever channel is not used in your area. If both are used, set the switch to either channel.
- 2** Press POWER to turn on the VCR.
- 3** Press TV/VTR to turn on the VTR indicator in the VCR's display window.
- 4** Press CHANNEL +/- to display a channel number in the display window. Select an active channel number in your area.
- 5** Turn on your TV and set it to the channel you selected in step **1** (channel 3 or 4).  
The selected TV channel broadcast appears on the TV screen. If the channels change when you press CHANNEL +/-, you have made the correct setting.  
Whenever you use the VCR, set the TV to the channel selected in step **1**.



### Attaching the external antenna connector

When using a 300-ohm twin lead cable for VHF/UHF antenna, use the EAC-32 antenna connector (not supplied) to connect the antenna to the VCR.

- 1** Loosen the screws on the antenna connector.
- 2** Wind the twin leads around the screws on the antenna connector.
- 3** Retighten the screws.



### Attaching an UHF/VHF band mixer

When using both 75-ohm coaxial cable and 300-ohm twin lead cable for VHF/UHF antenna, use the EAC-66 UHF/VHF band separator/mixer (not supplied) to connect the antenna to the VCR.

- 1** Loosen the screws on the mixer.
- 2** Wind the twin leads around the screws on the mixer.
- 3** Retighten the screws.
- 4** Connect the 75-ohm coaxial cable to the mixer.
